This bill will provide powers and duties to the juvenile court regarding the placement and custody of juveniles.

The Nebraska Supreme Court (NSC) states that this bill will increase the workload of juvenile court judges, and they will not be able to absorb this kind of a workload shift. Therefore, the NSC would have to use retired judges to cover this additional workload. The NSC estimates this to cost \$21,530 per year: \$20,000 salary and \$1,530 benefits (OASDI).

The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) estimates no fiscal impact.
