LB 739 repeals provisions relating to driver training schools. The bill repeals requirements for the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to develop rules and regulations governing driver training schools and to examine applicants for driver training school and instructor's licenses, license successful applicants and inspect school facilities and equipment. The current annual fee for a driver training school license is \$50 and for a new or renewal instructor's license is \$10. The revenue from the fees is placed in the General Fund.

The repeal of statutes governing driver training schools will reduce the workload of several staff in the DMV. The department indicates there will be a minimal decrease in workload, so no real savings will occur. In 2008-09, the revenue deposited in the General Fund from licenses for driver training schools totaled \$1,100 and from fees for driver school instructor licenses totaled \$1,420. So, there will be an annual decrease in revenue for the General Fund of about \$2,500 pursuant to the bill.
