LB 125 establishes the Children's Health Advisory Committee to research, identify and recommend policy standards aimed at reducing childhood obesity and increasing healthy choices and lifestyles in the public school system. A 14 member committee is created. Members are to serve without expense reimbursement or per diems in 2011 and 2012, but may be reimbursed for expenses in subsequent years, if funds are appropriated. The advisory committee is to meet at least quarterly and provide an annual report.

The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and the State Department of Education (NDE) are to provide or identify office space for the committee. NDE is to adopt rules to ensure that nutrition and physical activity standards are implemented.

State Agencies: It is assumed that HHS and NDE will not incur any additional expenses to provide meeting space for the advisory committee. However, it is possible that some state entity will incur increased expenses associated with the development of policy standards and annual reporting. Any increase in expenditures is assumed to be minimal. NDE will have increased costs to develop a rule outlining policy standards. It is assumed rule promulgation can be handled with the existing resources of the agency.

School Districts: Beginning in FY 2012-13, school districts are to implement the standards and annually provide parents with a written explanation of the possible health effects of body mass index, nutrition and physical activity. Schools are also required to monitor and evaluate the implementation and effectiveness of the nutrition and physical education standards. The bill specifically identifies areas in which the advisory committee is to make policy recommendations for schools relating to foods, professional development of school food service staff, expenditure of funds from competitive food and beverage contracts, physical education and sports activities, and reporting on outcomes. Each school district must annually convene a school nutrition and physical activity advisory committee beginning in FY 2012-13.

The fiscal impact of the bill for school districts is unknown because it will depend upon the standards which are recommended by the advisory committee and the rule developed by NDE to implement the standards. Based upon the specific criteria identified in the bill which are to be included in the standards, school districts may incur increased expenditures to implement standards and report outcomes.

Explanation of Estimate:

<u>NDE</u>: Unknown. Minimal if any cost to NDE to support the meetings of the Child Health Advisory Committee. There are already established national/state standards for PE and Nutrition as well as national guidelines for Physical Activity, so the cost for the development of these would be minimal. Sec. 5 requires NDE to adopt and promulgate rules and regulations to ensure nutrition and physical activity standards are implemented. This would cost approximately \$600 for publishing of the public notice, printing costs and room rental.

<u>School Districts:</u> Unknown. Dependent on schools' already existing resources. Many of the schools are already striving to improve nutrition and physical activity in the schools and are doing it with already existing staff and resources.
