LB587 creates the Career Mentoring Grant Act.

The Nebraska Department of Education (NDE) will establish and administer the program by providing competitive matching grants to collaborative career mentoring programs. NDE will establish an application process and timeline pursuant to which a partnership that includes at least one school district or educational service unit (esu) and at least one nonprofit organization and that may also include one or more for-profit businesses that may submit a proposal for a matching grant to establish and administer a collaborative career mentoring program.

Grants will be awarded annually to partnerships that, for first time grant recipients, demonstrate a high likelihood for building successful career mentoring relationships with students or, for partnerships that have received previous grants under the Career Mentoring Grant Act, that have demonstrated success in building career mentoring relationships with students. No grant will be awarded without a commitment of matching funds from the partnership equal to one hundred percent of the funds to be received from the grant.

On or before January 1 of each odd-numbered year, NDE will submit a report to the Clerk of the Legislature and the Education Committee of the Legislature evaluating the collaborative career mentoring programs funded under the Career Mentoring Act.

There could be some Fiscal Impact at the school district level but cannot be determined at this time. NDE will have some administrative costs to start and maintain this Act.
