This bill would prohibit retail sale of novelty lighters and provide a penalty. A novelty lighter is a device used to light cigarettes, cigars, etc., and it is designed to look like a cartoon character, a toy, a gun, a watch, a musical instrument, or a similar item, plays musical notes, has flashing lights, or has more than one button or function. It would be a Class IV misdemeanor (\$100-\$500 fine) to sell a novelty lighter under this bill.

The fiscal impact of this bill is not determinable at this time. Any fines assessed pursuant to convictions will accrue to the county where the violation occurs to be used for the support of public schools.
