LB 11 appropriates state funds to partially support operating costs for the Nebraska Statewide Workforce and Education Reporting System (NSWERS). Initially established through an interlocal agreement among the Nebraska State Colleges, the University of Nebraska system, the six Community Colleges, and the Nebraska Department of Education, NSWERS collects and synthesizes information across various educational stages – from K-12 to higher education – and aligns this data with workforce outcomes.

Initially funded through a combination of private and public sources, existing commitments will end after FY25. Private philanthropic organizations have committed to fund 75% of NSWERS' costs starting in FY26, transitioning to 50% by FY29. To maintain this private commitment, the four partner organizations mentioned above have been asked to support equal proportions of the public costs through FY29. The chart below shows the intended appropriations, by agency, for FY26 and FY27 and for the following biennium.

LB 11, if passed, appropriates the partner amounts to each agency. The Community Colleges' portion would be administered by the Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education (CCPE).
