LB 435 makes the following changes to the Uniform Residential Landlord and Tenant Act:

- Expands protection from retaliation provided to tenants to include situations where; the tenant has made a complaint to the landlord housing code violation or noncompliance with the lease agreement, or attempts to or does, exercise a right or remedy under the lease agreement or law.
- Establishes that evidence of a complaint by a tenant six months prior to the date of an action taken by a landlord may constitute retaliation.

A fiscal impact is absent as the proposed legislation speaks to tenant rights.
