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Introduction

The 2025 edition of Nebraska At-A-Glance comprises 119 topics, ranking states across various categories, including demographics, agriculture, education, and taxes. Nebraska At-A-Glance is designed to provide policymakers and the public with a view into essential state-level data comparisons. The data presented excludes Washington D.C., Puerto Rico, and U.S. Territories.

Nebraska At-A-Glance can be used as a quick reference or a starting point for research into policy areas vital to the Cornhusker State. This document only offers a sample of the vast amount of available data on various policy topics. Senators and their staff members are welcome to contact the Legislative Research Office for any policy research requests. The information presented in this report reflects the most current data available for all 50 states. For some topics, per capita or percentage figures were utilized to account for population differences between states.

State values are always ranked from greatest to least, regardless of subject matter. Thus, a greater ranking is not always preferable to a lesser ranking. Values are displayed only to a certain decimal place, so states may appear to have the same value, but a different ranking because their actual values differ. U.S. averages represent an average of the 50 states.

Each ranking page features an icon indicating whether Nebraska's rank among states increased, decreased, or remained the same compared to the [2021 edition](#) of Nebraska At-A-Glance or to previously published data. Additionally, supplemental information about each subject, including data definitions and analysis is provided on each page. Ranking pages also include a chart comparing Nebraska to the national average (or historical Nebraska data) and a map illustrating how states rank in comparison to each other.

Data was accessed and collected during the 109th Nebraska Legislature, 1st Regular Session. Source information is located at the bottom of each topic page. Due to extensive definitions, a data glossary is available in digital format by accessing [Nebraska At-A-Glance Online](#).

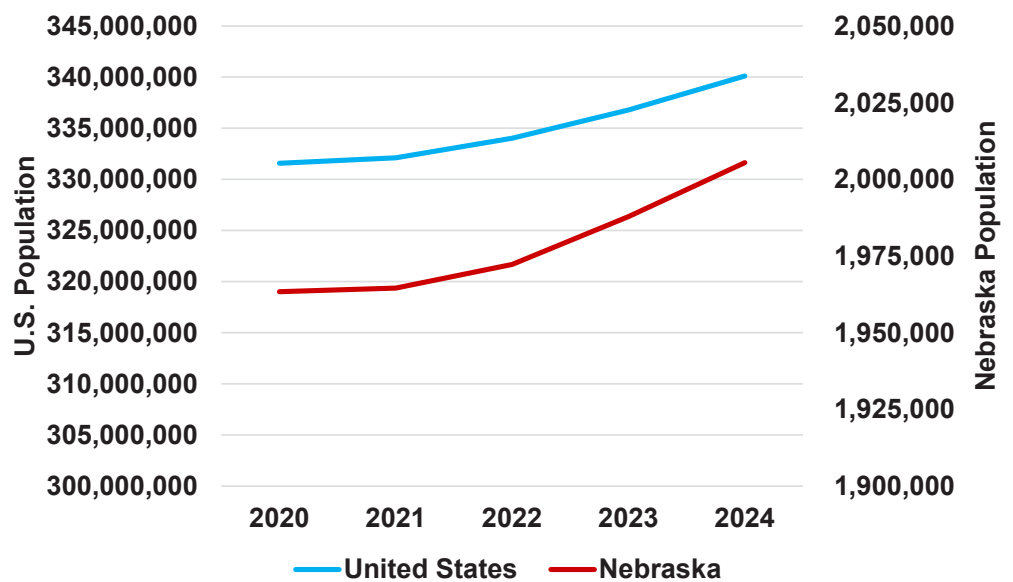

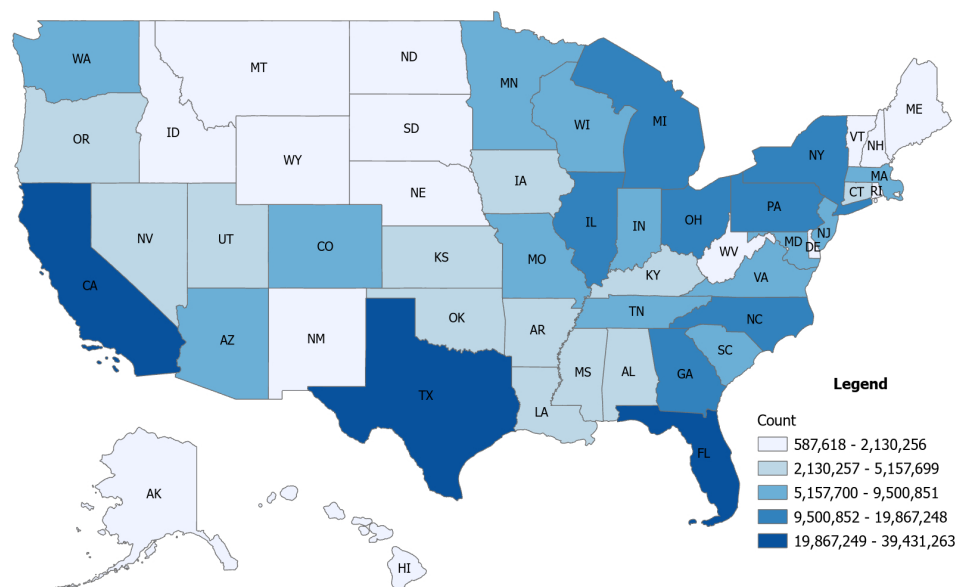
Nebraska's estimated population in 2024 (2,005,465) represents 0.6% of the total population of U.S. states (339,408,738).

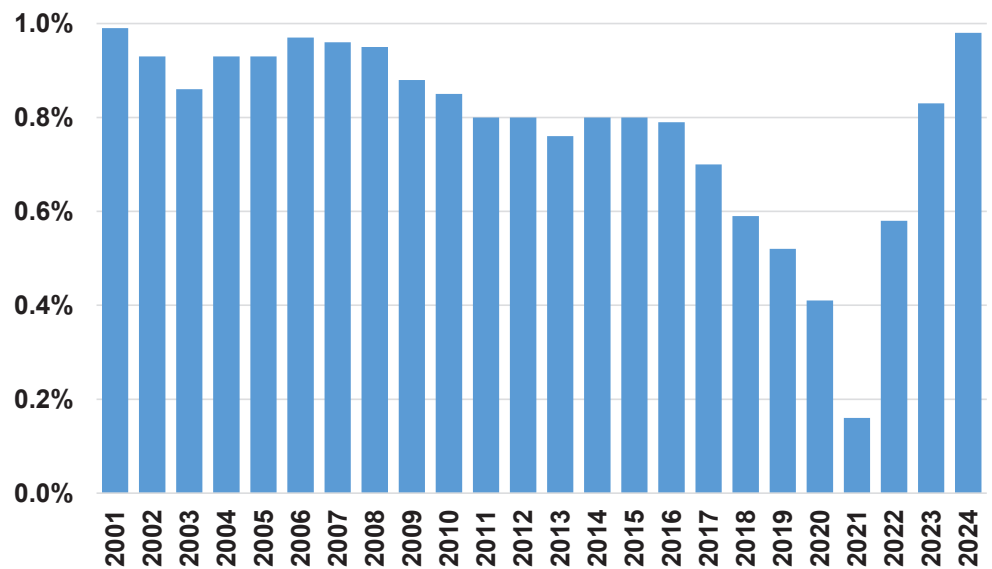

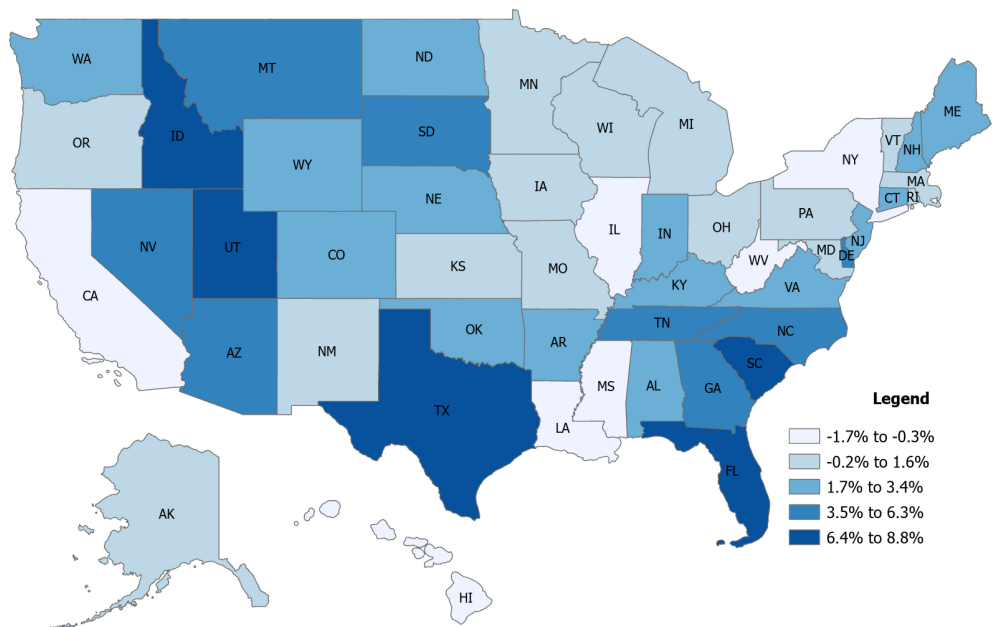

JULY 2000 - JULY 2024 ANNUAL PERCENT CHANGE IN U.S. POPULATION

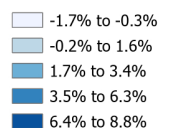

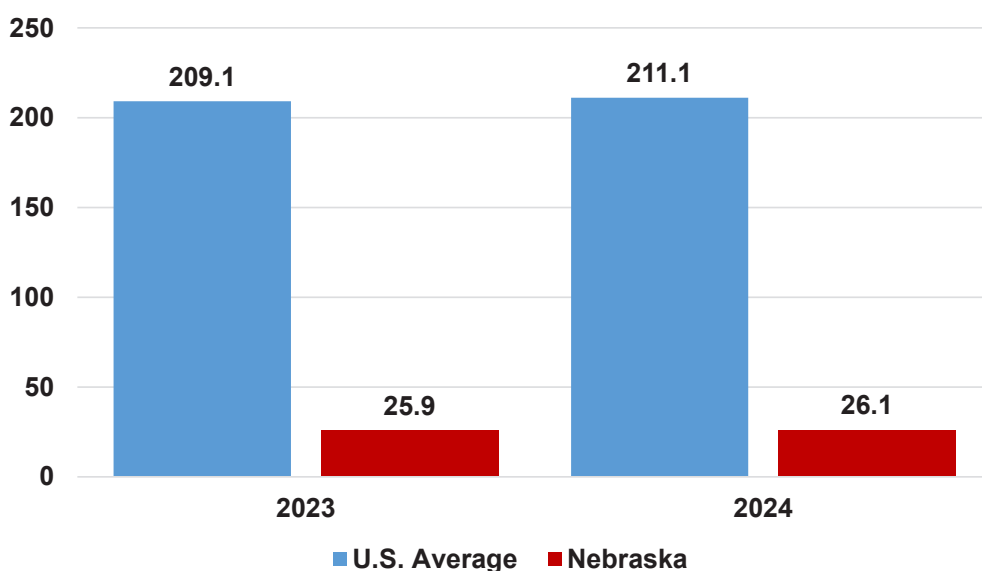

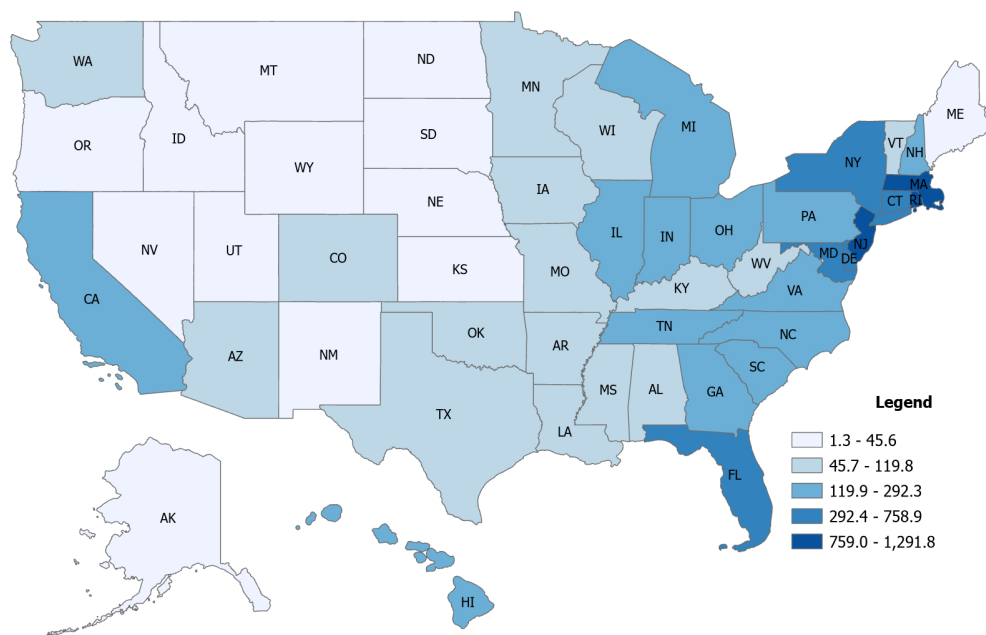

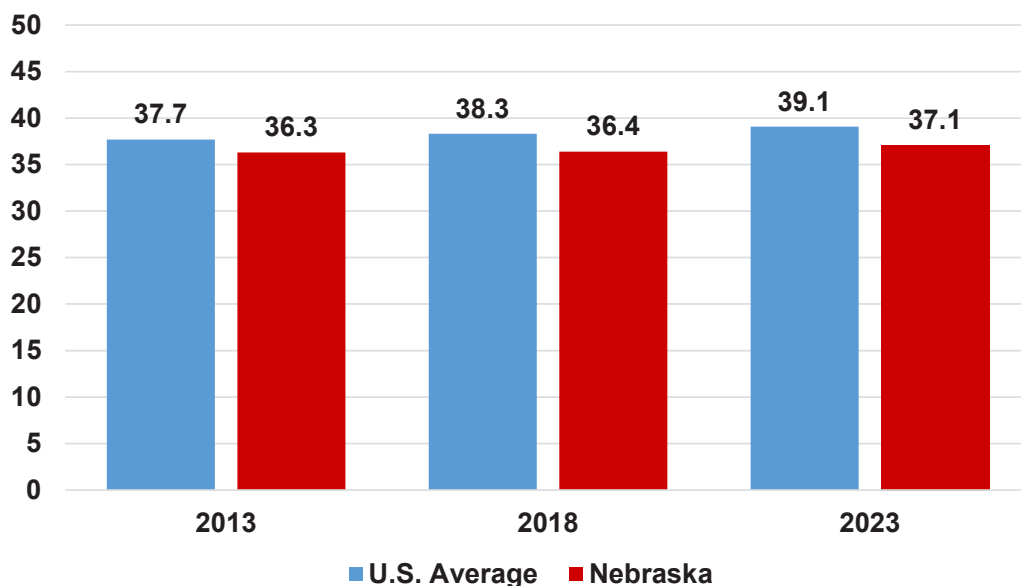

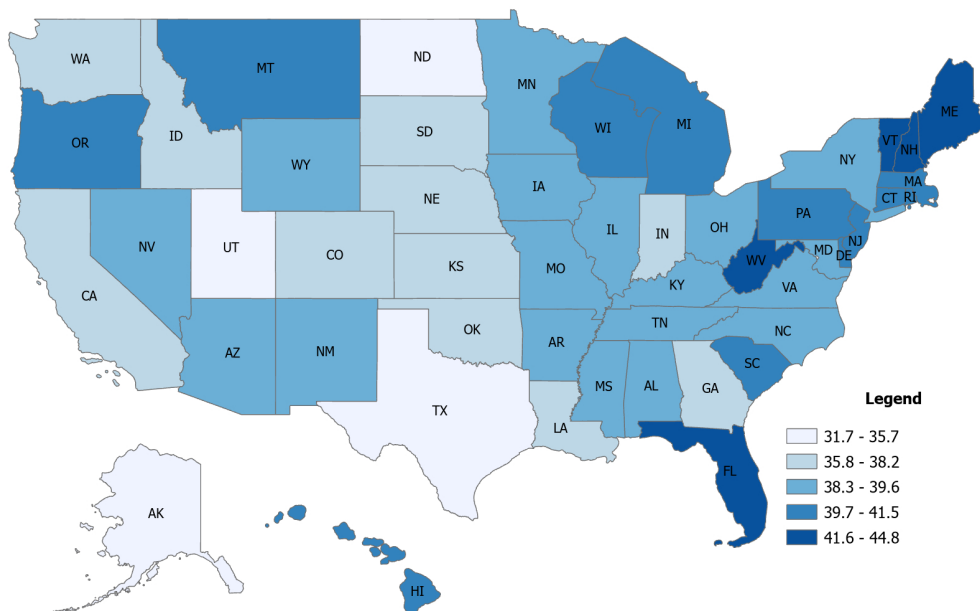
The median age of the population in Nebraska increased from 2018 (36.4) to 2023 (37.1) and the state fell from 43rd among states to 45th.

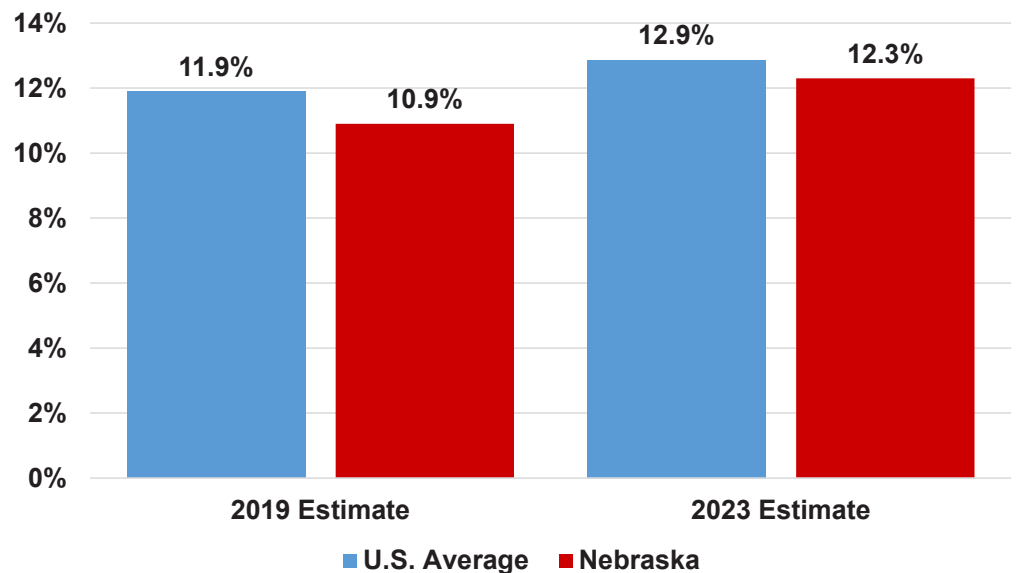

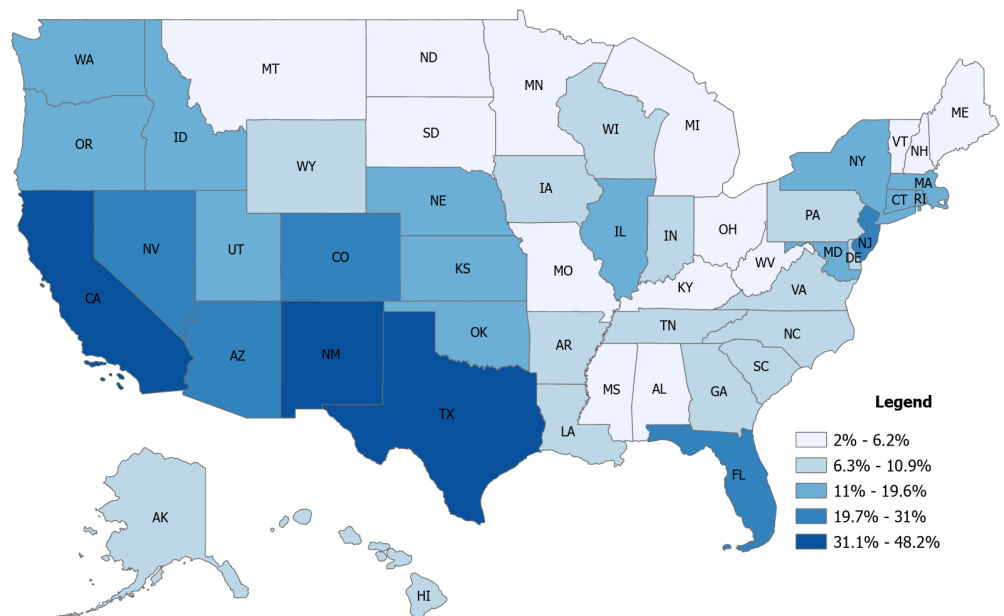
Survey respondents indicated whether or not they are of Hispanic or Latino ethnicity regardless of race.

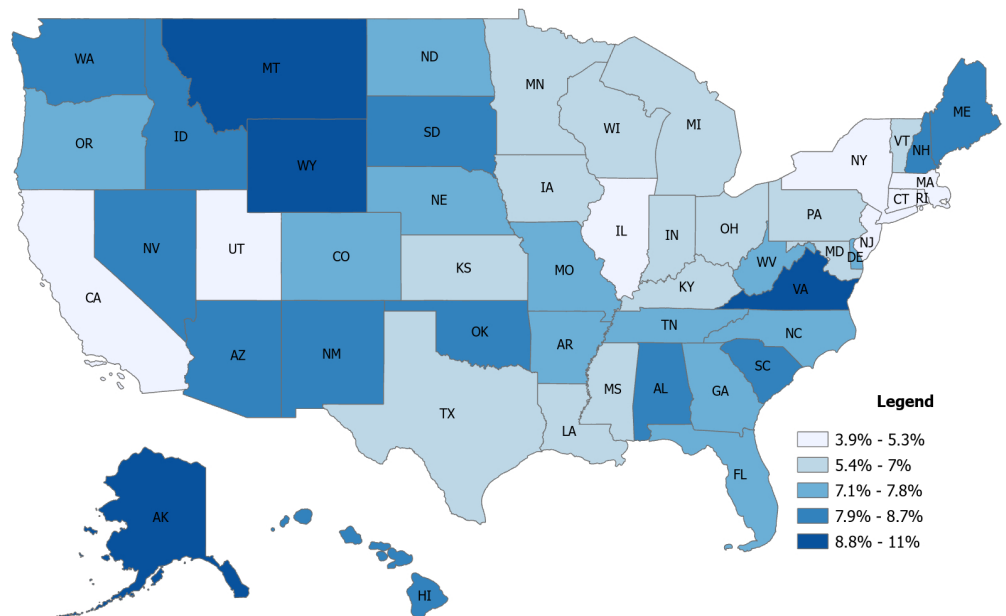

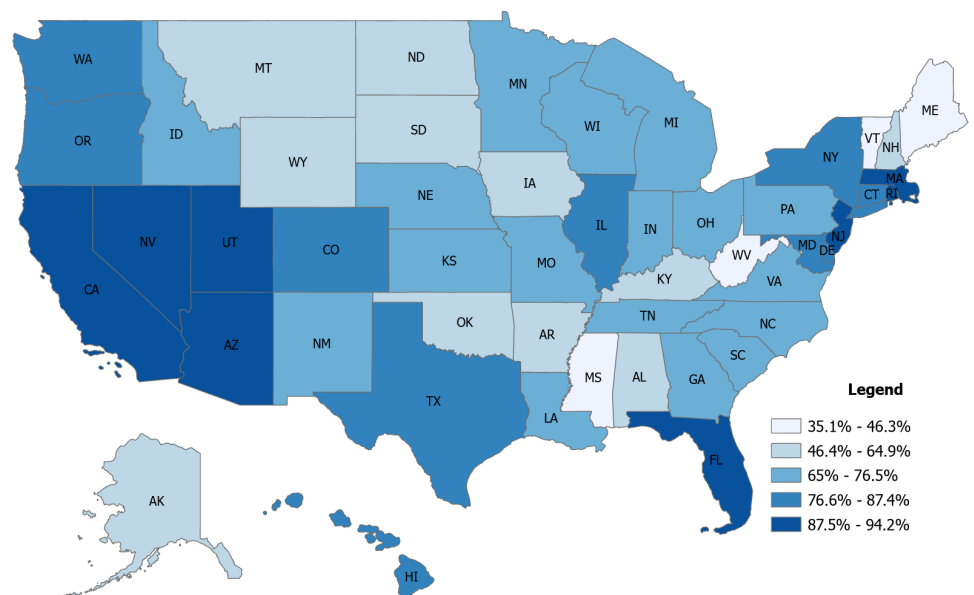
Following the 2020 Census, the Census Bureau redefined urban areas as an area that encompasses at least 5,000 people or at least 2,000 housing units. This is a change from the previous minimum of 2,500 people which had been in place since the 1910 Census.

