Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 644 adopts the Foreign Adversary and Terrorist Agent Registration Act and the Crush Transnational Repression in Nebraska Act (Act). Sections 1 to 13 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the Foreign Adversary and Terrorist Agent Registration Act whose purpose is to provide transparency for the political and propaganda activities and influence operations of agents of adversary nations and foreign terror organizations in Nebraska as defined in the bill. Sections 14 to 21 of this act shall be known and may be cited as the Crush Transnational Repression in Nebraska Act whose purpose is to counter the threat and practice of transnational repression committed by foreign governments or foreign terrorist organizations against the citizens and residents of this state, and to counter the threat and practice of foreign government interstate harassment through extranational enforcement of foreign government laws and directives.

Attorney General:

The Act requires the Attorney General's (AGs) office to develop forms; retain documents of statements as public records to be available to the public for inspection; transmit statements to the United States Secretary of State; file bi-annual reports to the Nebraska Legislature; to create a portal on the AGs website to post monthly reports; and to adopt rules and regulations. Willful violations of the Act or rules promulgated under the Act are subject to civil penalties of up to fifty thousand dollars. The AGs office may seek injunctive relief against violators or an order directing compliance.

The AGs office would be required to assume new responsibilities and duties that currently do not align with the duties of any existing bureau in the AGs office. It is unknown how may persons may need to participate within the Act's registration requirements and the amount of staff time that will be needed to fulfill the other duties that will be required of the AGs office under the Act. It is likely that additional staff resources will be required but the increased costs are indeterminable.

Department of Administrative Services:

The Act, under section11, also requires the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) to develop a form that each employee of the State of Nebraska or any state agency shall submit a signed affidavit to his or her employer attesting that the employee is not an agent of a foreign principal from an adversary nation or foreign terrorist organization. Section 26 modifies the Foreign Adversary Contracting Prohibition Act to include and define "unmanned aircraft", commonly known as a drone, and allows a public entity to enter into a contract for the procurement if such contract is entered into prior to July 1, 202. After July 1, 2028, public entities would be prohibited from procuring any unmanned aircraft.

Additionally, the Act change provisions of the Foreign Adversary Contracting Prohibition Act relating to certain allowed contracts. DAS would be responsible for of all contracts for goods manufactured by a scrutinized company to ensure that procuring such good would not pose a threat to a state.

DAS would be able to absorb these functions with current resources. No fiscal impact.

Secretary of State:

LB 644, under section 11, requires all businesses and non-profits to file an annual form with the Sectary of State attesting compliance with the Foreign Adversary and Terrorist Registration Act.

In order for the Secretary of State to accomplish this, there would be additional costs to customize their filing software systems to process this new annual attestation and allow online filing. The Information Technologies vendors estimate the customization would have a one-time cost \$143,900 and would incur on-going annual maintenance costs of \$29,000.

Additionally, the Secretary of State anticipates that an additional seven FTEs would be needed to process the estimated 215,000 annual attestation forms annually. The personnel costs for the seven FTES, including benefits, equipment, supplies and technology costs are approximately \$465,000 annually.

It is noted that LB 644 does not provide for any filing fees to be received by the Secretary of State to offset the costs for filing the annual attestations. The Fiscal impact is anticipated to be \$614,600 in FY 2025-26 and \$490,355 in FY 2026-27.

Nebraska State Patrol:

The Act requires the Nebraska State Patrol (NSP) to prepare an empirical and qualitative report on the threats of transnational repression in Nebraska and electronically submit such report to the Legislature; develop a transnational repression recognition and response training to address emerging threats and specific information on tactics used by specific foreign principals; develop a centralized and convenient website that allows members of the public to report instances of transnational repression; and to conduct a public awareness campaign to inform the public as outlined in the bill. NSP is also required to electronically submit annual reports to the Legislature concerning complaints received on the website, the outcomes of such complaints, and any instances of interference by foreign principals in the reporting process with the first report on or before January, 1 2027.

The NSP estimates 200-250 incoming reports regarding suspicious activity to be made annually; however, the actual quantity of these reports is unknown at this time. For the basis of the fiscal note, the NSP estimated that 25 would be reported in a foreign language.

NSP anticipates an initial cost of \$5,000 to develop the required training, \$18,000 for a one-time public awareness campaign, \$10,000 for a one-time website translation service and \$5,000 for translation services for incoming data reported by the public for a total of \$38,000 in FY 2025-26. On-going translation services would be required for incoming reports in the amount of \$5,000 for FY 2026-27 and annually thereafter.

Accountability and Disclosure Commission:

The Act provide requirements under the Nebraska Political Accountability and Disclosure Act for a lobbyist engaged in lobbying activity or a consultant engaged in influencing activity on behalf of a Chinese military company. The Act requires that If lobbying activity is on behalf of a Chinese military company, every person employed, retained, or authorized as a consultant for a Chinese military company shall, before commencing any influencing activity in Nebraska, file a form prescribed by the Accountability and Disclosure Commission to include the information as described in the bill. Violations of the disclosure requirements would result in civil penalties of fifty thousand dollars payable to the Nebraska Political Accountability and Disclosure Commission.

The Accountability and Disclosure Commission (NADC) would have a new investigative responsibility through the enactment of the bill. The NADC would need to obtain the services of an independent investigator which could cost \$50,000. As this is a new area of potential investigation, the costs to the NADC are difficult to estimate but could be significant.

Additionally, as the bill is presently written, a reward of \$50,000 must be paid to any person who provided information that resulted in the finding of a violation. If a violation is found under this bill, the Commission may assess a civil penalty of \$100,000.00 against the violator. However, actual collection of the penalty may not be instantaneous, or could prove difficult. If the Commission awards \$50,000 to the informant, it becomes a claim against the state immediately whether the Commission whether or not the Commission has collected the \$100,000 civil penalty.

There is no basis to disagree with these estimates.

Section 11, subsection 2, of LB644 requires, "all businesses and nonprofit organizations" to file an annual form with the Secretary of State attesting "that they are cognizant of and in compliance with the Foreign Adversary and Terrorist Agent Registration Act." In order to perform the aforementioned new duties, there would be additional costs to customize our filing system software to process this new annual attestation form and allow for online filing. The current system IT vendors estimate the customization will cost \$143,900 and increase

Additionally, it is anticipated that an additional seven FTE's would be needed to process the more than 215,000 annual attestation forms required, which is equivalent to the amount of business entity and UCC filings currently processed each year. The salaries, benefits, equipment, supplies, and technology costs for these seven additional FTE's is estimated to cost approximately \$465,000 per year ongoing.

LB644 does not provide for any filing fees to be received by the Secretary of State to offset the costs for filing the annual attestations; therefore, we would need general funds to perform this function.
