## **Explanation of Estimate:**

Lancaster County would expect to see a fiscal impact as a result of LB92 due to the additional costs associated with the termination trials necessary to secure safety and permanency for children who have been abused and neglected. Between 2015 and 2018, Lancaster County conducted termination trials involving over one hundred children.

Under LB92, Lancaster County could be required to produce live testimony to lay foundation for documentation produced by service providers working with families during the court ordered rehabilitative plan. These services are typically in place for at least one year, but often for several years. Lancaster County could be required to produce live testimony from service providers including, but not limited to: visitation supervisors, family support workers, intensive family preservation staff, nurses, school employees, domestic violence intervention staff, therapists, drug and alcohol counselors, and drug and alcohol test technicians. Each of these witnesses would need to be served with subpoenas by the county sheriff at a cost of \$18 per witness. Additionally, each witness would be entitled to a witness fee of \$25 per day. Lancaster County could also be required to produce live witness testimony from providers such as pediatricians, emergency room doctors, psychiatrists, etc. Expert witnesses such as these often charge counties hundreds of dollars per hour for time spent both in court and in preparation for testifying.

Lancaster County would also anticipate some financial impact due to the lengthening of termination trials for required foundational witnesses to testify. Each attorney appointed to indigent parties in a juvenile court case are paid \$65 per hour. These attorneys represent each parent, step-parent, or guardian, as well as the Guardian Ad Litem for the children. There are commonly at least three appointed attorneys per case.
