LB863 would change provisions governing annexation by a city of the first class located either wholly or partly within the boundaries of a county with a population greater than 100,000 but less than 200,000 (i.e. such cities located in Sarpy County). Not later than 14 days before a planning commission public hearing on a proposed annexation by a related municipality, notice of the proposed annexation would be required to be provided to a sanitary improvement district (SID) which includes any of the land proposed to be annexed. The bill further would provide that upon receipt of such a notice, an affected SID would be required to obtain the approval from the related city council prior to entering into, amending, or extending any contract. The bill could represent relatively nominal notice expenses to affected municipalities and may represent implications with respect to administration of SID contracts. However, any related impacts would be dependent upon uncertain future annexation proposals by relevant municipalities affecting relevant SID's. Any fiscal implications of LB863 are similarly uncertain.
