This would also give the Legislature the opportunity to stop actions on waivers. Waivers at the direction of the Legislature are exempt and most waivers fall into the category.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB 866 states that the Human Health Service (HHS) committee will hold a public hearing on the waiver report after 10 days of its submission to the legislature. This bill also requires the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) to provide public notice and comment period for waiver application, extension, or elimination prior to submittal.

Federal law requires that 1915 (b and c) waivers (initial and renewals) are submitted to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) at least 90 calendar days prior to the proposed waiver effective date. Requiring the HHS committee to review for approval and hold a public hearing could cause significant delays in submitting to CMS, thus delaying an effective date and causing the department to potentially lose out on receiving federal reimbursement due to the delayed effective date. Assuming the Division would still be able to meet time constraints imposed by CMS, LB 866 would have no fiscal impact.
