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retailers who have their property and their sales all in Nebraska. And those companies are going to continue to bear a great deal of burden because their sales are here as well as their property. Frankly, I think we've done all that we need to for people who are large employers in this state, who have a lot of property here...

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...and who are selling their goods outside this state. I think we've relieved them of enough responsibility. I don't think we need to go further. I support the property and sales mix. Senator Warner makes a very good point, we are going to want to persuade the state court of this state that the system we're creating is not a property tax. If you move to a sales only, perhaps you can prove the argument to the court. I have to confess that's a significant goal to attain. We don't want the system being determined to be a property tax system and, therefore, failing because it's a state operated property tax system. On the other hand, I've got to think that the court will not be moved from one point of view to the other on the basis of this formula. And, for myself, it seems to me reasonable that we've made a great many concessions for people who are here, who are employers, who have property in this state, and they do happen to have multinational sales...

PRESIDENT MOUL: Time.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...where we continue to look to them for responsibility. I'm going to vote to suspend the rules to allow Jerry to make his case. When it comes time to vote for the amendment, I'm going to vote no because I think property is a reasonable basis upon which to ask for some contribution to the operation.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Landis. Senator Robak.

SENATOR ROBAK: Yes, thank you, Madam Speaker, members of the body, I would be remiss if I didn't address this issue somewhat. I would just like to say to Senator Chambers, well, I'm going to quote from a now famous, very famous woman, well, shucks, Senator, if you don't like the bill, just don't vote for it. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Robak. Senator Nelson.
