LB 163 requires the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to develop and implement an electronic system for accepting and processing applications for handicapped or disabled parking permits. The system shall be implemented on or before January 1, 2013.

The bill provides for permits to be valid for six years rather than three years as is the case under current law. Counties will no longer be responsible for taking applications for permits. Permits may be applied for by handicapped individuals or their representatives, including health care providers, directly from DMV via a secure online process. Eligible persons may hold up to two permits, rather than one allowed by current law. Fines and penalties for violations of handicapped permit provisions appear to be unchanged.

DMV indicates there will be one-time expenses to design and implement a web-based system to allow handicapped persons or their representatives and health care providers to apply online for permits. The one-time cost is estimated to be \$38,000 of cash funds that will be spent in FY 2011-12.

After the system is implemented in FY 2012-13, DMV will experience a decrease in workload relative to the issuance of permits. The department estimates it can reduce a 1.0 Office Clerk III. Postage costs will also decrease since fewer permits will be mailed each year. Handicap placards expenses will be reduced because the permits will be issued for six years rather than three years. Microfilming of applications will also be eliminated. The total on-going annual savings pursuant to the electronic process will be \$44,704 of cash funds beginning in FY 2012-13.