After the 2010 Decennial Census, the urban population in Nebraska ranked 28th among states (73.1%). Nebraska's rank increased to 25th in 2020 but the share of its population in urban areas (73.0%) decreased slightly.

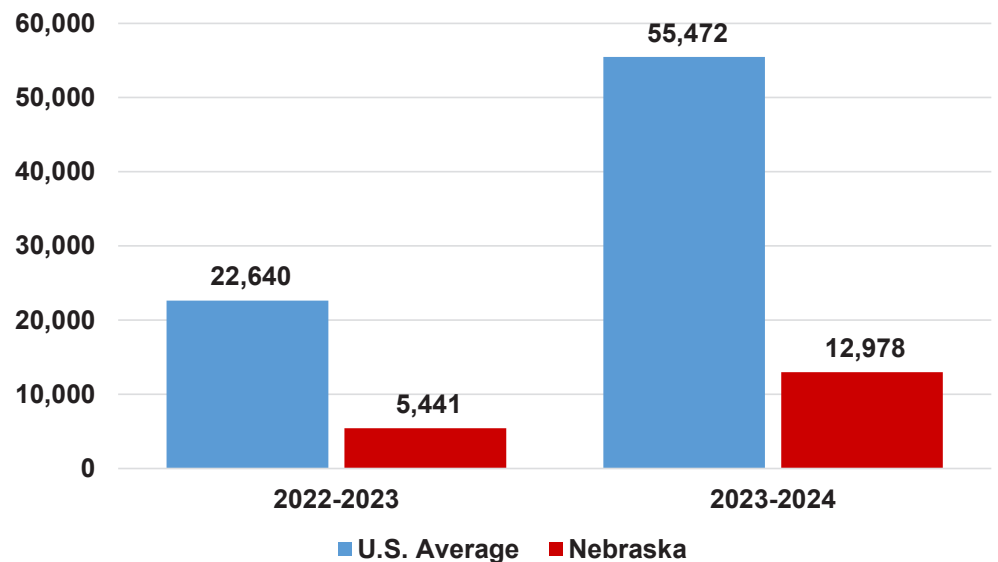

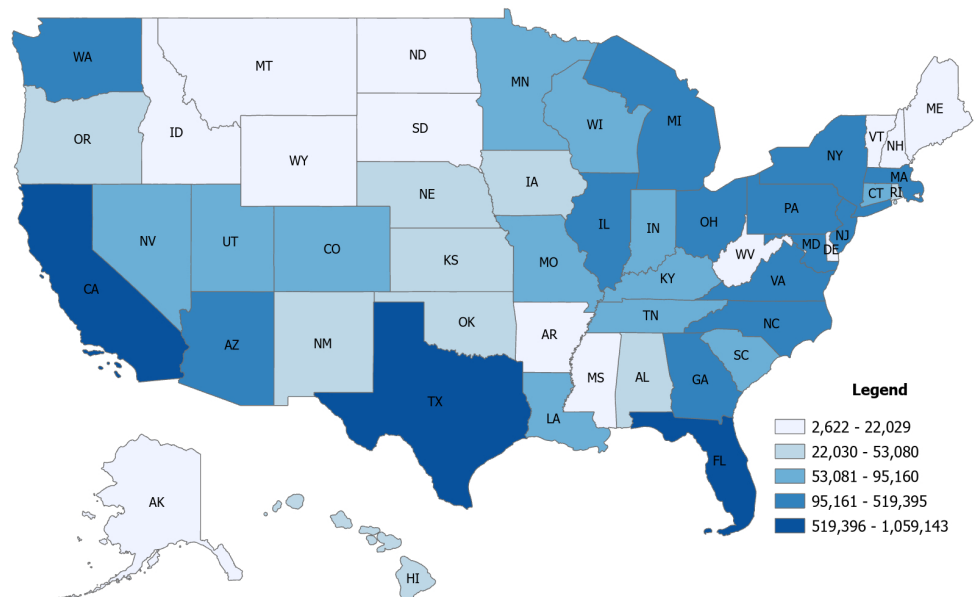

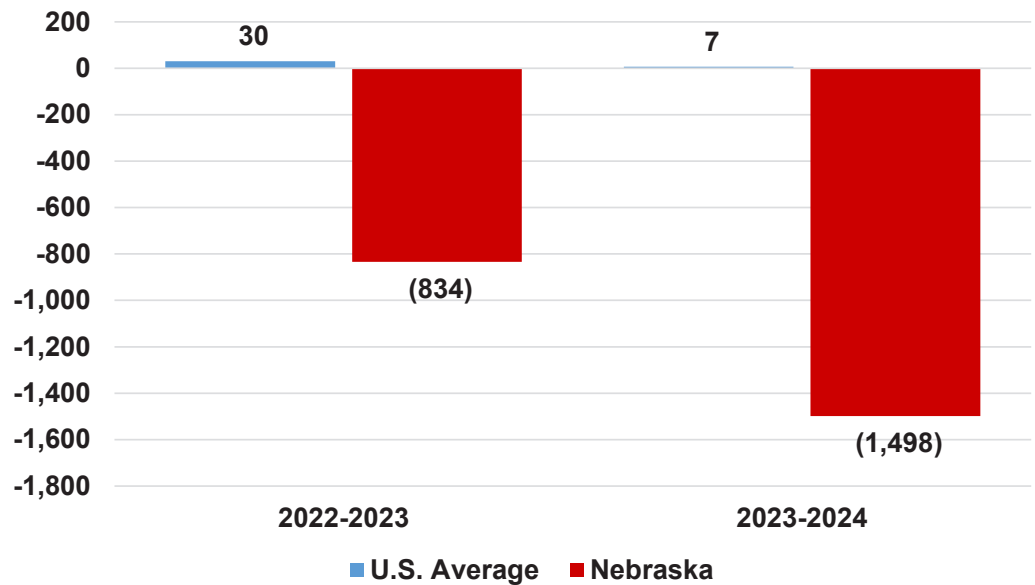

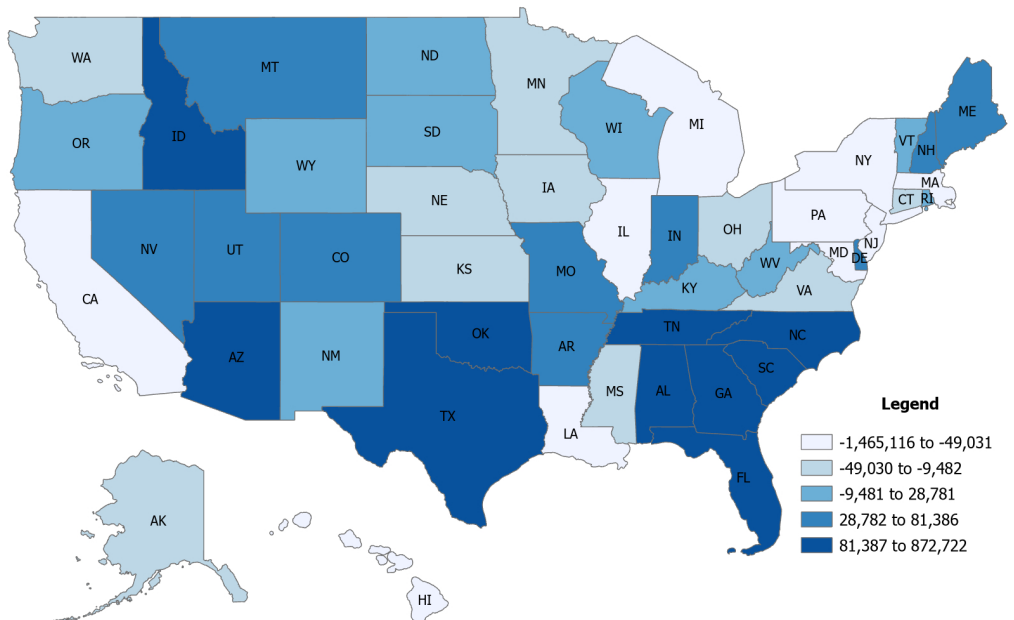

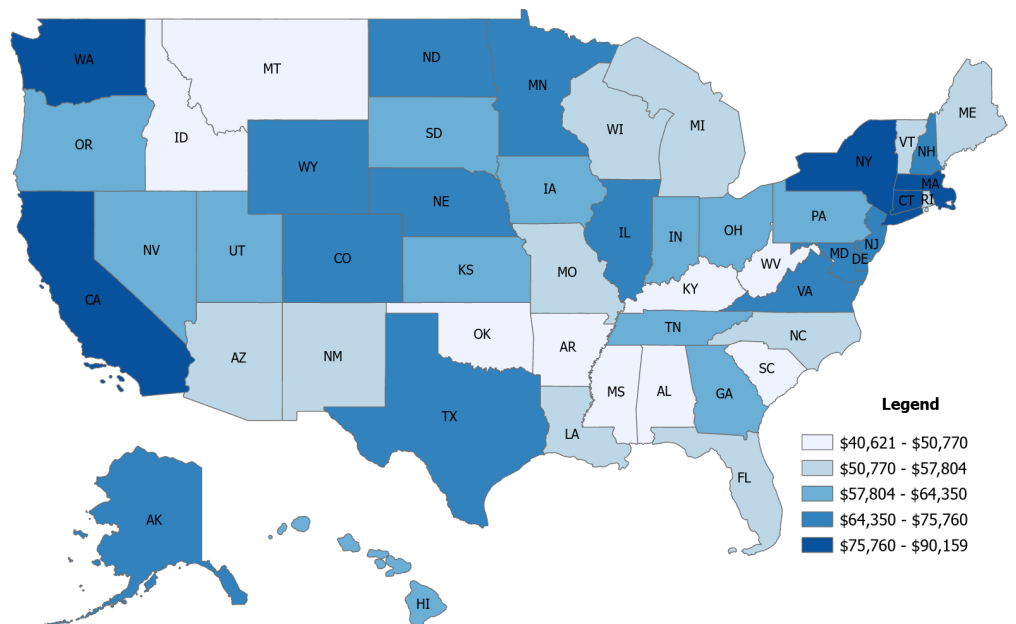

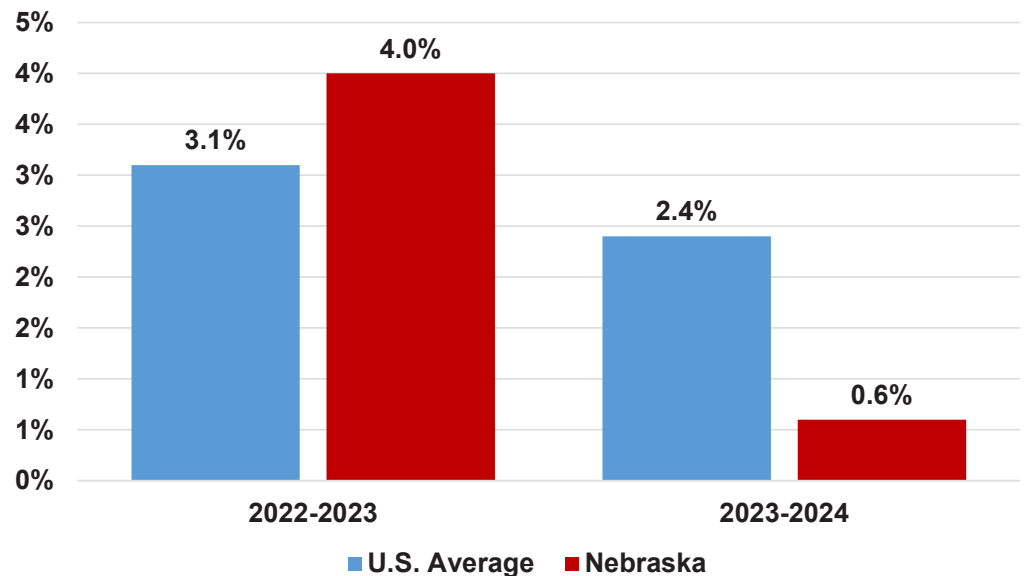

Nebraska's GDP grew at a rate of 0.6% from 2023 to 2024, less than the U.S. average (2.4%). From 2022 to 2023, Nebraska's GDP grew at a rate of 4.0%, which was greater than the U.S. average (3.1%), and was ranked 12th among states.

