Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 189 requires all occupants of a motor vehicle to wear a seatbelt. The bill provides for the enforcement of a seatbelt violation to be a primary rather than a secondary offense. A person who violates these provisions is guilty of a traffic infraction and is to be assessed one point on his or her operator's license. The fine for not wearing a seatbelt is increased from \$25 to \$100 for each violation and an exemption from the payment of court costs for a seatbelt violation is removed.

The Department of Motor Vehicles indicates the bill will have no fiscal impact for the department to incorporate the traffic violation into the point system.

Individuals convicted of violations will pay a \$100 fine pursuant to the bill and also pay court costs. The number of seatbelt violations pursuant to the bill is unknown, but it is assumed there will be more than a minimal increase in revenue due to enforcement of seatbelt violations being a primary offense and also a \$75 increase in the fine. Revenue from fines accrues to the county where the violation occurs for use by public schools. Revenue from court costs is deposited in the General Fund (\$18), judges' retirement fund (\$8), and various other cash funds (\$24).
