A few states do not require any degree and a few states require at least an associate degree (including Nebraska), 30+ require a bachelor's degree and the remaining states have other educational requirements. According to the Federal Register of 1992, it was recommended that a nursing home administrator have at least a bachelor's degree. Administrators must be able to understand the basics of nursing care for residents, Federal and State laws and regulations governing the operation of nursing facilities, licensing and payment programs and general business practices. Further for skilled nursing facilities to receive payments under a State Medicaid plan, states must have a program for licensing nursing home administrators.
