Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 68 would provide coverage for certain contraceptives under insurance policies and the medical assistance program as prescribed. The bill would require that any individual or group health insurance policy or any self-funded employee benefit plan to include coverage for a self-administered hormonal contraceptive that is approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration and reimburse an innetwork health care provider or dispensing entity for up to a three-month supply for the first prescription and up to a twelve-month supply for subsequent refills. The bill further amends certain provisions of the Medical Assistance Act to note that the bill, if enacted, would not be construed to limit a recipient's ability to choose or change the method of family planning regardless whether the recipient has exhausted a previously dispensed supply of contraceptives. The bill has an implementation date of October 1, 2025.

The University of Nebraska Systems' self-insured health insurance currently covers certain contraceptives, including a twelve-month supply if prescribed. There is no fiscal impact to the University.

The Department of Administrative Services' self-insured plan currently covers one-month and three-month supplies of self-administered hormonal contraceptives prescriptions at an annual cost of \$550,000. While the cost could increase due to members leaving State employment or changing medications before the prior prescription is depleted, the cost impact is expected to be less than 10% of the current contraceptives, thus the estimated fiscal impact of LB 68 is minimal.

LB 68 would require Medicaid to cover certain contraceptives in prescribed as described in the bill. The Department of Health and Human Services estimates that 227 members would switch medications and choose a twelve-month supply. The estimated fiscal impact is \$61,183 in total funds in FY 2025-26 (\$6,118 in General Funds and \$55,065 in Federal Funds) and \$81,577 in FY 2026-27 (\$8,158 in General Funds and \$73,419 in Federal Funds). These are nominal amounts within the total Medicaid expenditures.

Medicaid would need to amend managed care organizations contracts and updates regulations to allow dispensing contraceptives for twelve-month periods. The expenses to make changes to the contracts would be absorbed by the Department of Health and Human Services.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB68 requires Medicaid to cover, if prescribed, a twelve-month supply of a self-administered hormonal contraceptive. An estimated 12,000 Medicaid members use a self-administered hormonal contraceptive. An estimated 13.5% of these members switch medications throughout the year. Further, an estimated 14% of the women that switch medications would choose to receive a twelve-month supply at one time based on studies done in states that have enacted similar legislation. This results in an estimated 227 members who will switch medications and choose a twelve-month supply.

This fiscal note assumes the medication switch would occur on average after 3 months of usage creating nine months of wasted doses for each of these 227 women, or an estimated total of 2,043 monthly prescriptions.

At a monthly estimated cost of \$39.93 and an implementation date of October 1, 2025, the total fiscal impact is \$61,183 total funds in fiscal year 2026 (\$55,065 Federal Funds and \$6,118 General Funds) and \$81,577 total funds in fiscal year 2027 (\$73,419 Federal Funds and \$8,158 General Funds). These expenses qualify for a 90% federal match.

Medicaid would need to amend managed care organization (MCO) contracts and update regulations to allow for hormonal birth control to be dispensed for a twelve-month supply at one time. The expenses related to the time and effort needed for these necessary changes would be absorbed by the Department of Health and Human Services.
