LB 664 amends the Engineers and Architects Regulations Act.

The bill adds new language to the Act to provide immunity from liability for an architect or professional engineer providing their services in a voluntary capacity during a declared national, state, or local emergency caused by a natural disaster, terrorist attack or other similar catastrophic event. The architect or professional engineer must have been requested by the appropriate public official, law enforcement official, public safety official, or building inspector acting in their official capacity to perform the service. The immunity only applies to those services provided during the emergency or within 90-days following the date of the emergency. The immunity does not apply for willful, wanton, reckless or intentional misconduct.

The Board of Engineers and Architects indicates no additional costs as a result of LB 664.

We agree with the Board's estimate of cost.

LB 664 provides waived liability for architects or professional engineers to work on a voluntary basis within 90 days following an emergency. In the past five years no known incidents had conflicts due to the lack of this statute. Yet, with potential structural and operational issues resulting from disasters such as tornadoes and flooding, volunteer licensees may be more inclined to provide leadership and support in the event of a disaster.

Given the limited history and uncertain probability for applicable events, no additional costs are expected in the next two fiscal years.