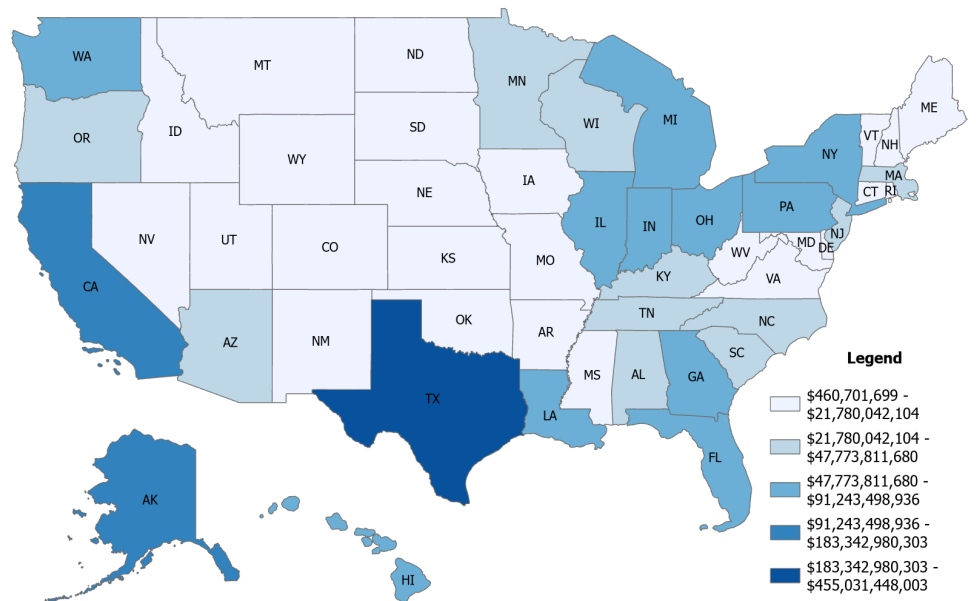

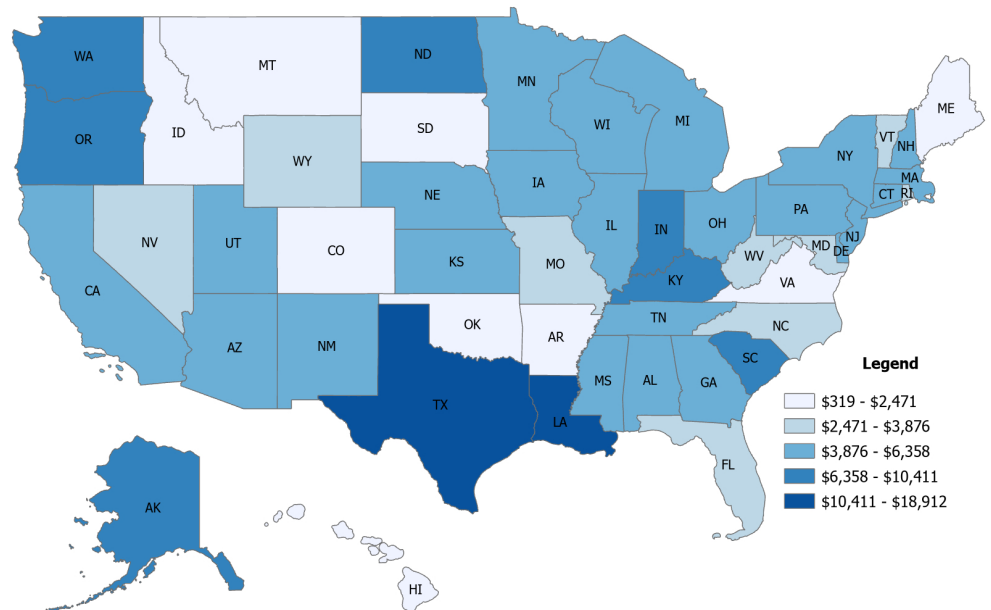

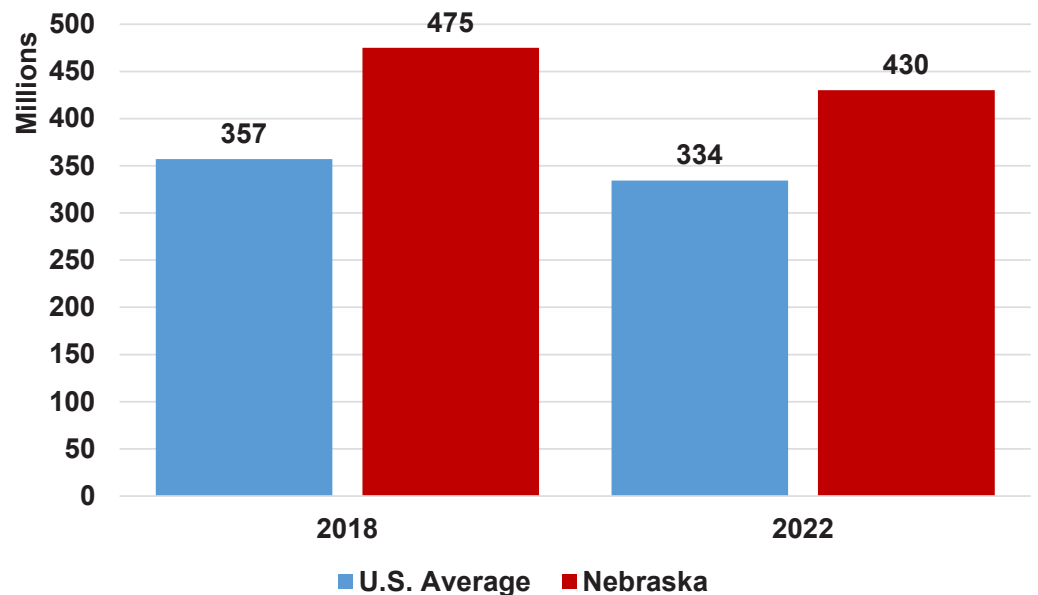

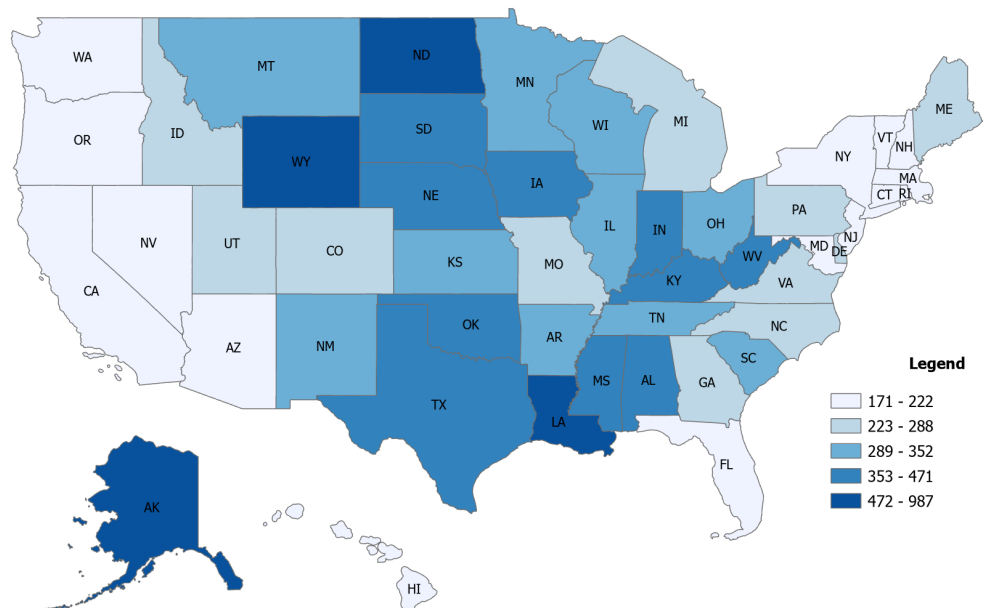

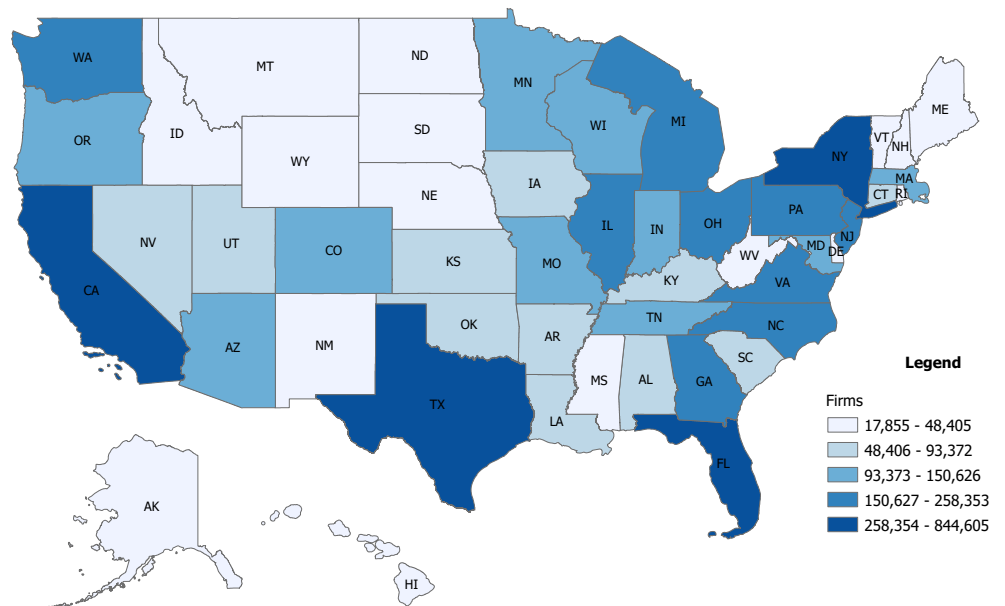

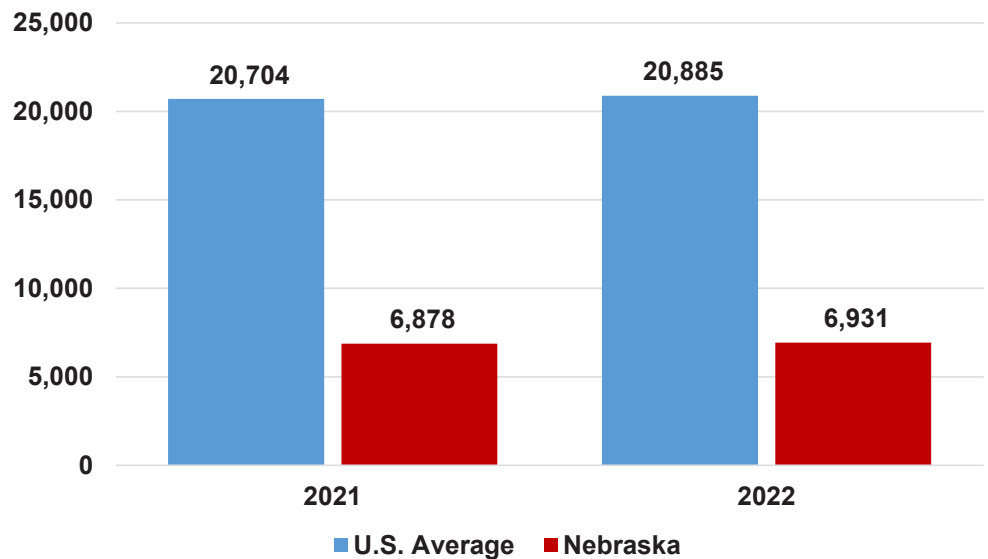

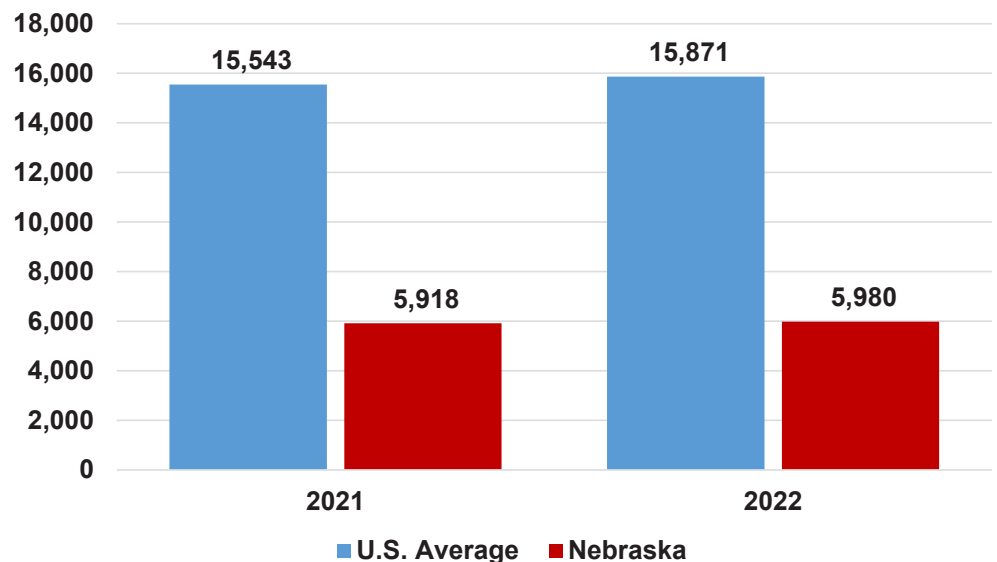

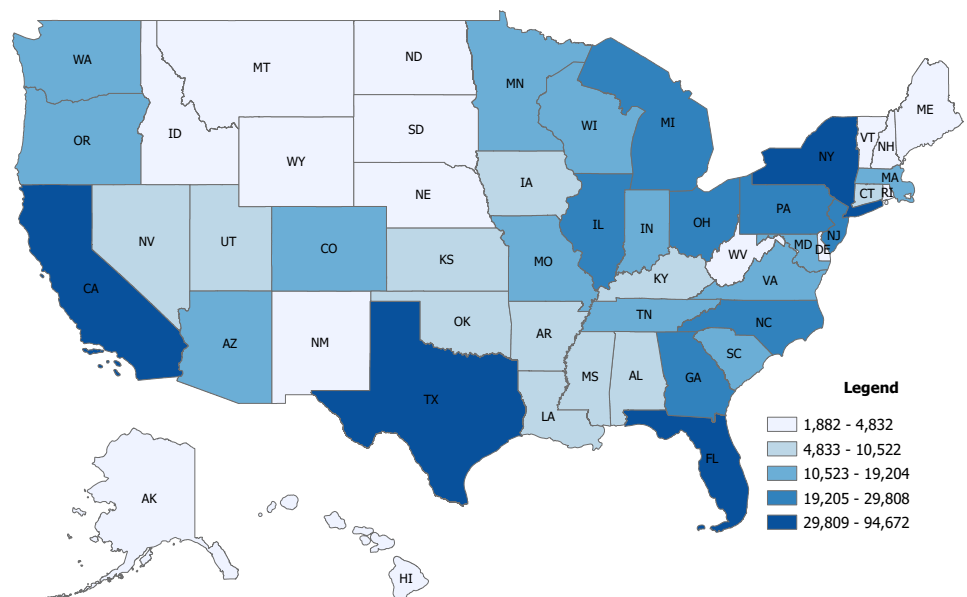

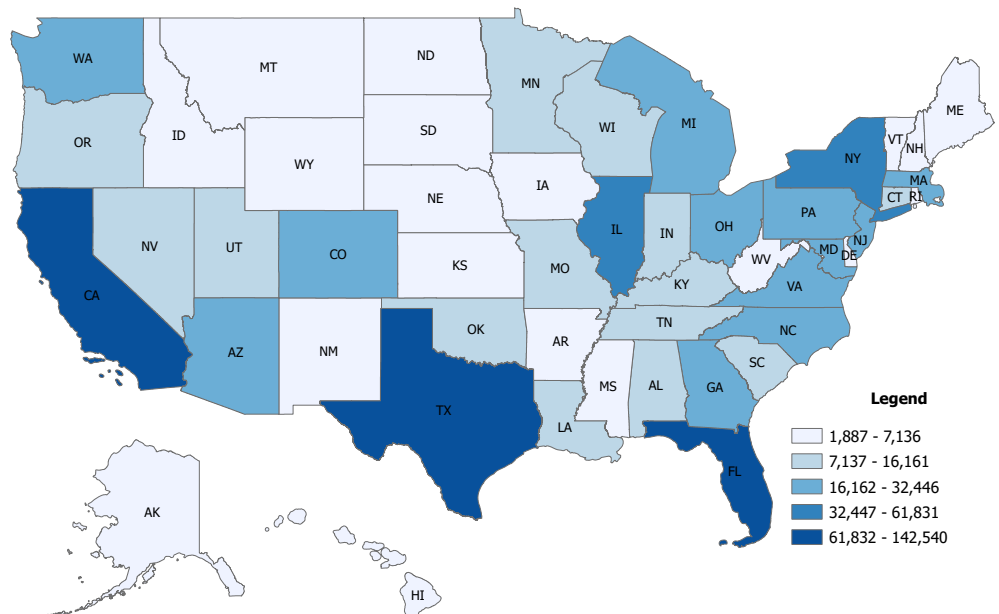

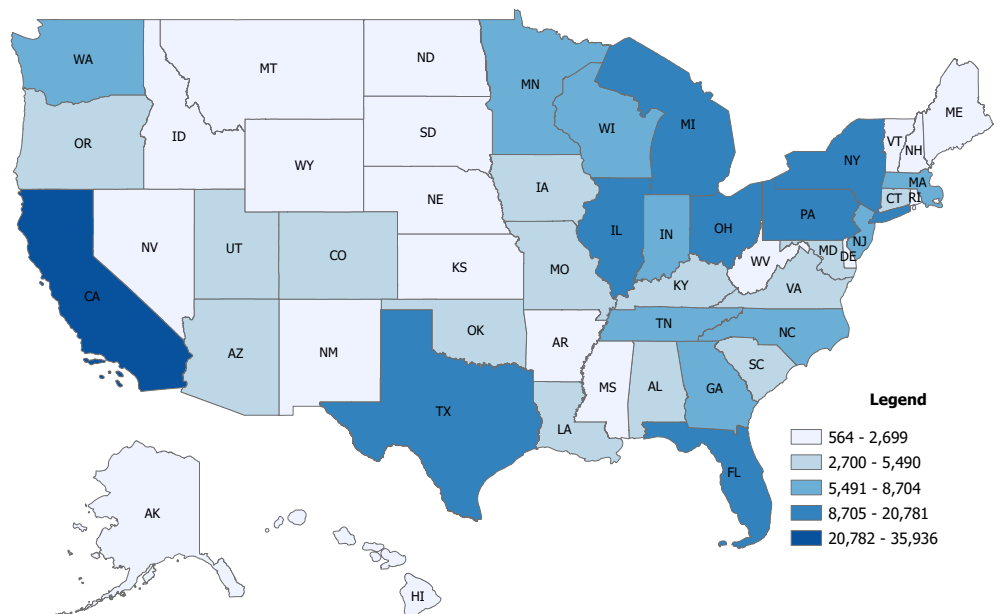

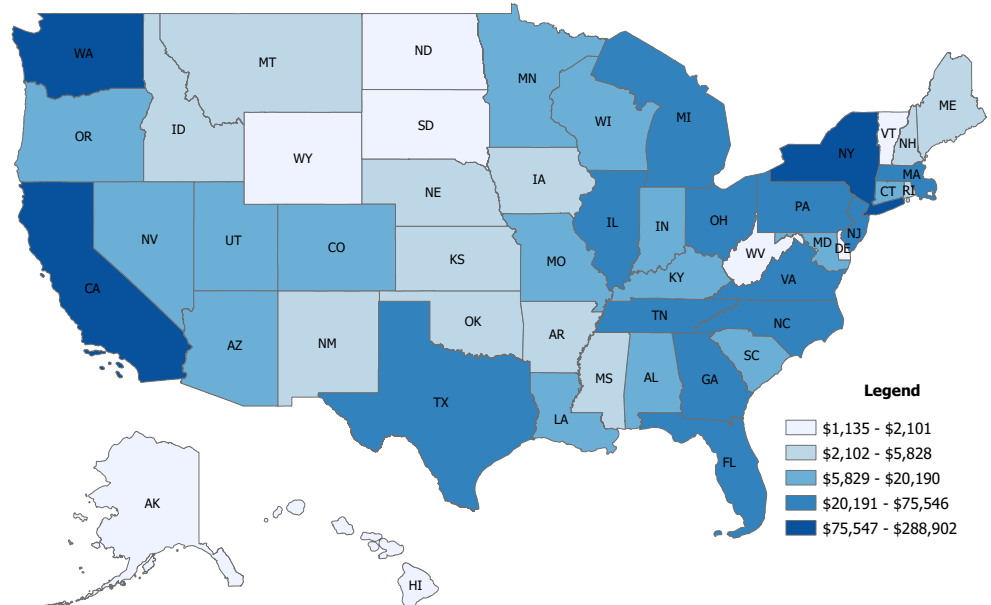

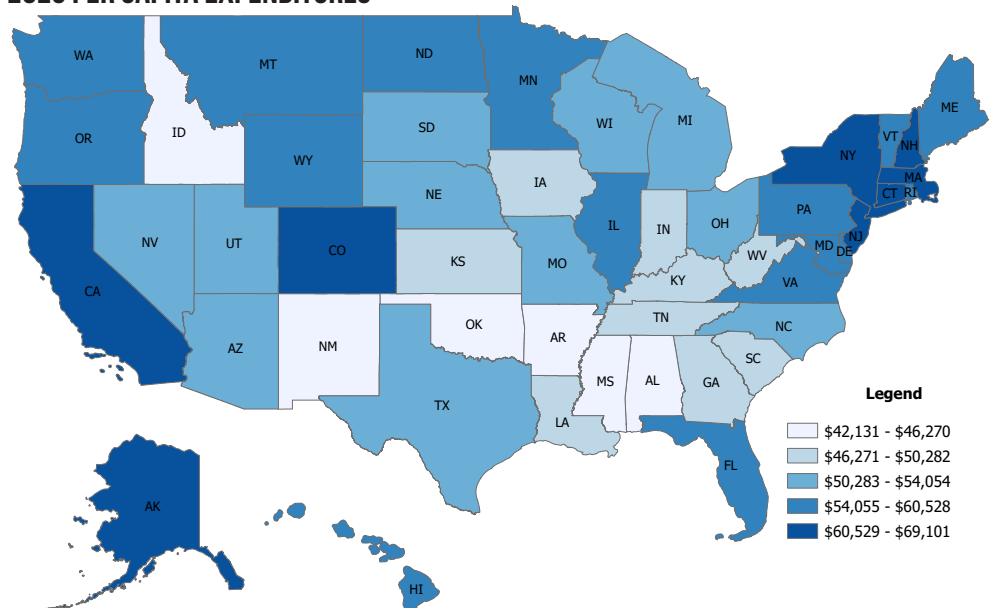

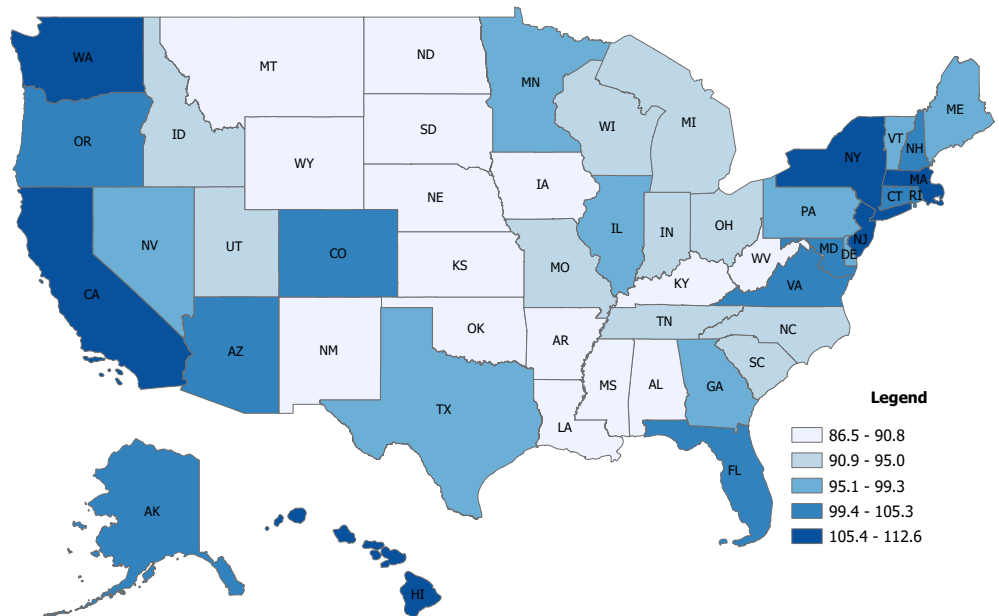

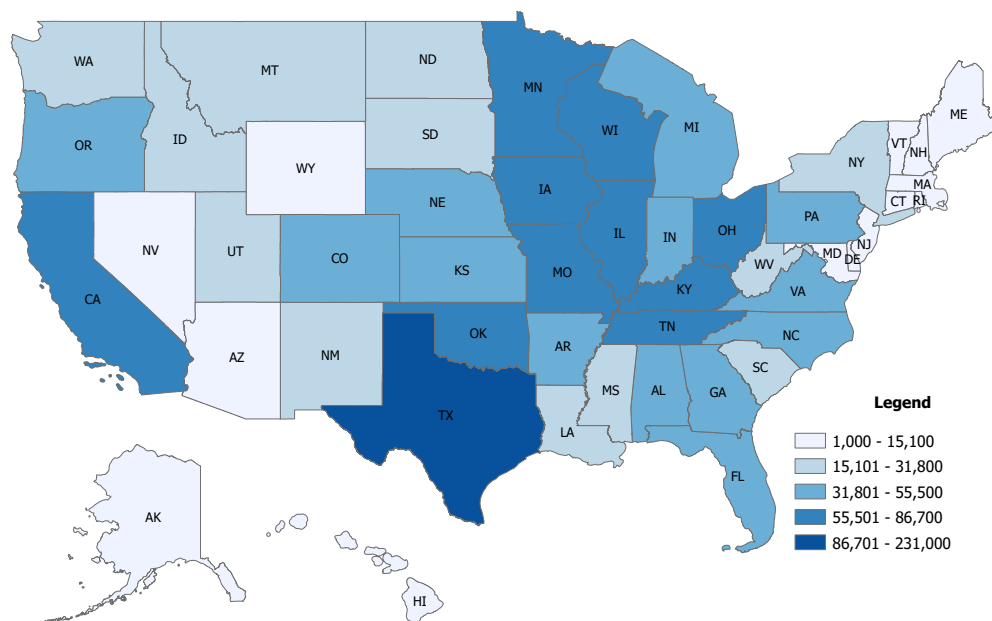

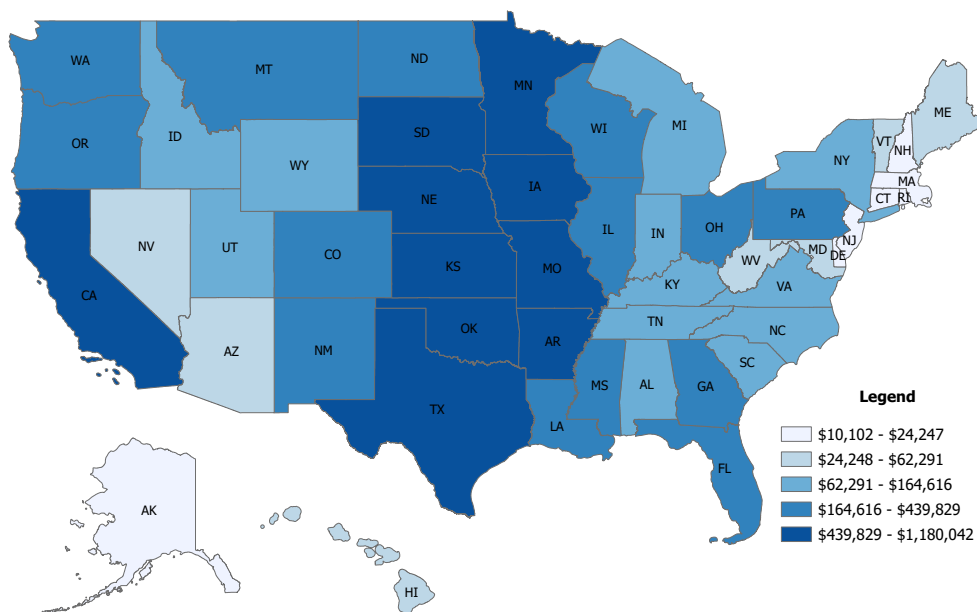

