This bill would change certain penalty and violation provisions of the Concealed Handgun Permit Act.

The bill amends section 69-2441 that relates to carrying a concealed handgun onto a place where it is prohibited by the property owner. The current penalty is a Class III misdemeanor (3 months jail and/or \$500 fine). The penalty under the bill would be increased to a Class II misdemeanor (6 six months jail and/or \$1,000 fine) if the property owner has requested the permitholder to remove the concealed handgun from the place and the permitholder refuses.

This bill may have an impact on the jail population because it increases the potential jail time from 3 months to 6 months. It may increase fine revenue because the maximum fine is increased from \$500 to \$1,000. The fiscal impact is indeterminate at this time because it is unknown how many persons would be sentenced and/or fined under the increased penalties provided by this bill. Any fines assessed pursuant to convictions will accrue to the county where the violation occurs to be used for the support of public schools.
