Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 911 is the Nebraska 911 Act.

Section 5 requires the Public Service Commission (PSC) carry out the act. The PSC shall have the authority to develop a plan for implementation of next-generation 911 services based upon the finding of the study conducted pursuant to section 86-471 and contract with any consultants in order to carry out the purposes of the Act.

Section 6 creates the Next-Generation 911 Advisory Council to advise the PSC concerning plan development. The Council shall consist of 9 representatives who are selected from a mixture of state government employees and private sector individuals. Members shall serve terms of 3 years, meet as often as necessary to carry out their duties and be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses.

Section 8 creates the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund to pay for the costs to carry out sections 5 and 6 of the bill.

The PSC estimates the cost to carry out the bill's provisions to be \$607,300. This cost would be borne by the Enhanced Wireless 911 Fund. This estimate includes \$600,000 for consultants and \$7,300 for Council meeting reimbursements. The PSC estimates ongoing reimbursements to be \$4,800 per year. This is lower than the initial year's reimbursement due to an estimated fewer number of meetings.

There is no basis to disagree with the PSC's estimates.