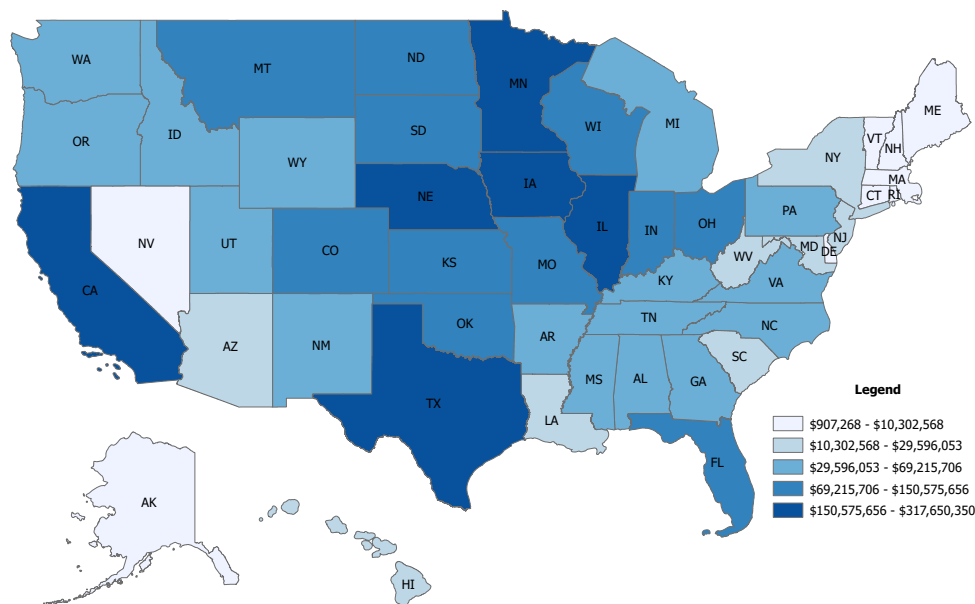

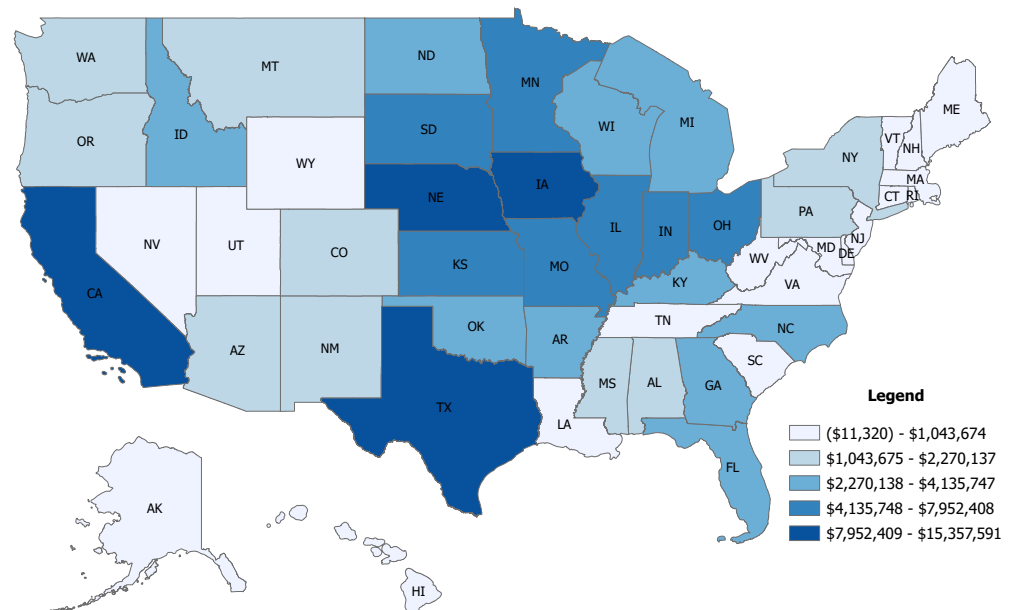

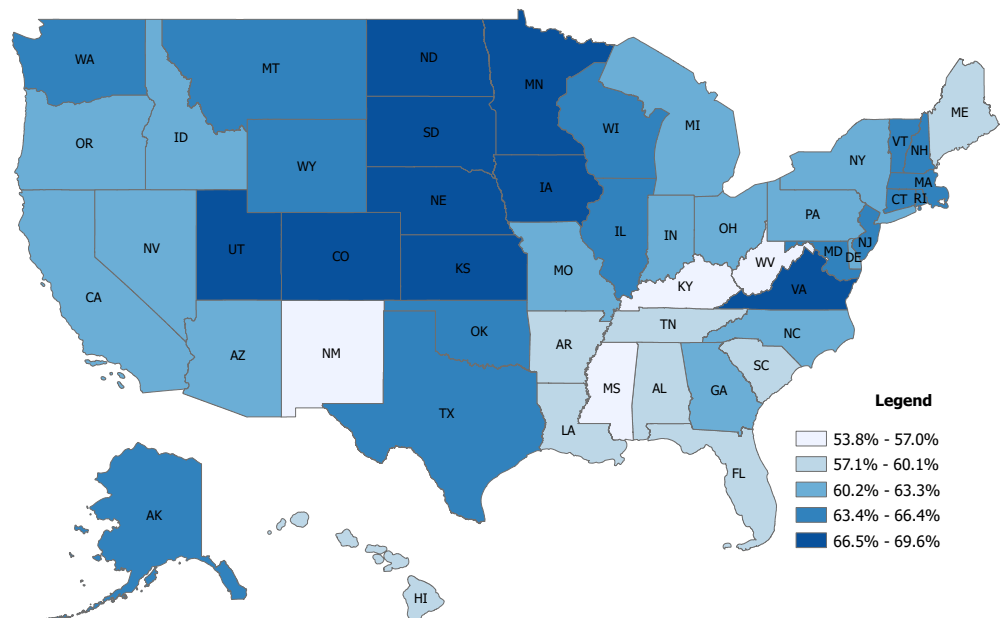

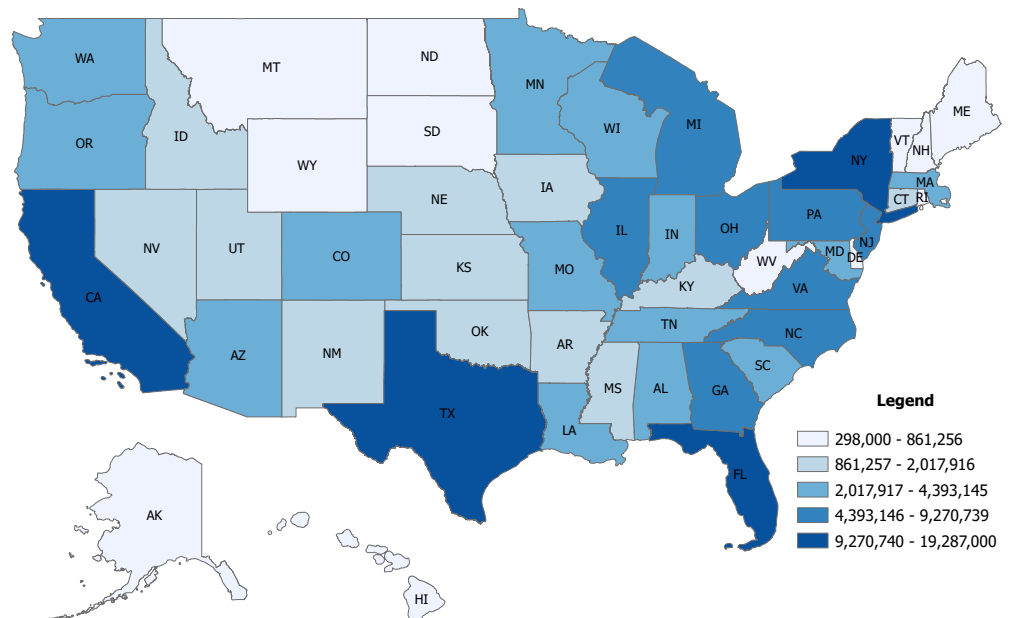

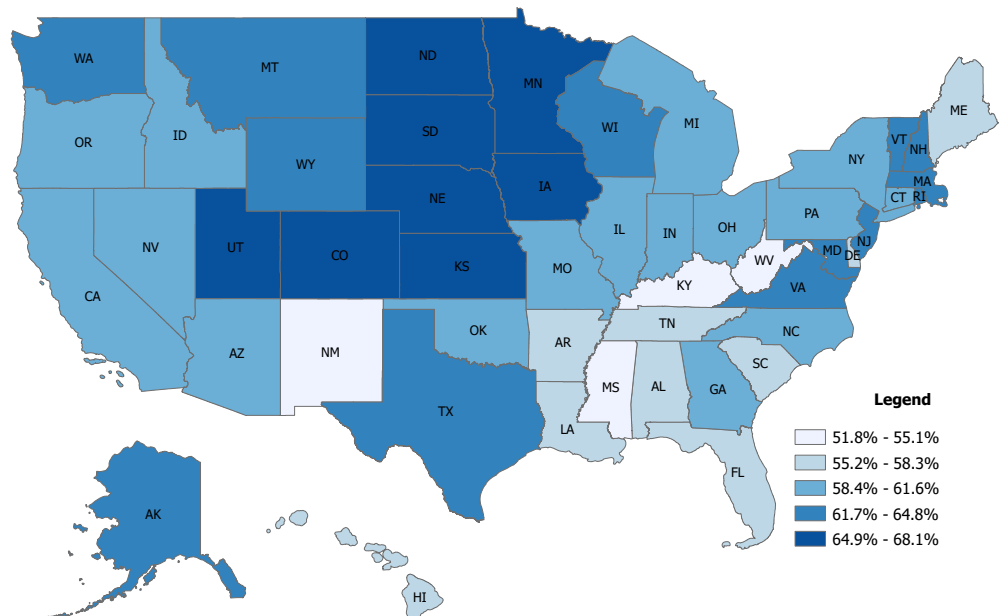

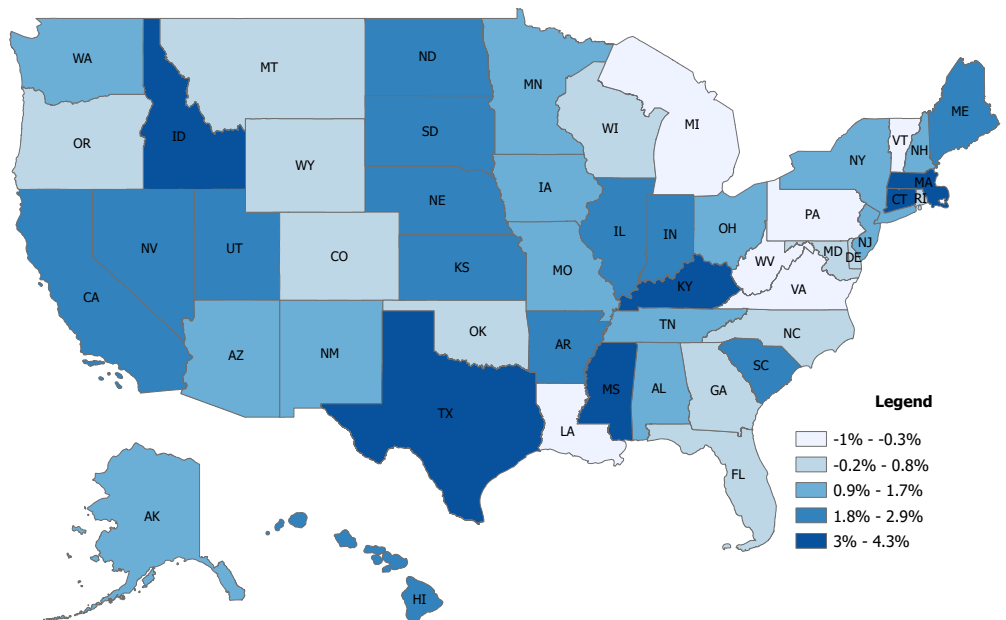

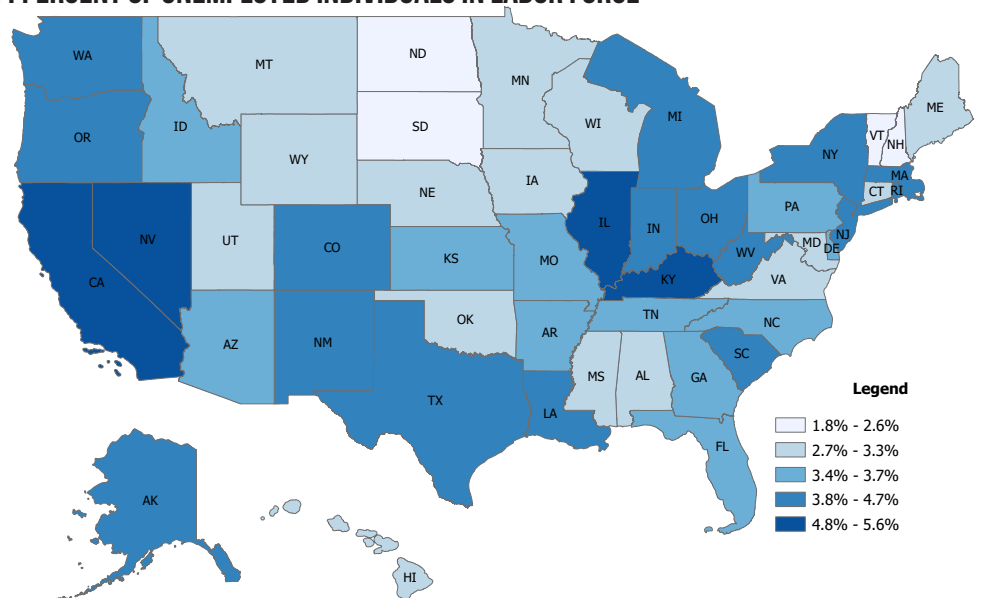

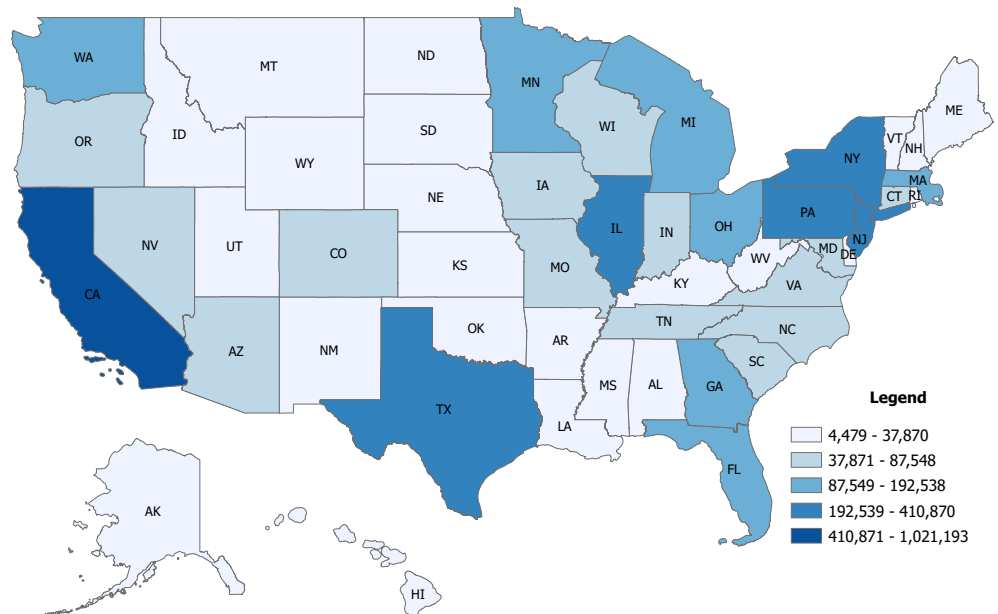

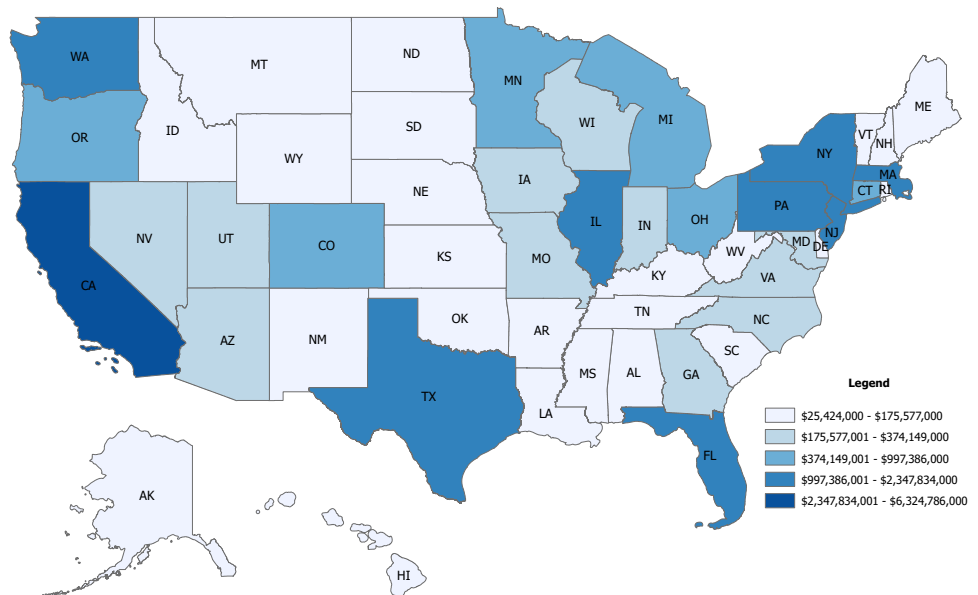

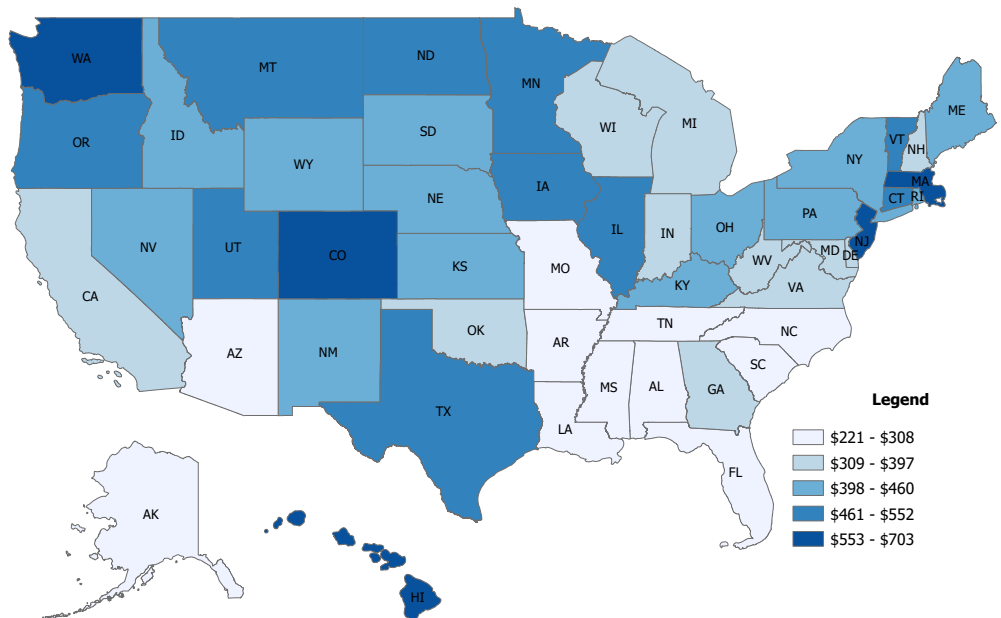

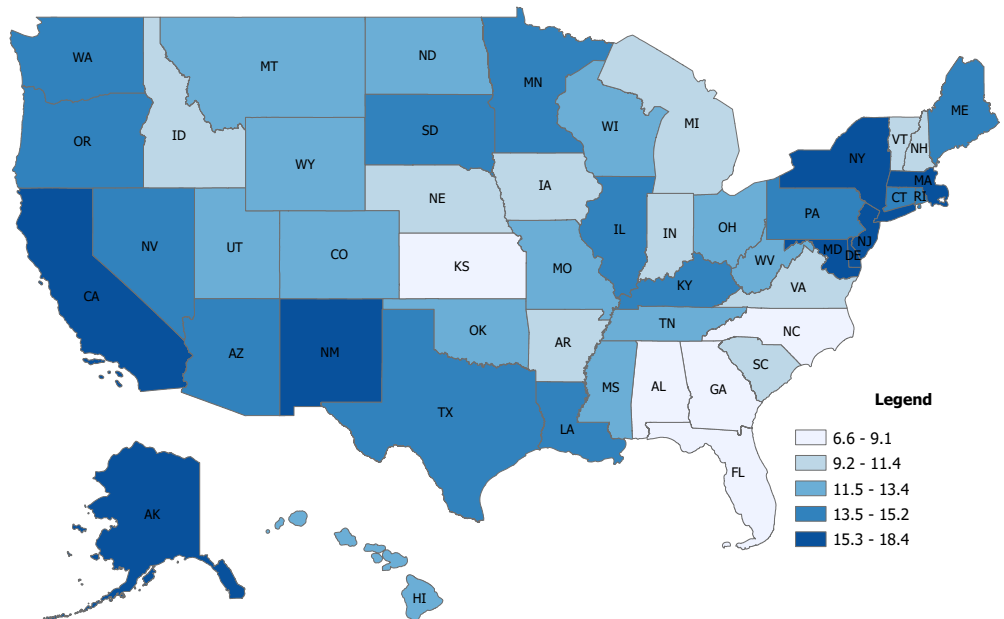

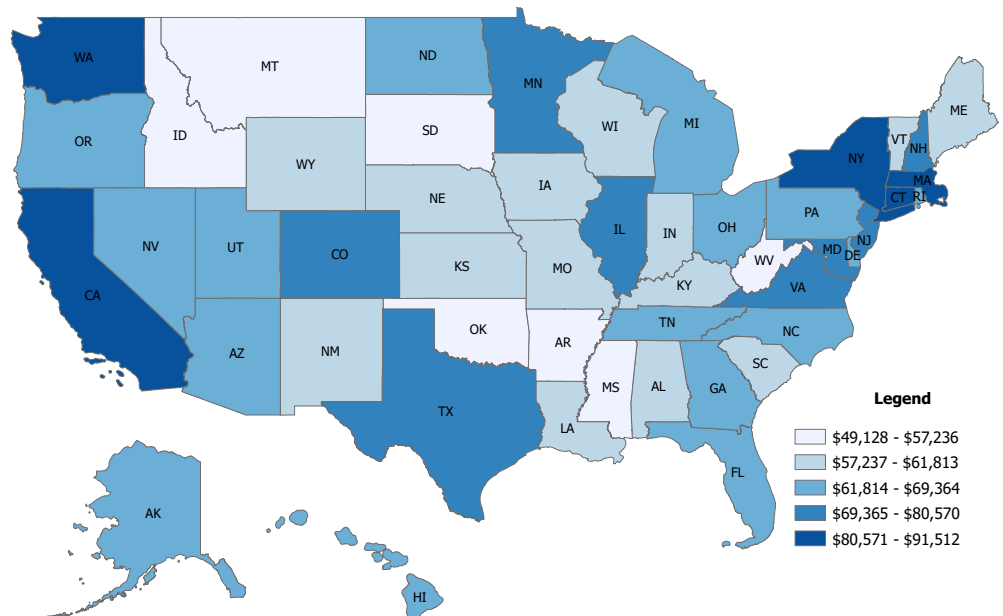

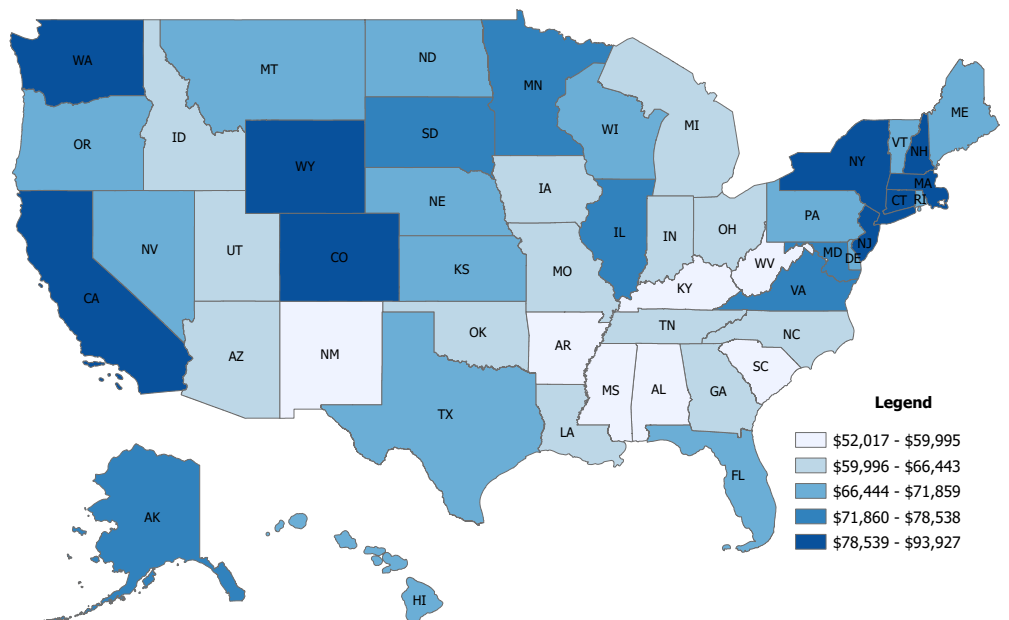

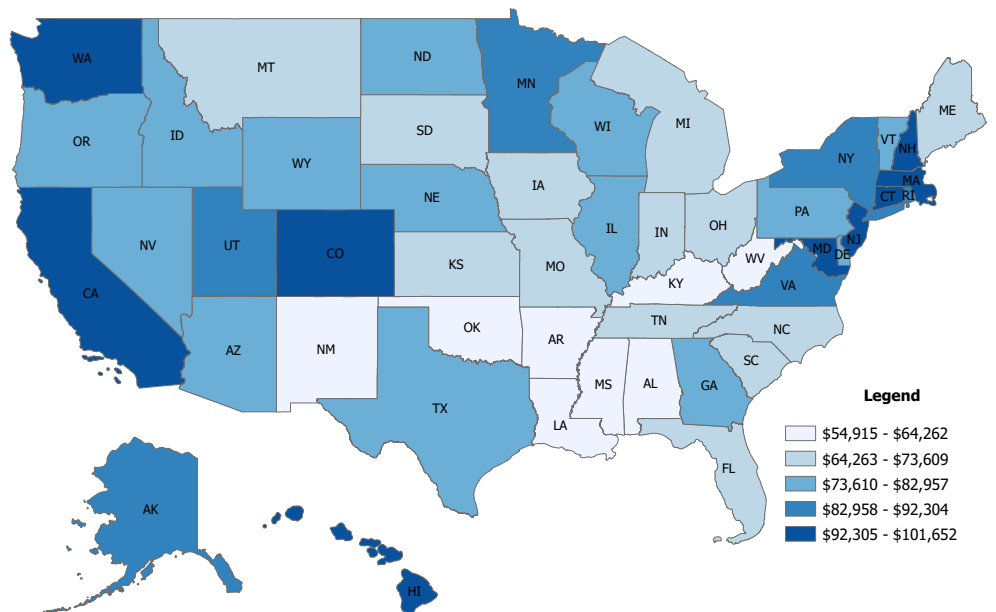

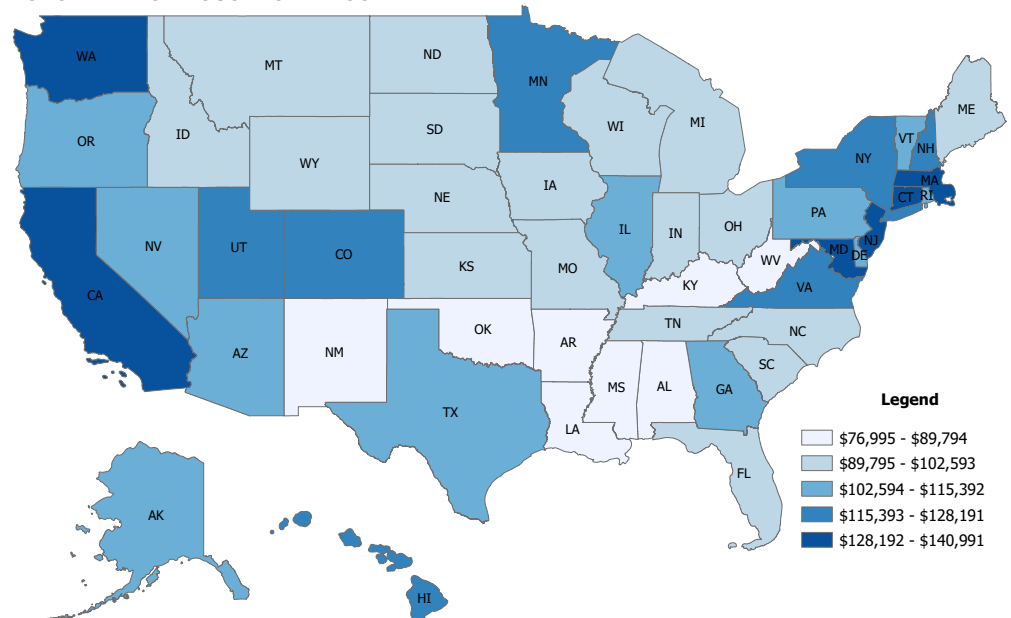

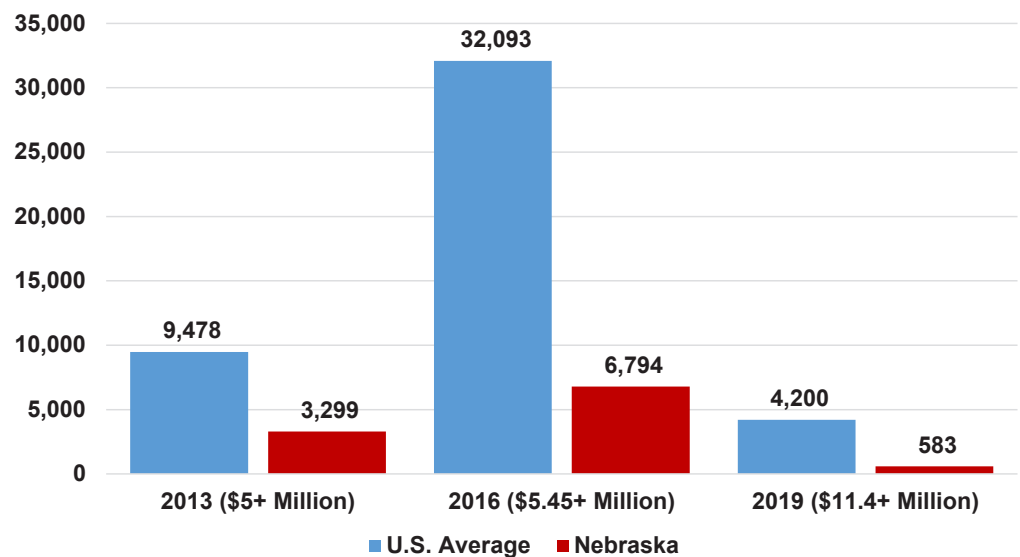

