LB 789 adds "installations for grain handling and irrigation equipment regardless of location" to the list of installations for which inspection and enforcement of the State Electrical Act shall be applied.

The State Electrical Division is unable to estimate the fiscal impact of this change due to the unknown number of instances that will occur and the type of systems that will be encountered.

At this time, the Division does not anticipate needing to hire additional inspectors. Inspection work is fee based, so the work would be self-funding. If such a need presents itself, the Division will request adequate Cash Fund authority to address the need.

The exact fiscal impact is unknown at this time. The electrical wiring being performed on grain bins and irrigation equipment is already being paid for; the permit fees would be hard to estimate since we do not know the number and size of all irrigation systems and grain bins installed on an annual basis.							
Permits for a single irrigation machine would be approximately \$55.00 estimating 200 amp service size and 4 circuits being installed. We currently charge a flat rate of \$60 per machine to inspect the systems that the local Electrical Utility requires inspection to energize.							
Permits for a single grain bin with a 200 amp service, unloading auger, aeration fan, spreader, sweep auger, and light would be \$35 for the 200 amp service, and \$5 each, for 5 branch circuits = \$25. This would total \$60.
