Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 931 changes provisions relating to disqualification of benefits under the Employment Security Law.

Section 1 eliminates paid vacation leave received upon separation from employment from the definition of "Paid vacation leave" in section 48-602. This definitional change impacts certain disqualification for benefits provided for in section 48-628.02 (section 2 of LB 931.

The Department of Labor estimates this change will result in \$4,981,860 per year in greater unemployment benefits paid. This estimate is based on historical data for claimants who were denied benefits stating they had received vacation pay at the time of separation.

There is no basis to disagree with these estimates.

LB 931 changes the treatment of paid vacation leave under the Employment Security Law. Specifically, the bill amends the definition in Neb. Rev. Stat. § 48-602 to provide that paid vacation leave does not include pay received upon separation from employment. LB 931 also amends Neb. Rev. Stat. § 48-628.02 to provide that an individual is disqualified from benefits for any week in which remuneration was or is received in the form of paid vacation leave.

Currently, disqualification occurs when an individual receives vacation leave pay, including that received in a lump sum or upon separation from employment.

It is estimated that this bill will have no impact on the General Fund revenues.

It is estimated that there will be no costs to the Department of Revenue to implement this bill.

The operative date for this bill is three months after adjournment.