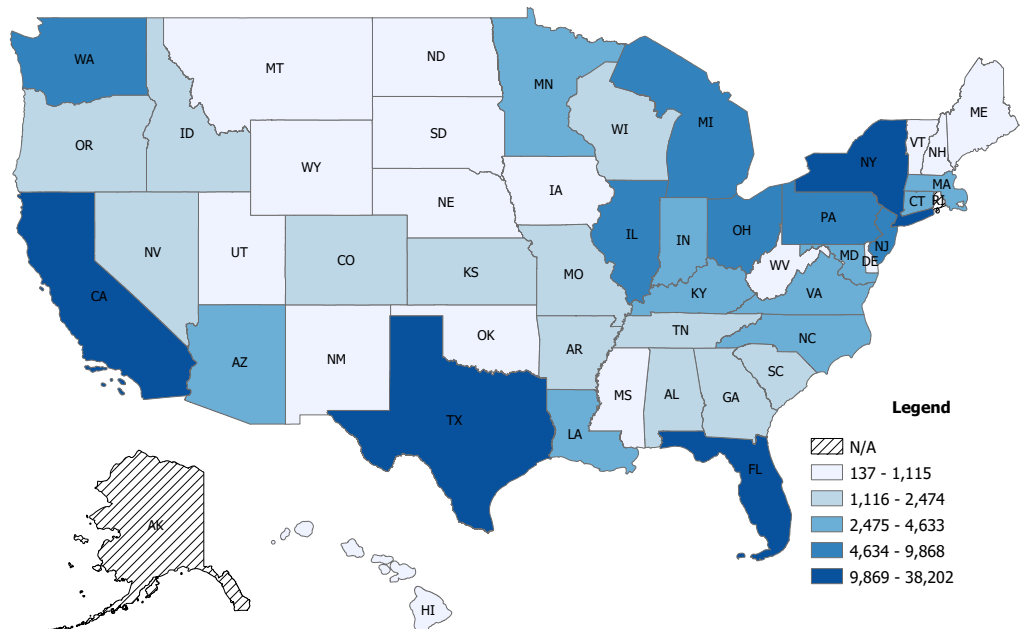

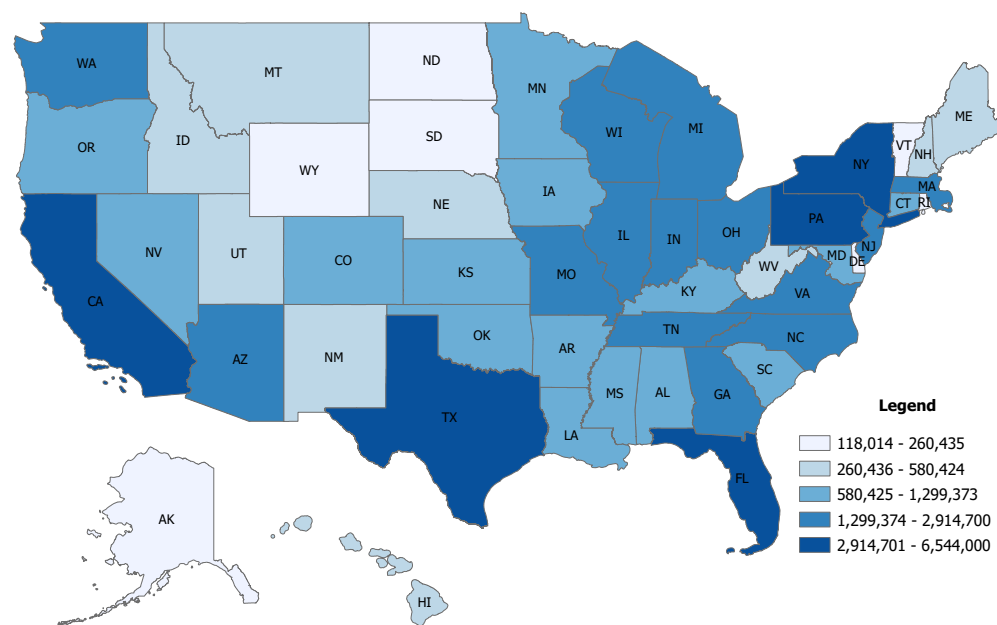

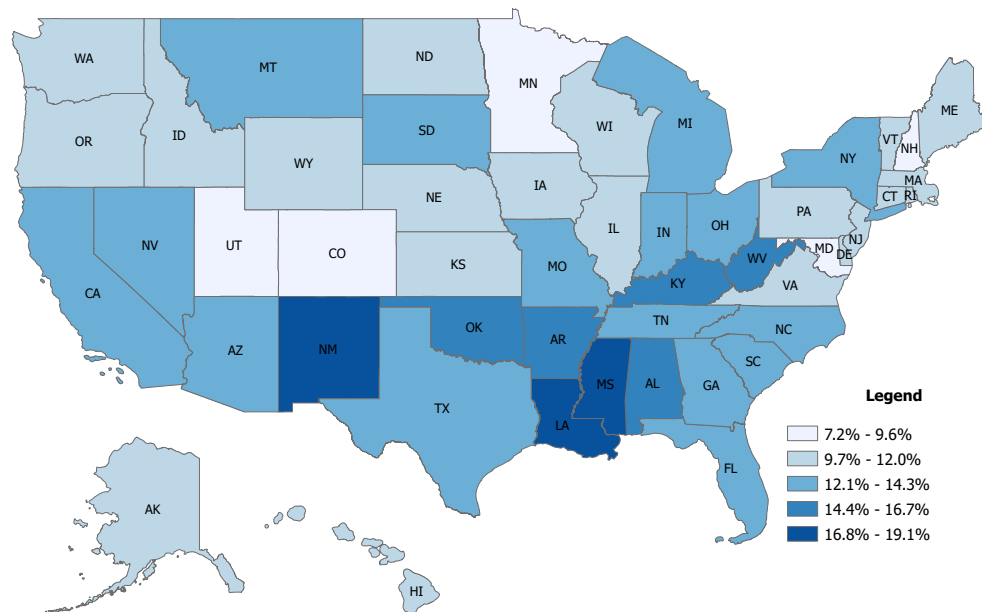

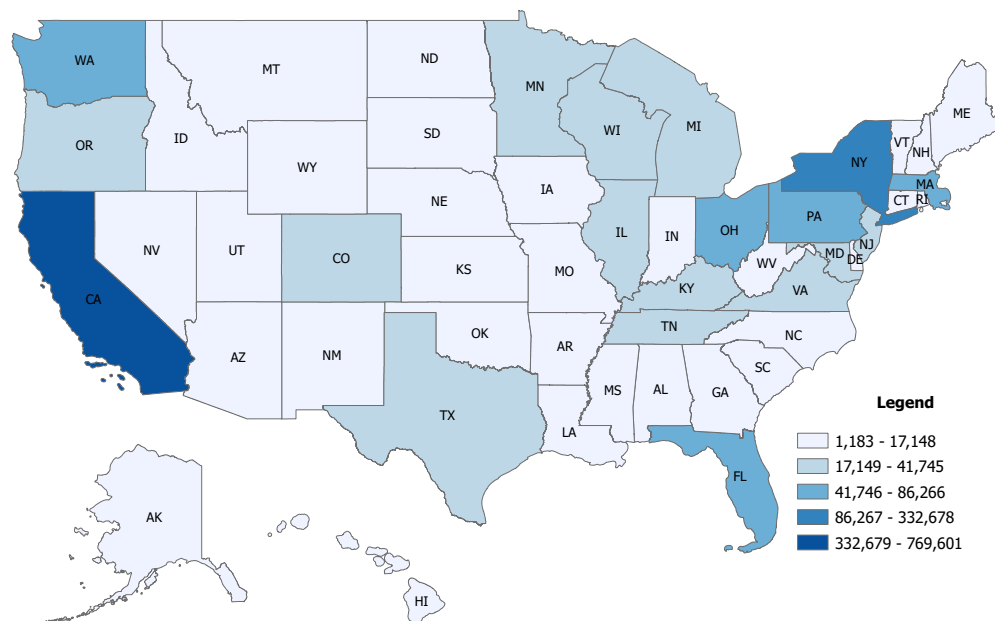

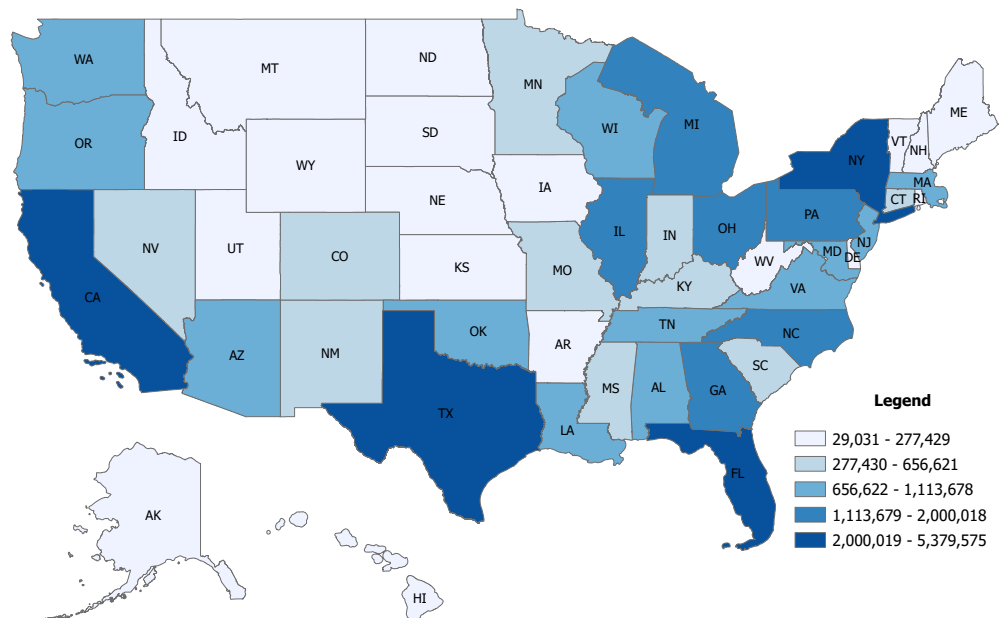

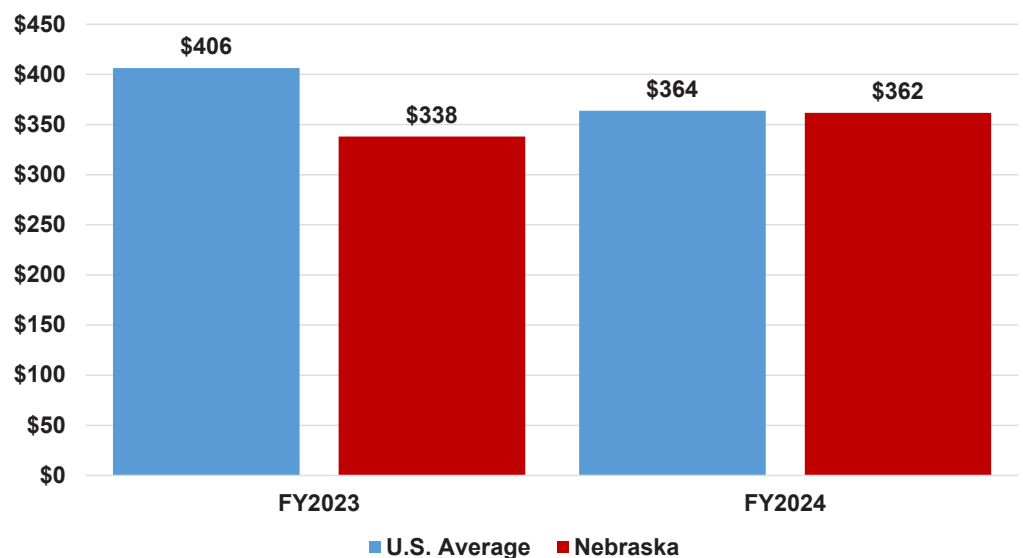

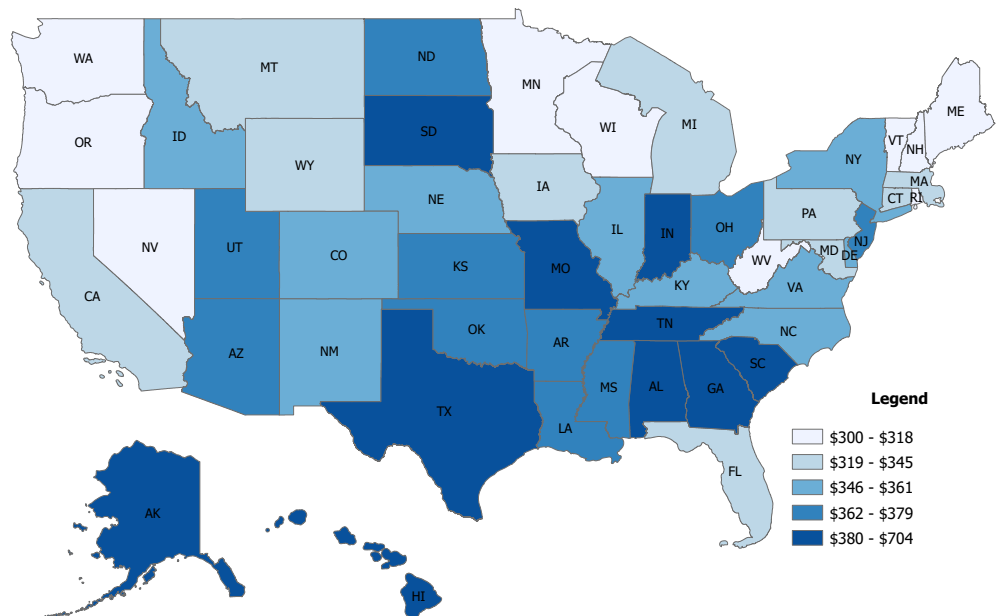

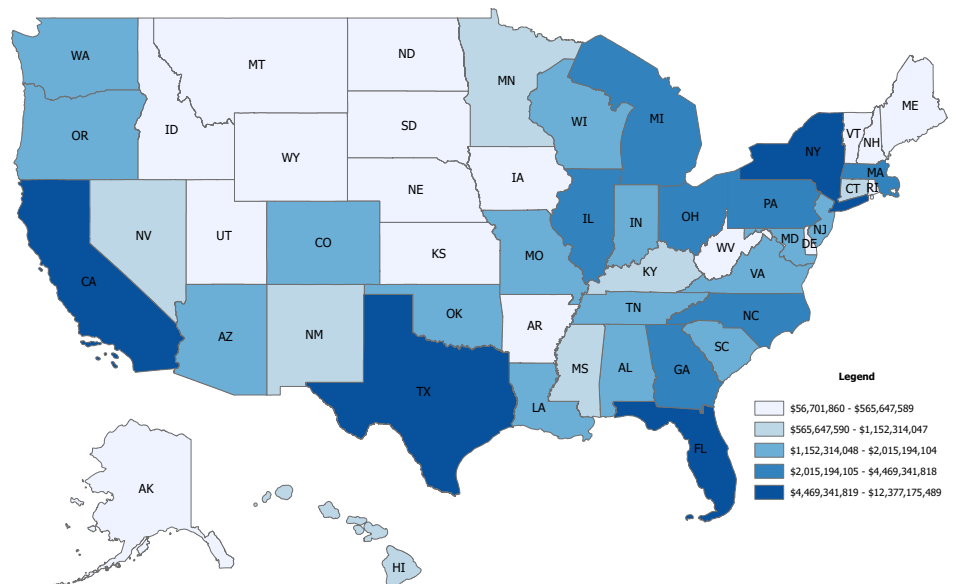

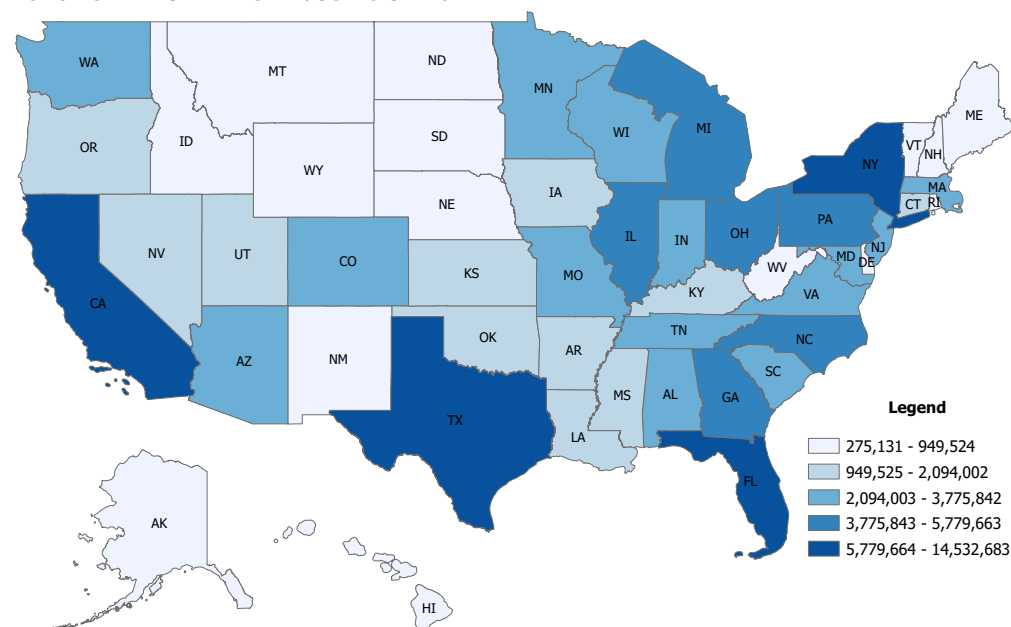

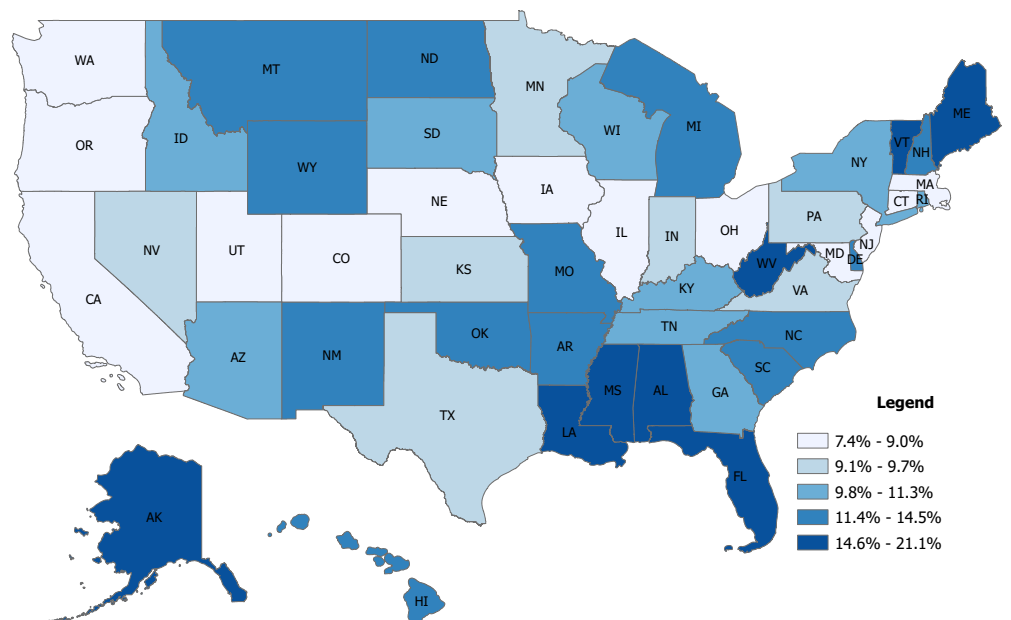

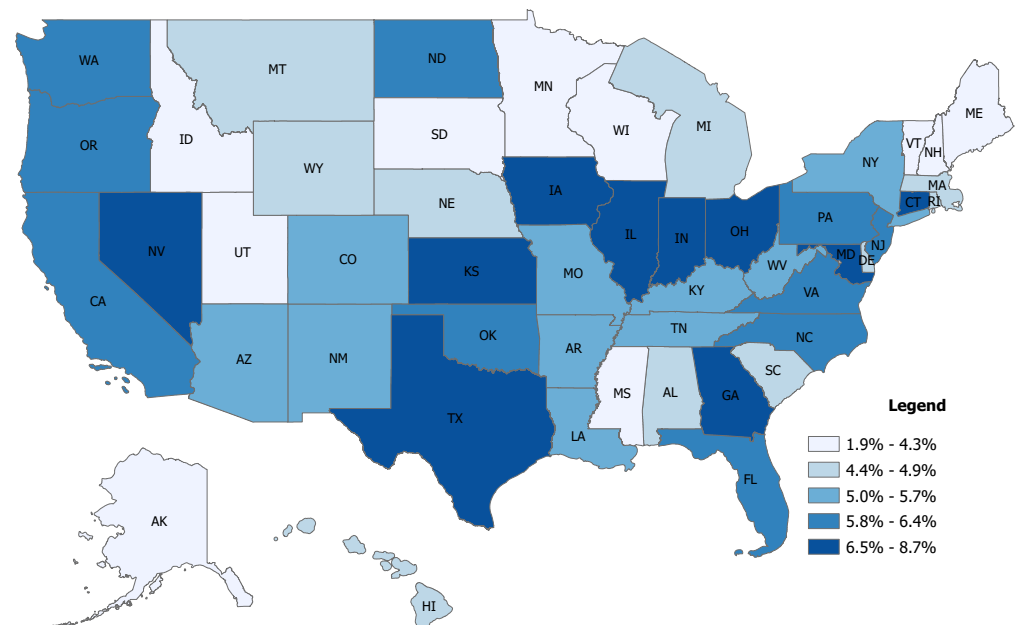

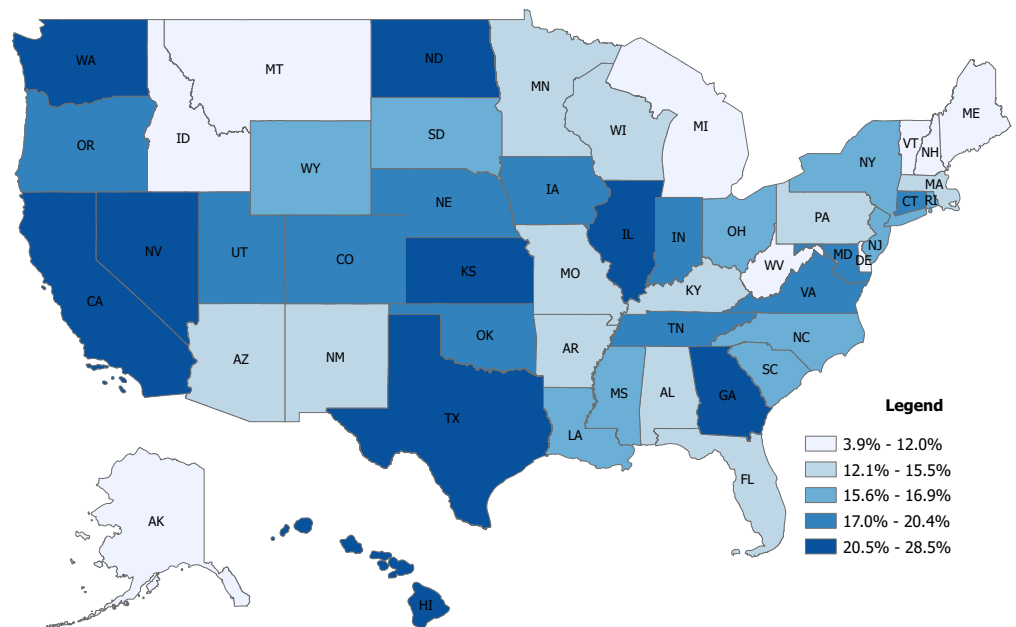

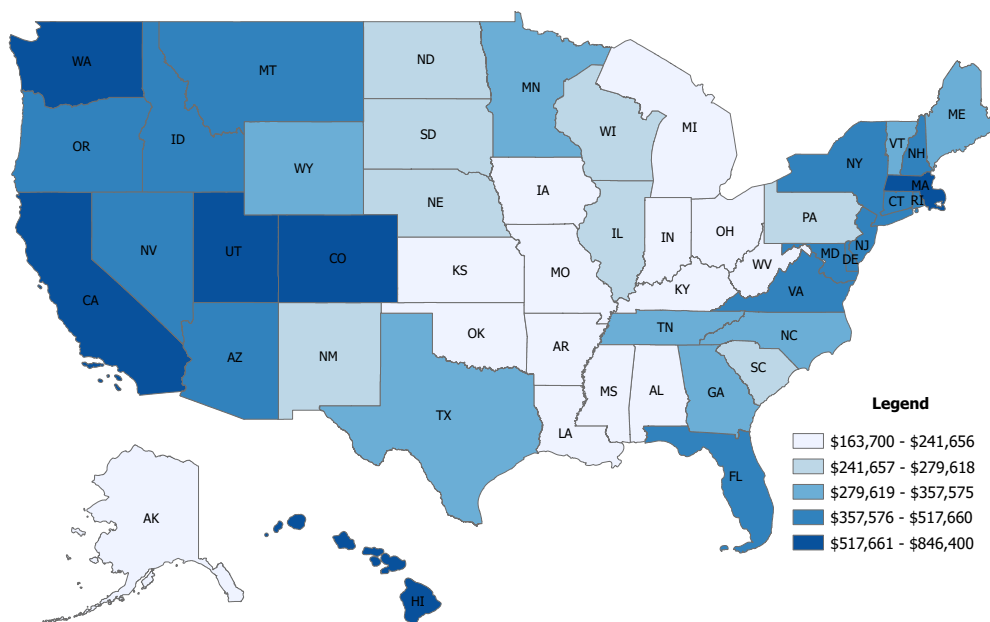

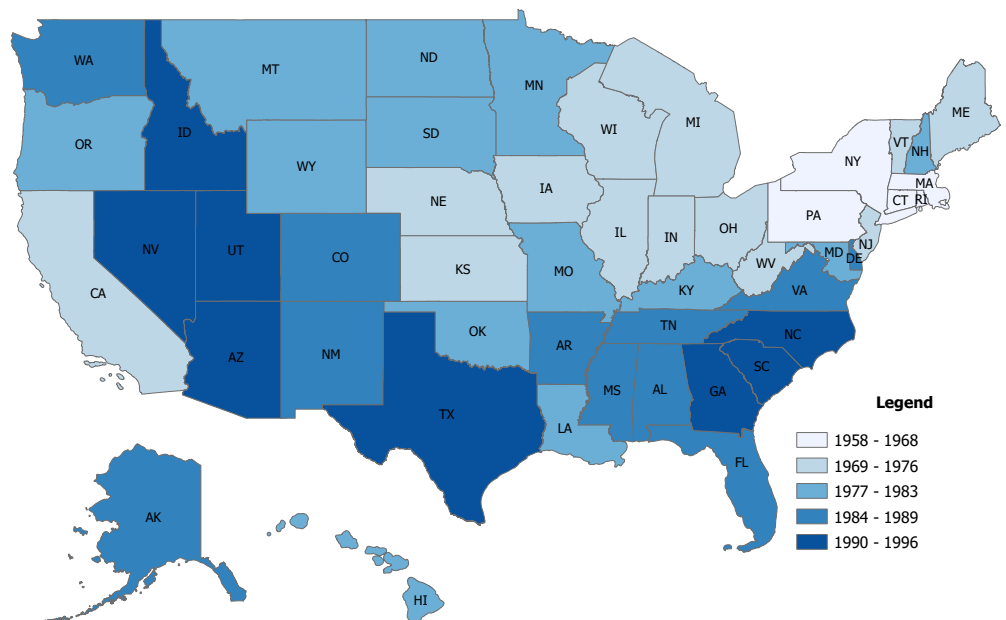

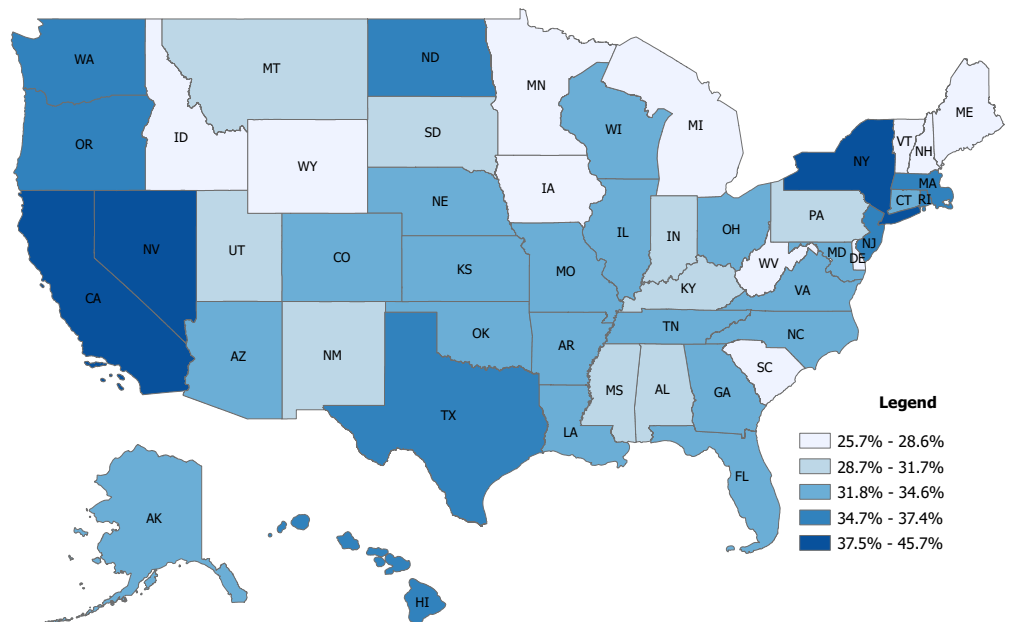

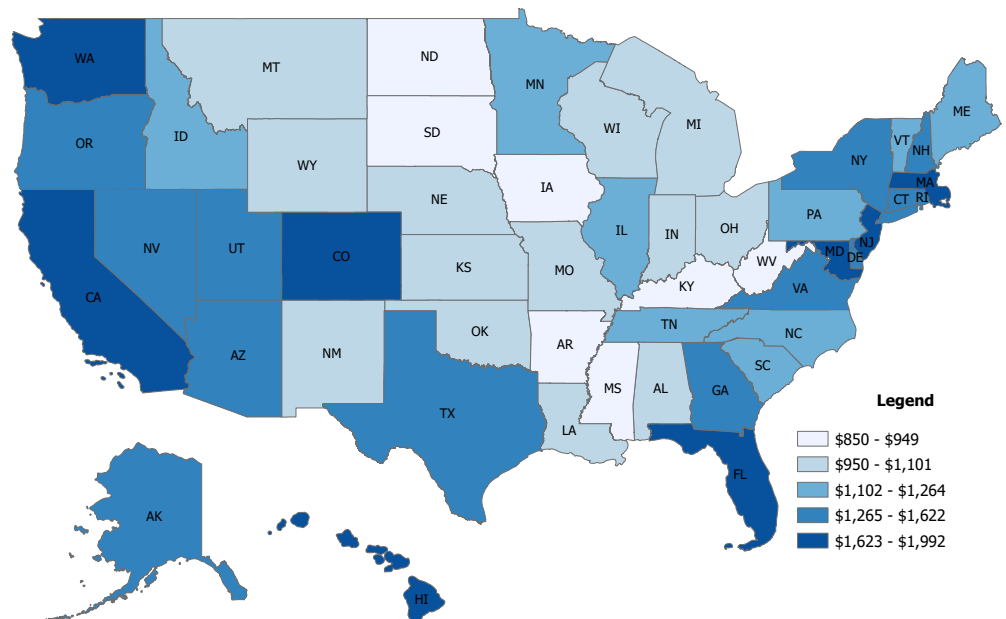

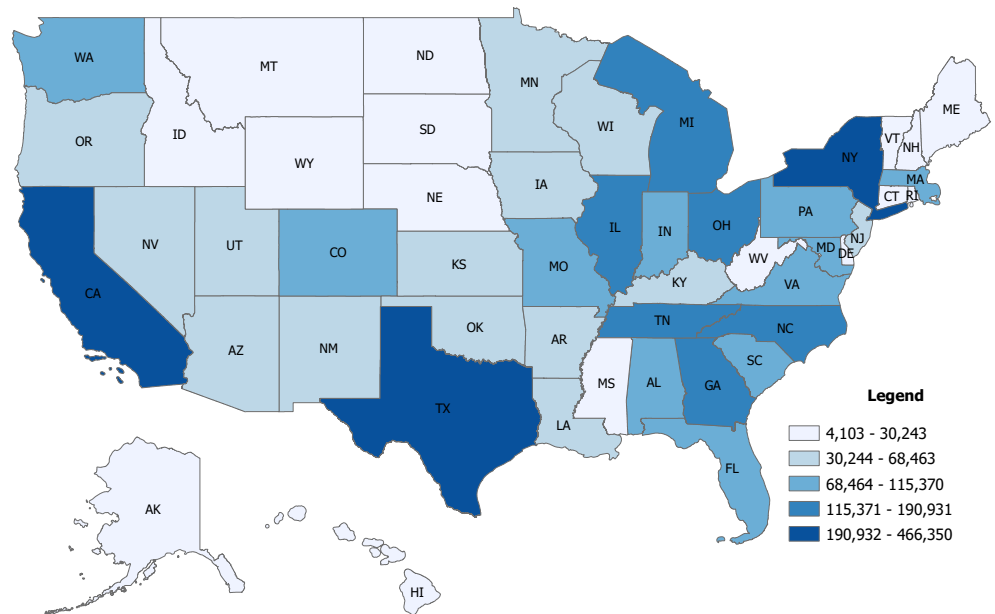

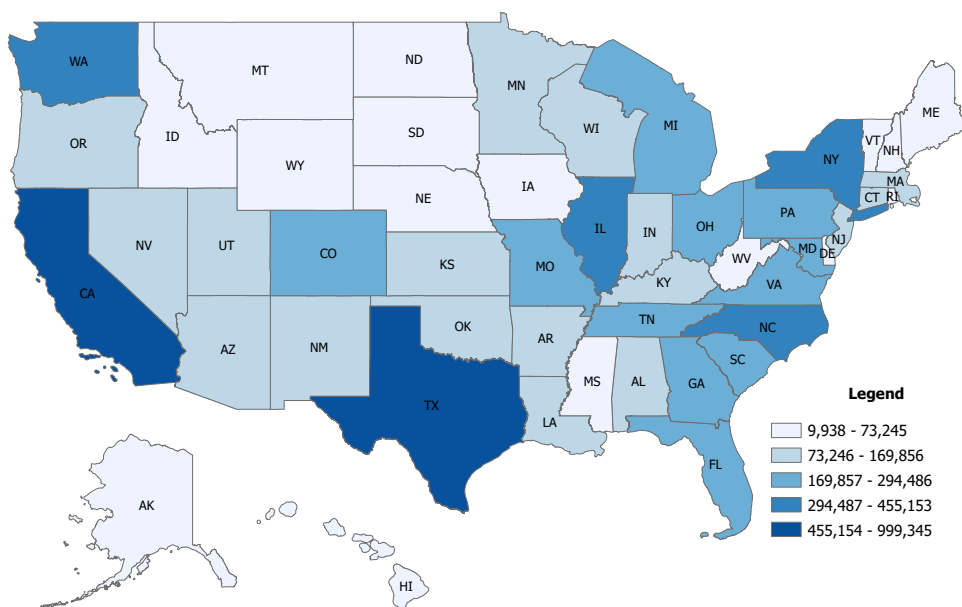

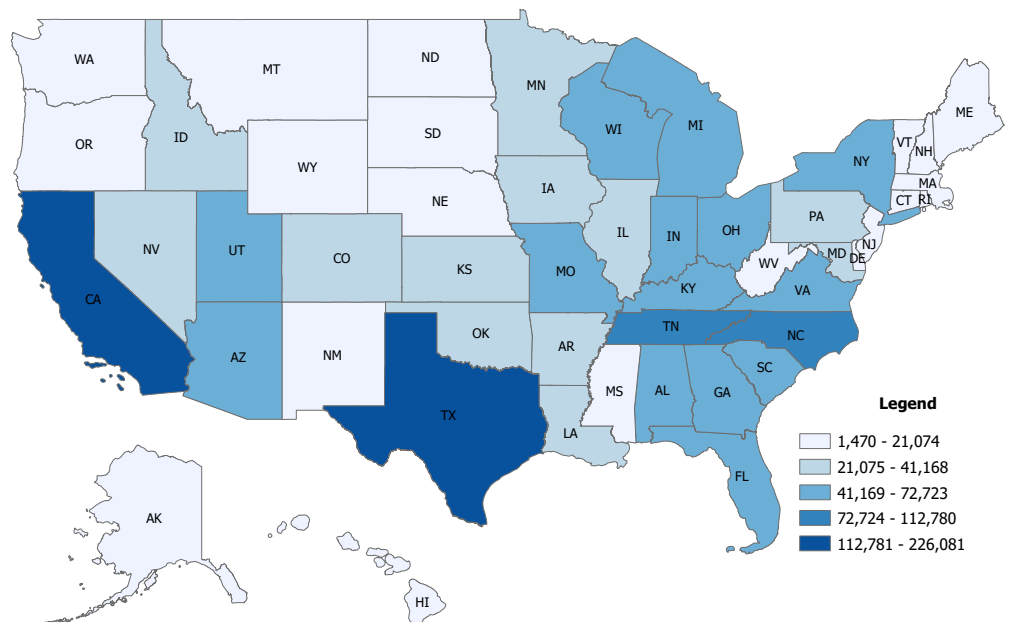

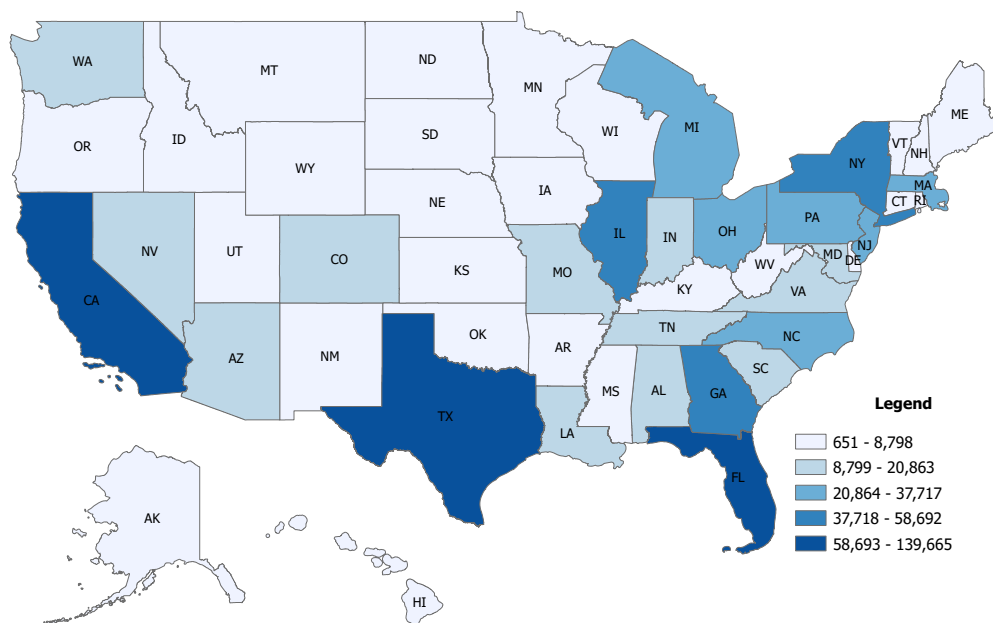

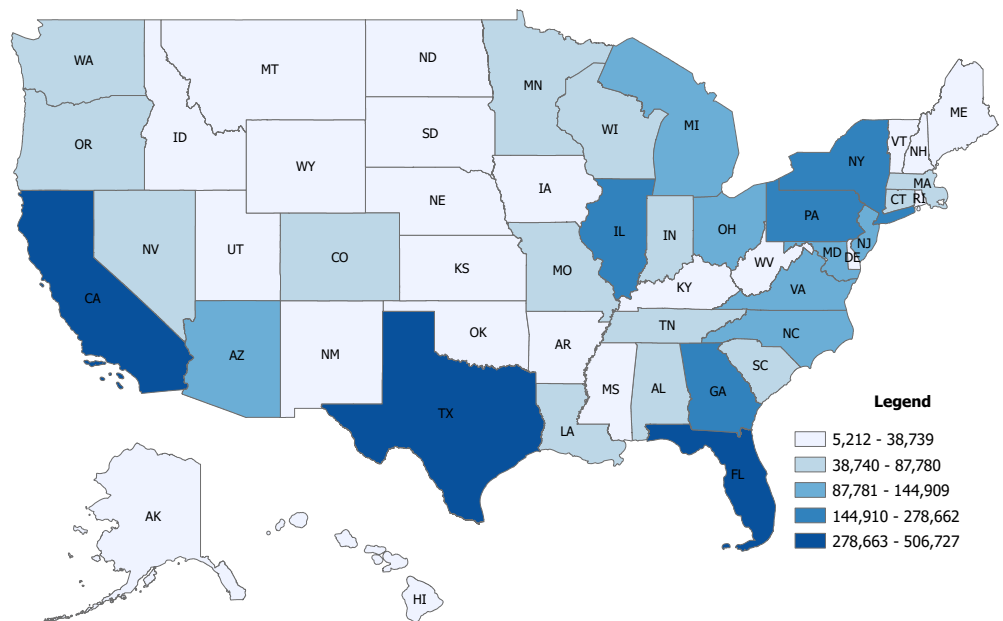

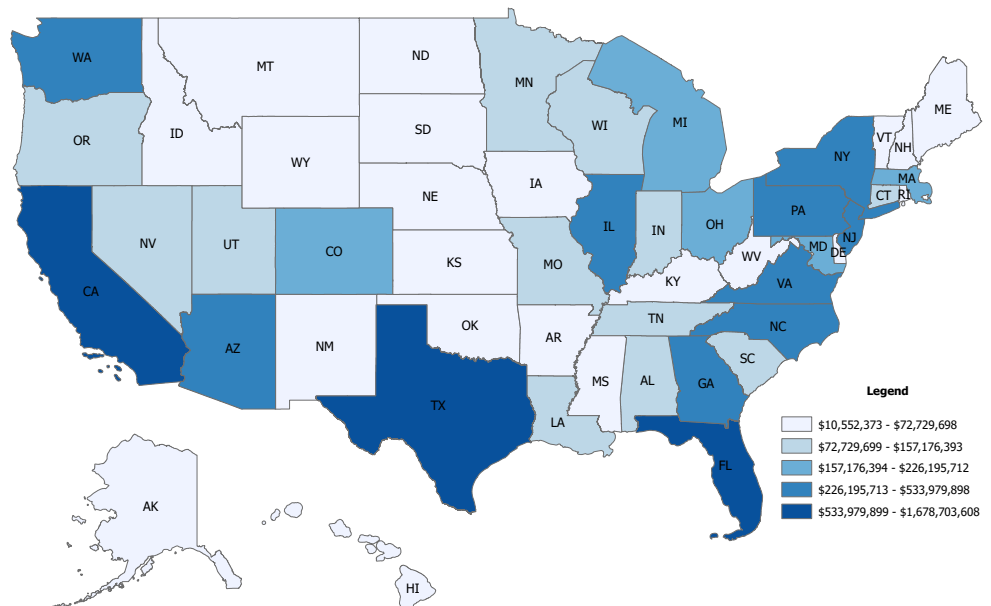

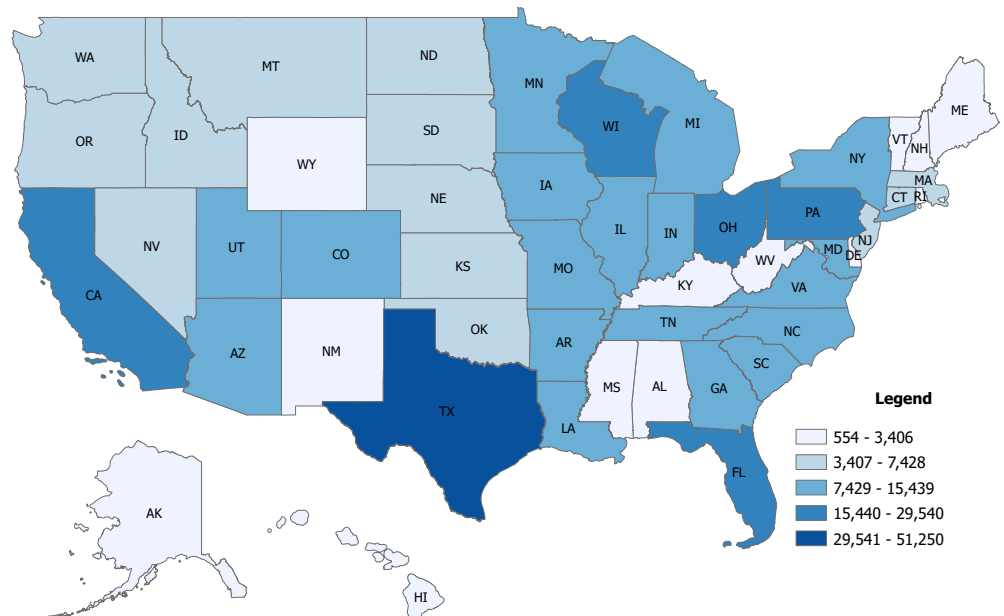

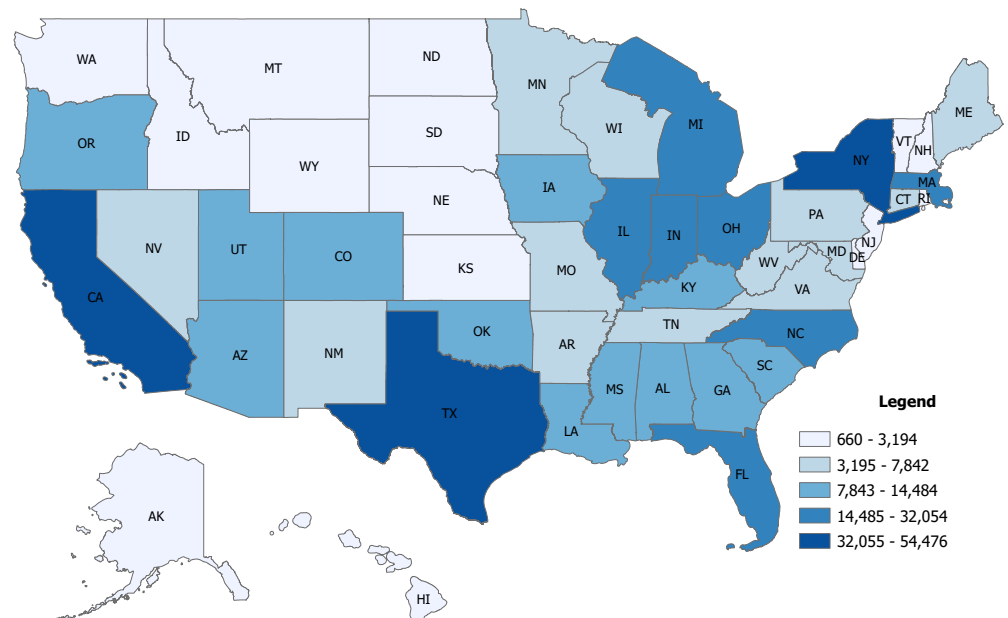

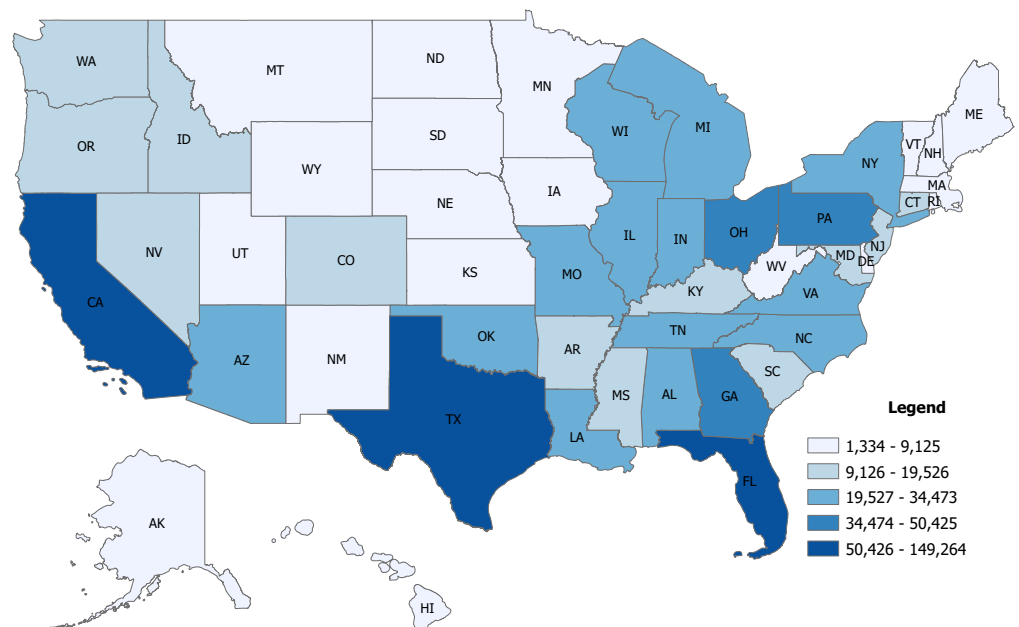

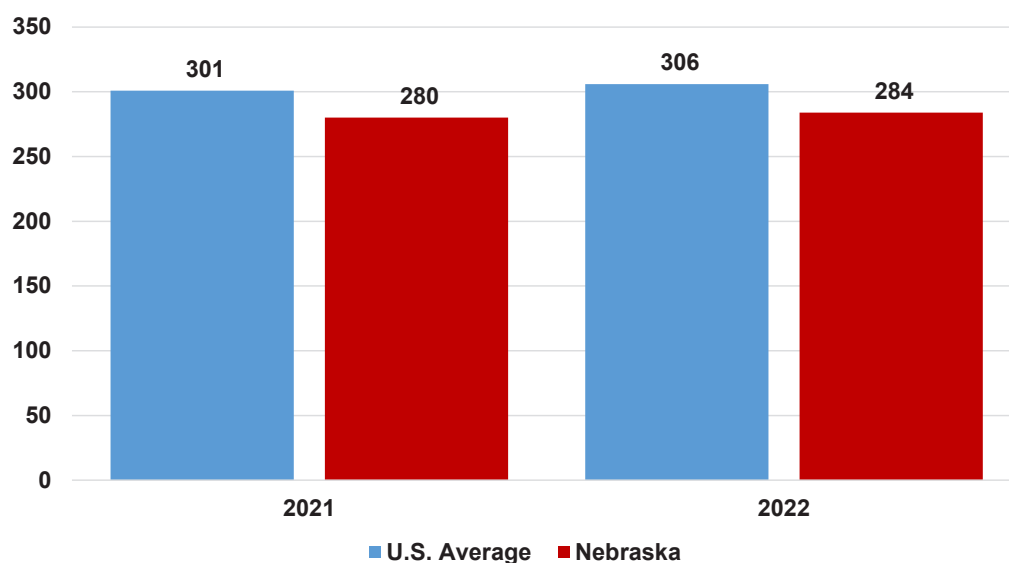

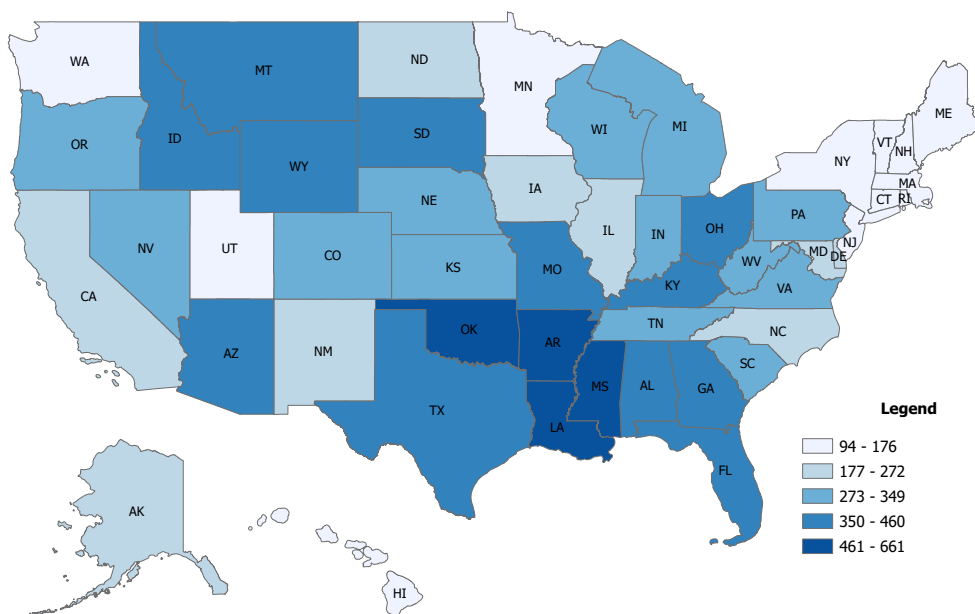

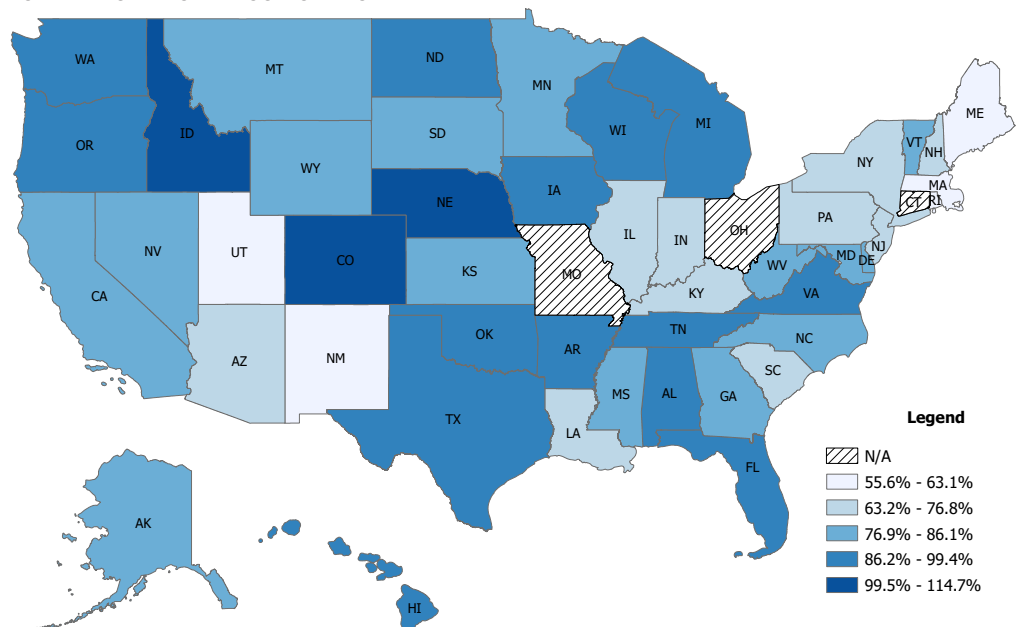

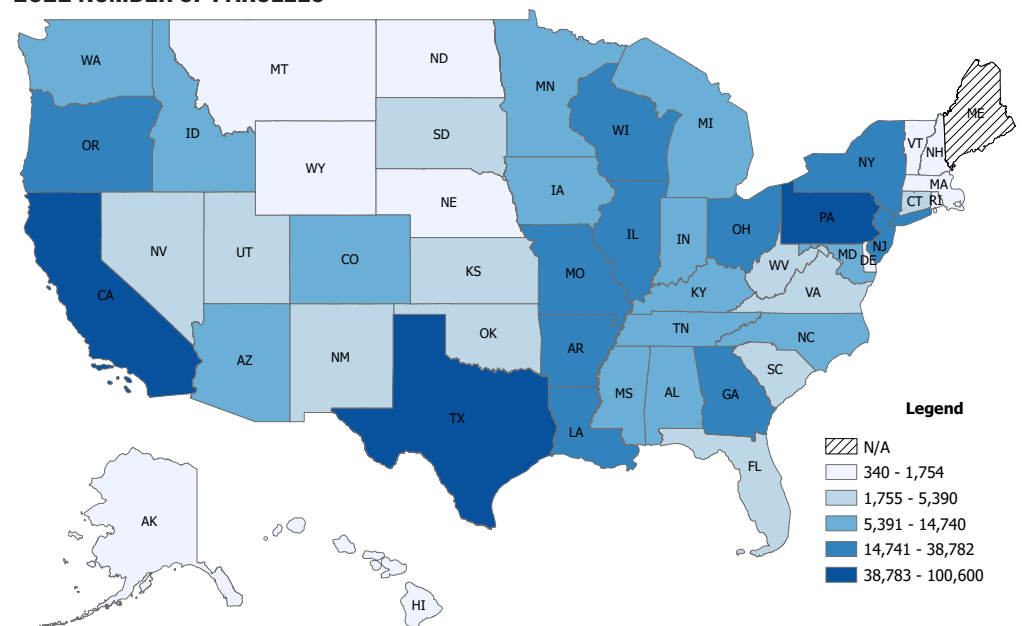

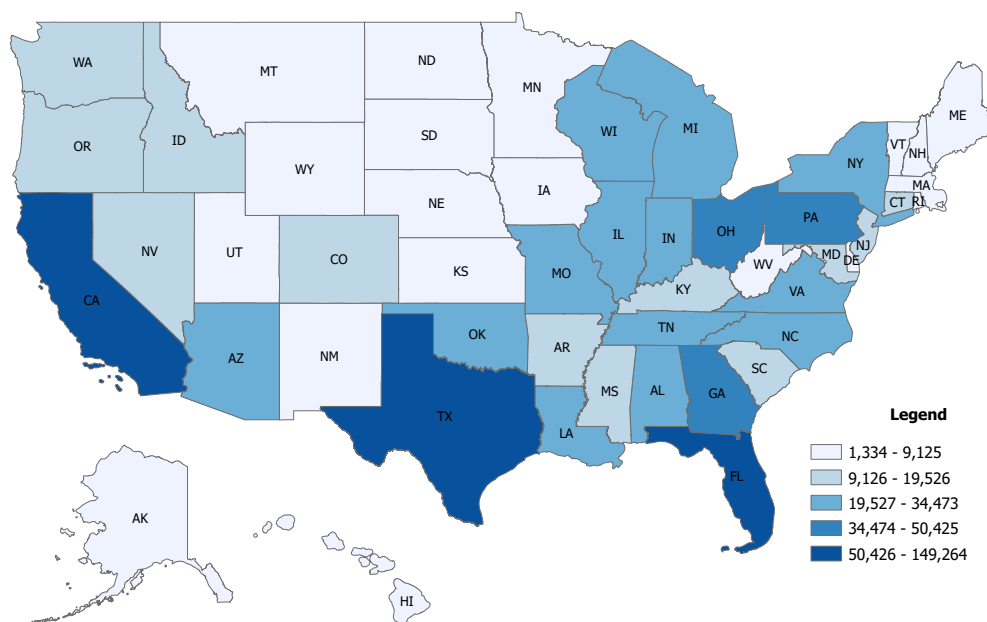

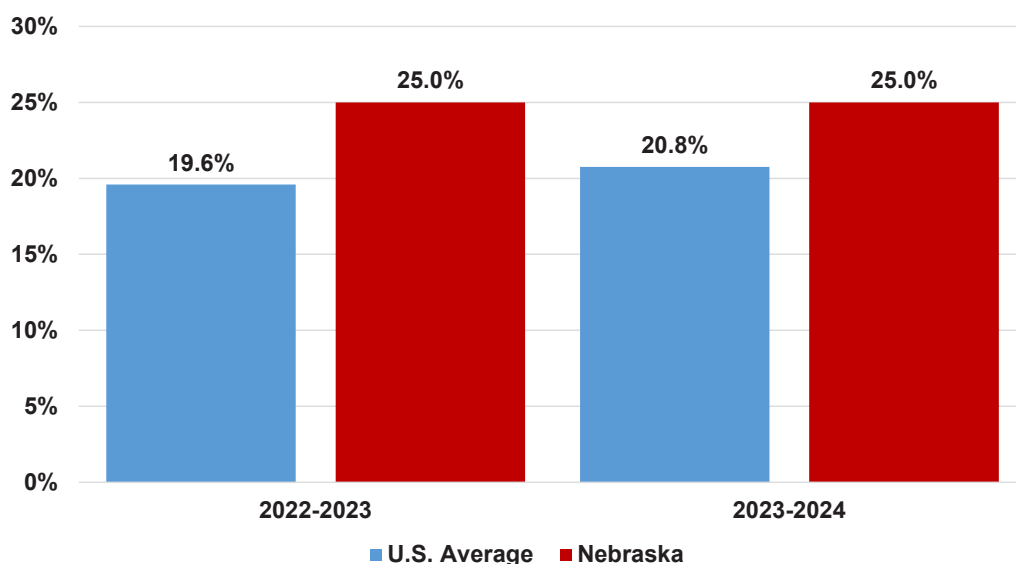

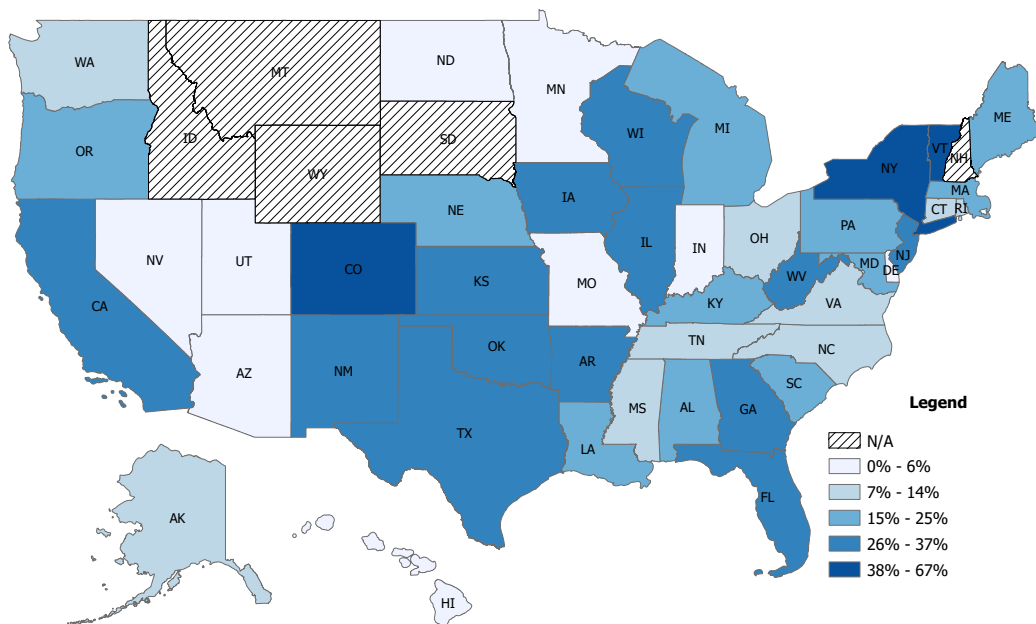

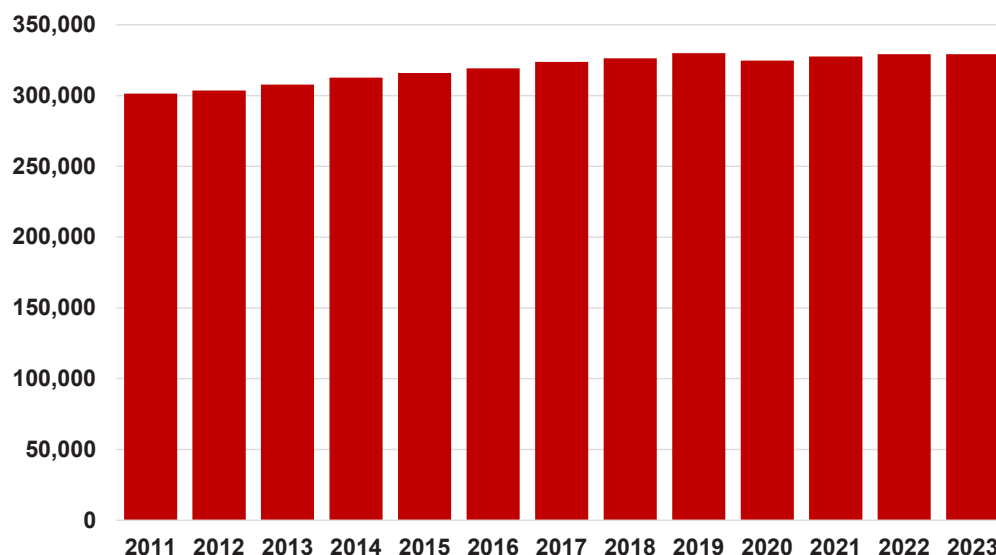

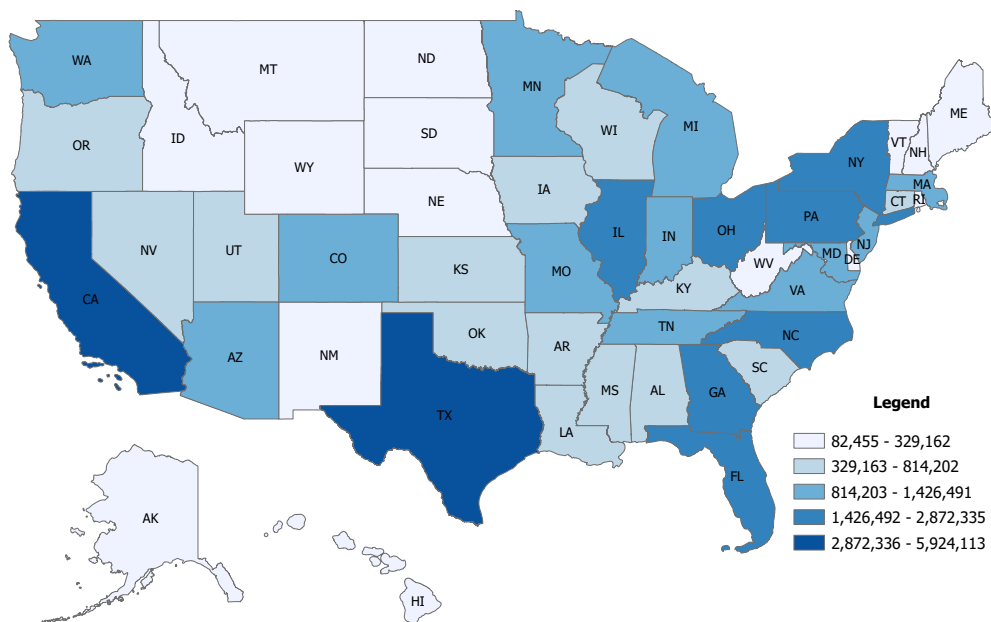

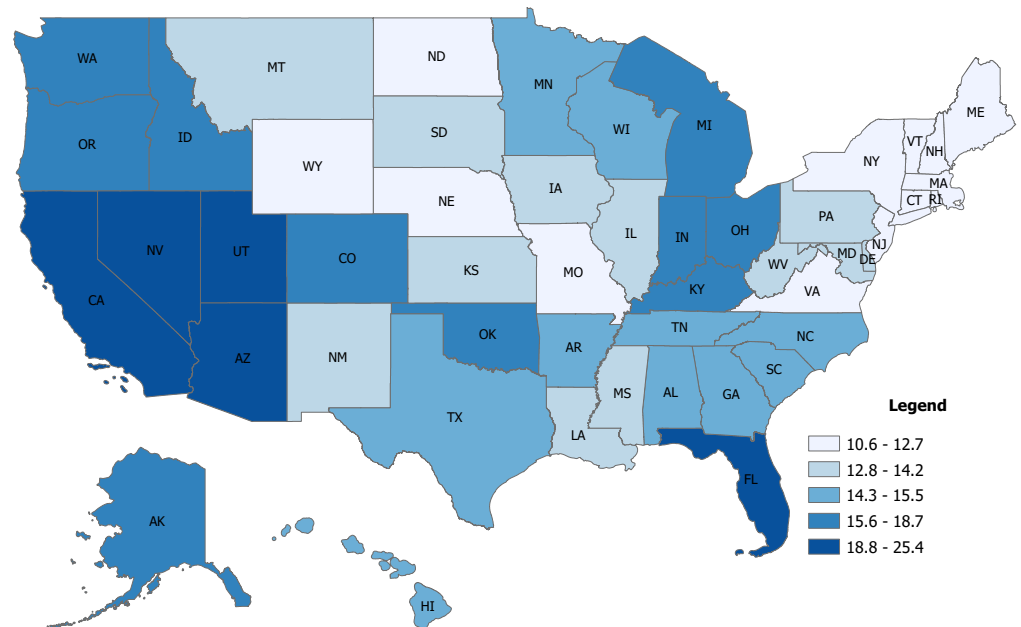

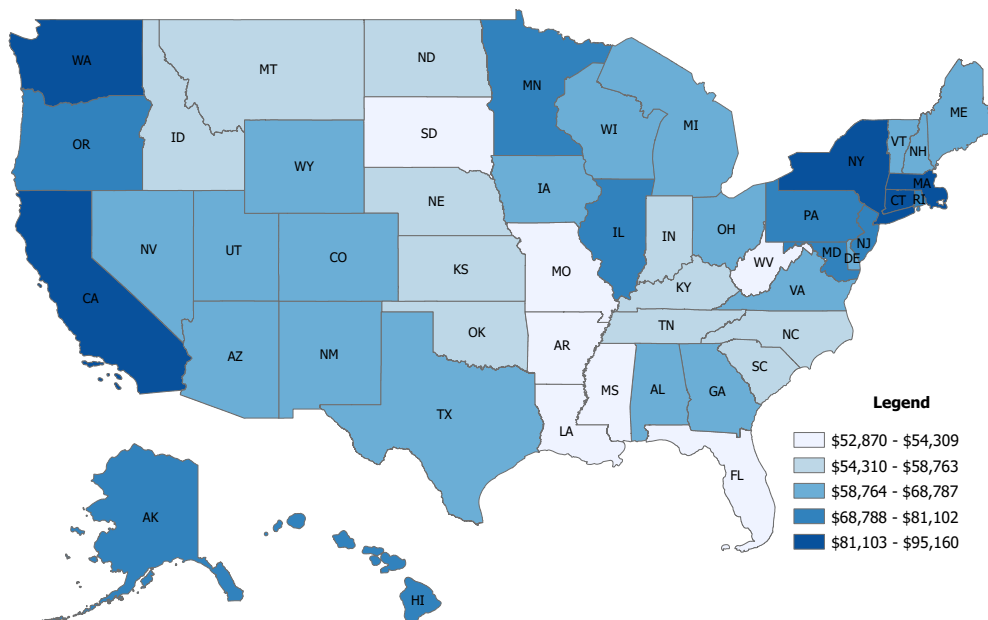

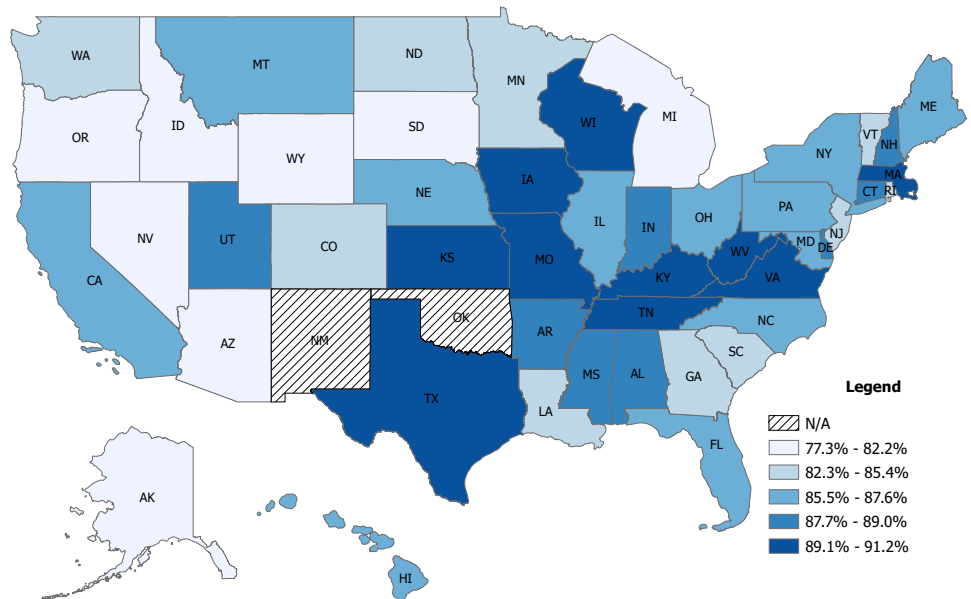

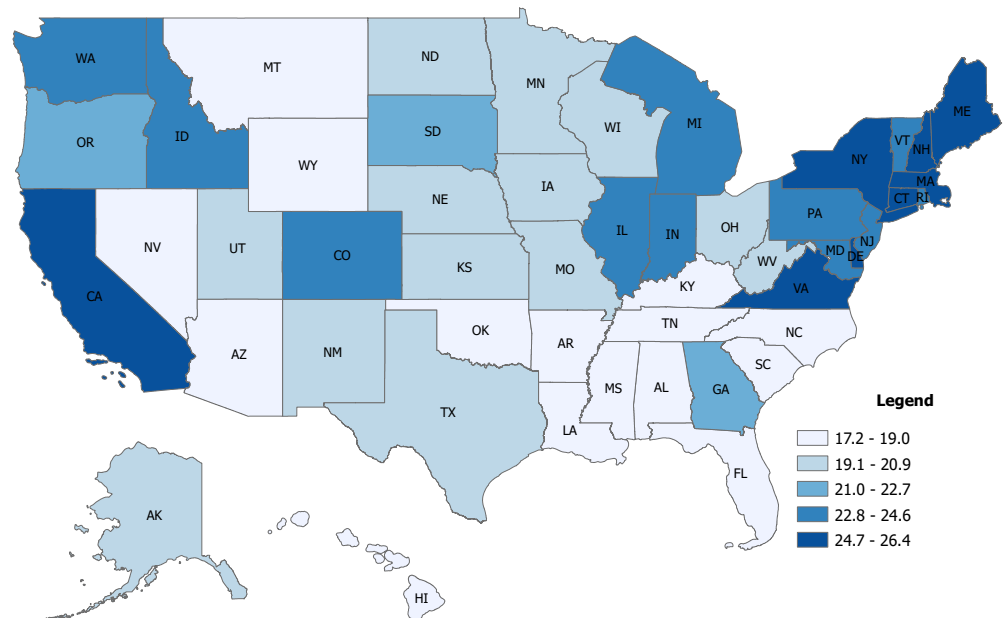

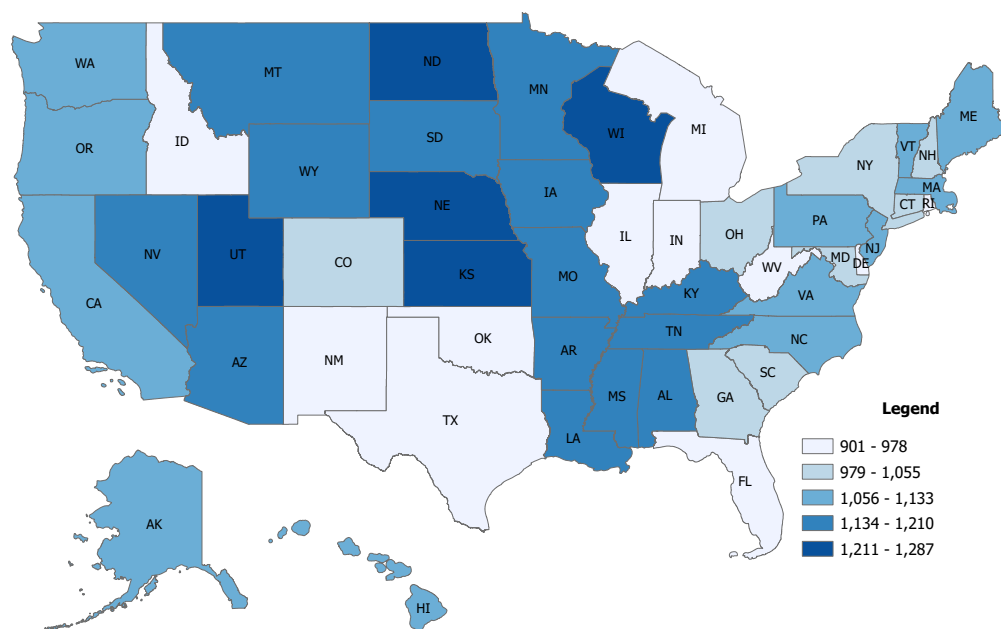

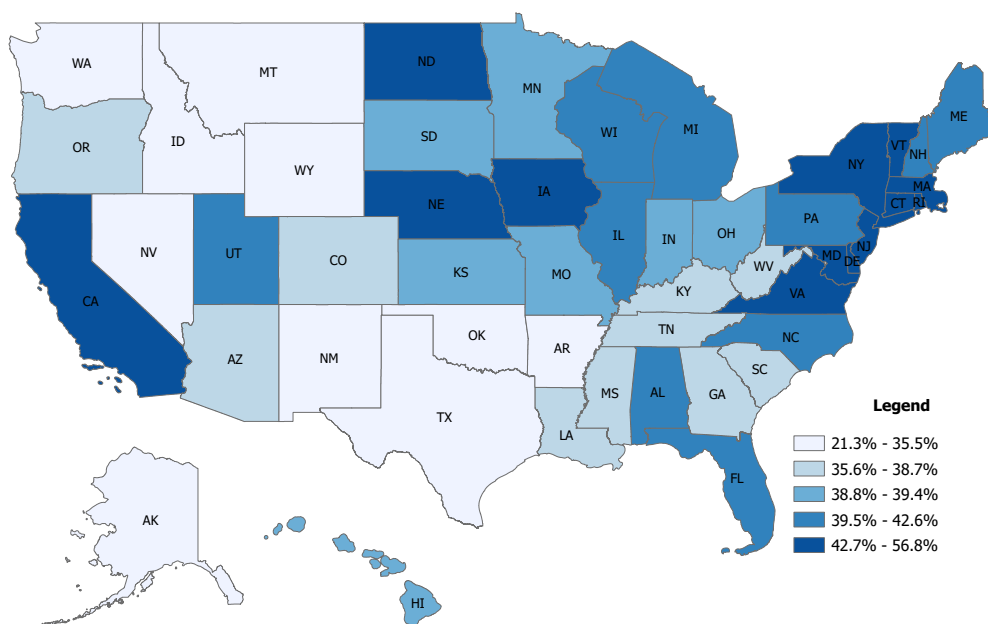

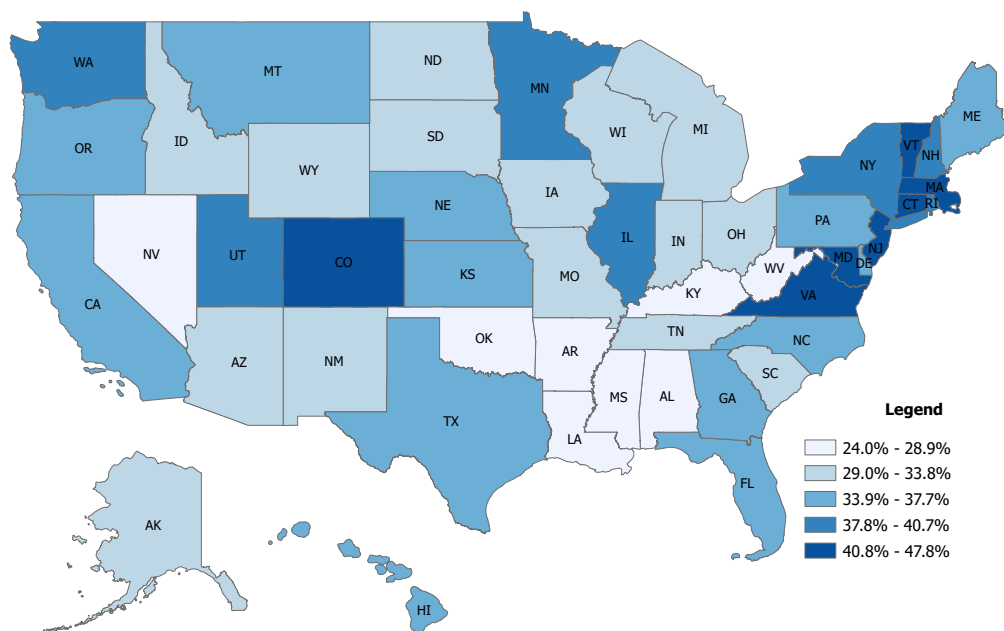

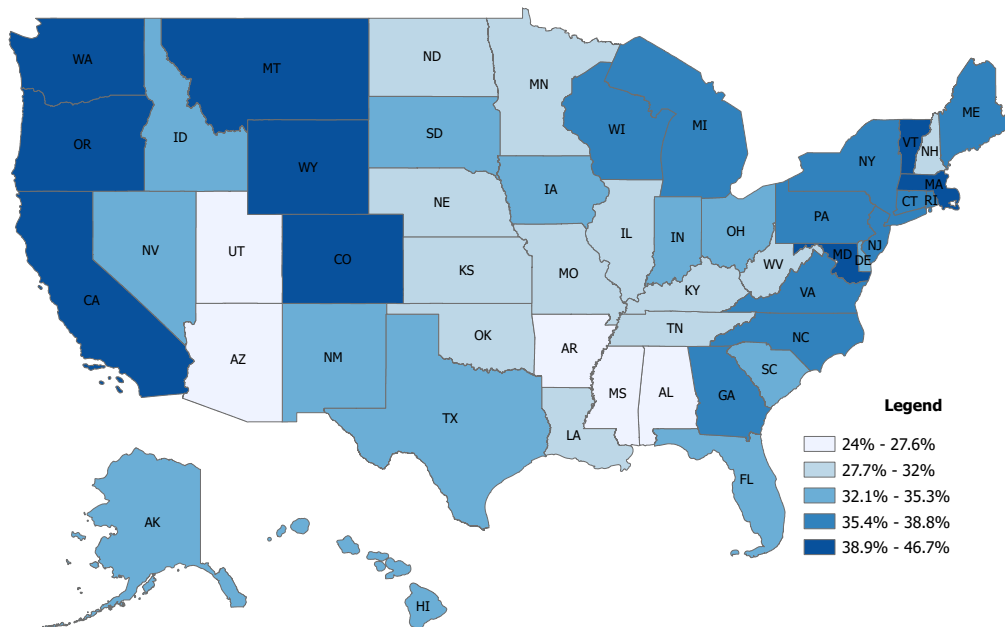

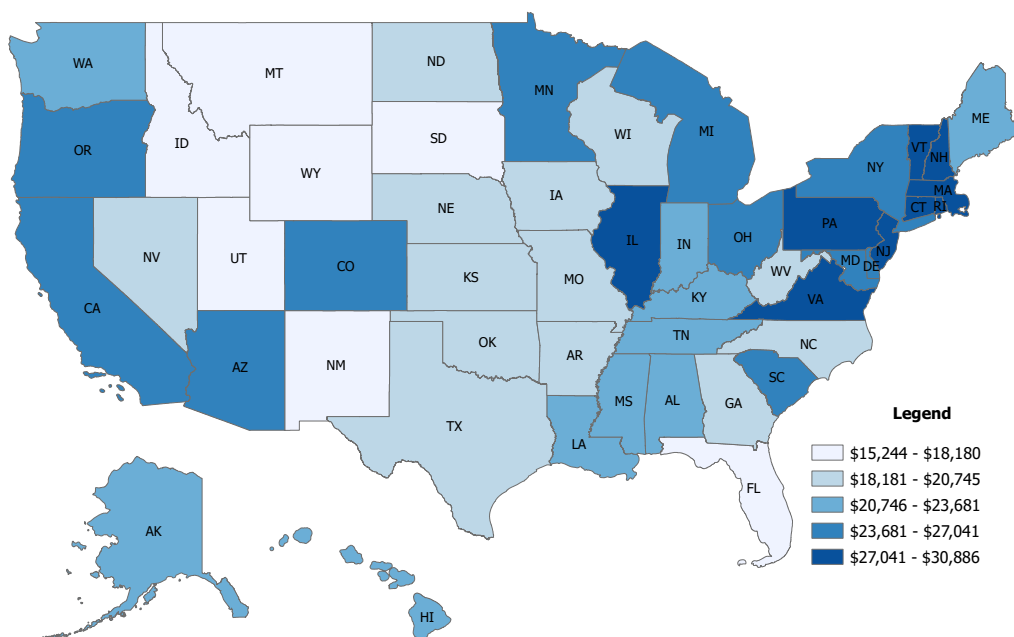

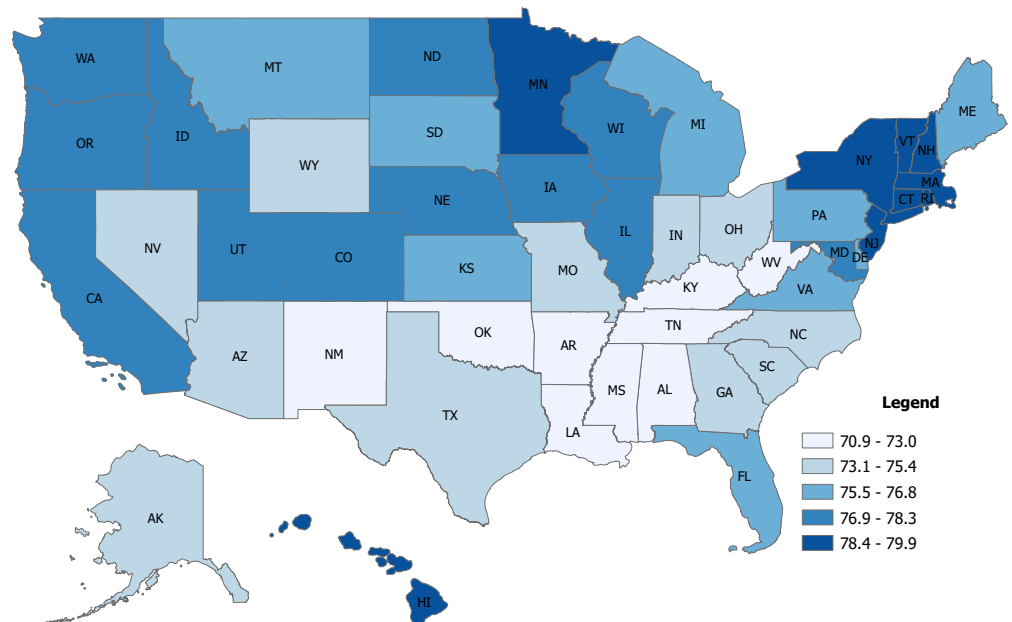

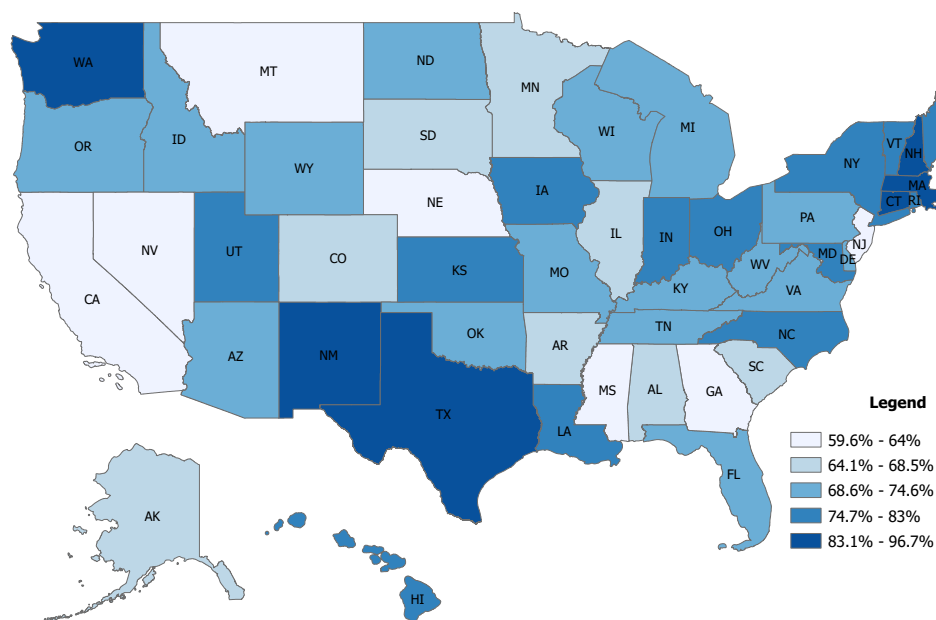

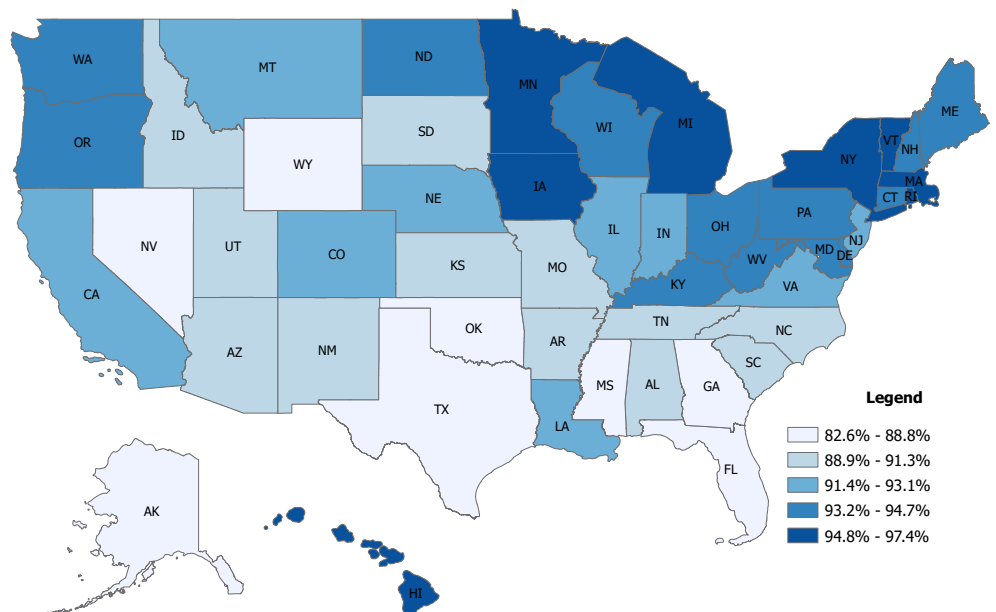

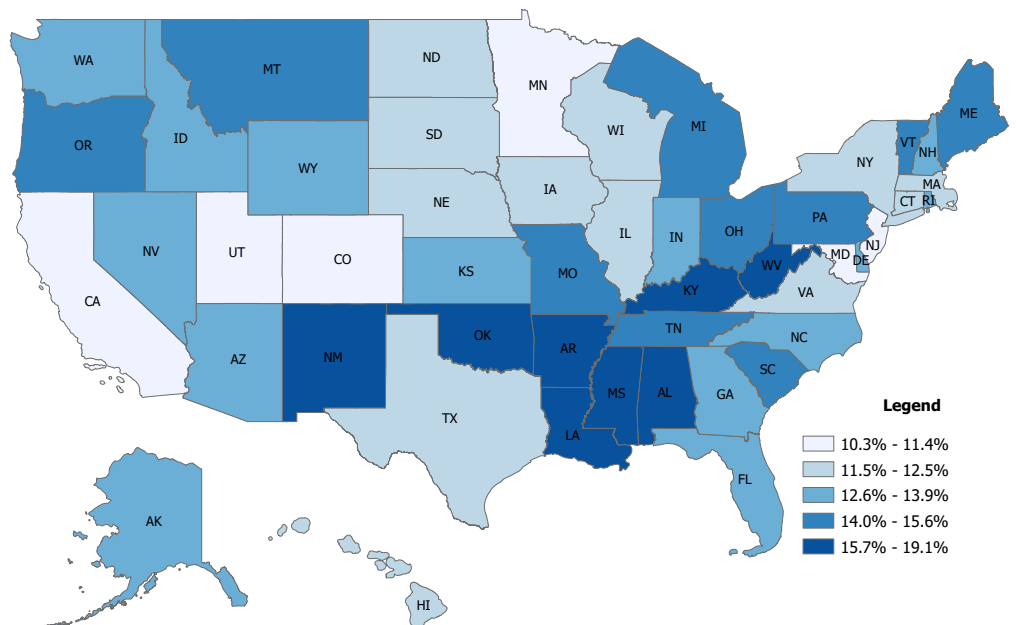
People identified by the ACS as having a disability report difficulty with specific functions, and in the absence of accommodation, may have a disability. This definition is different from the one described by the IOM conceptual framework, but it relates to the programmatic definitions used in most Federal and state legislation.

The population with a disability in Nebraska increased from 2018 (11.5%) to 2023 (12.1%), but the state's rank remained the same.

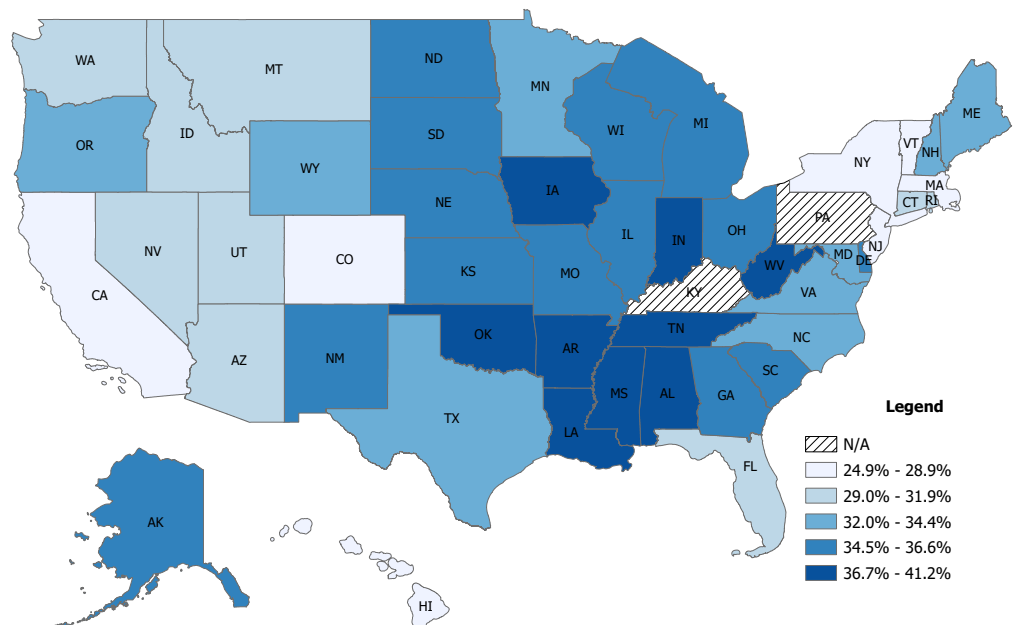

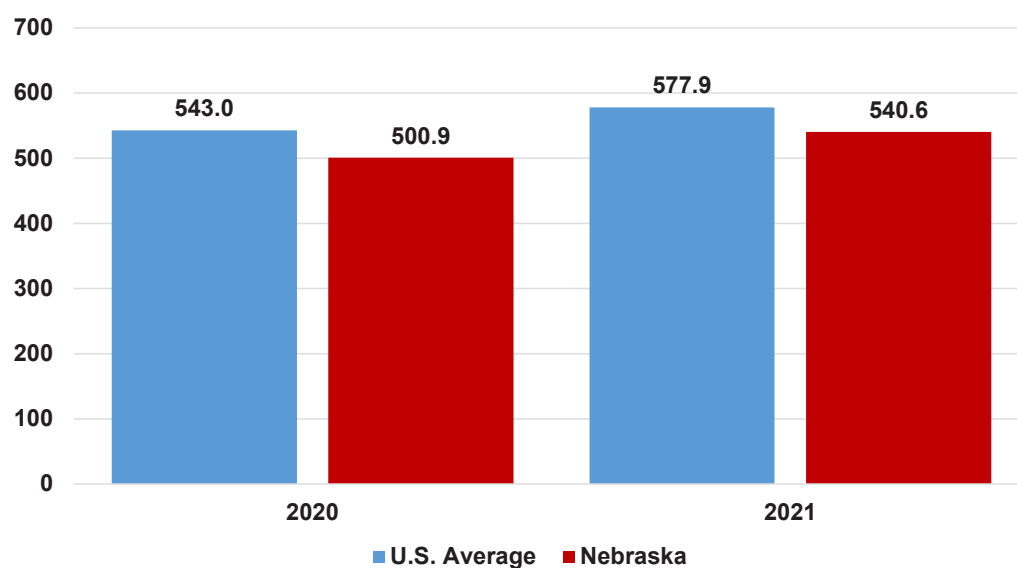

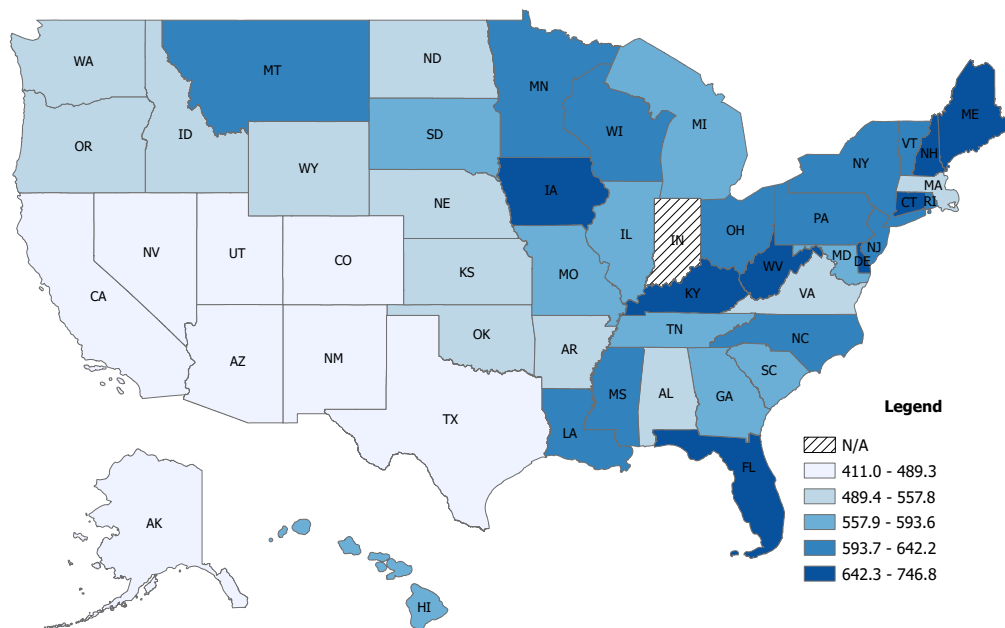

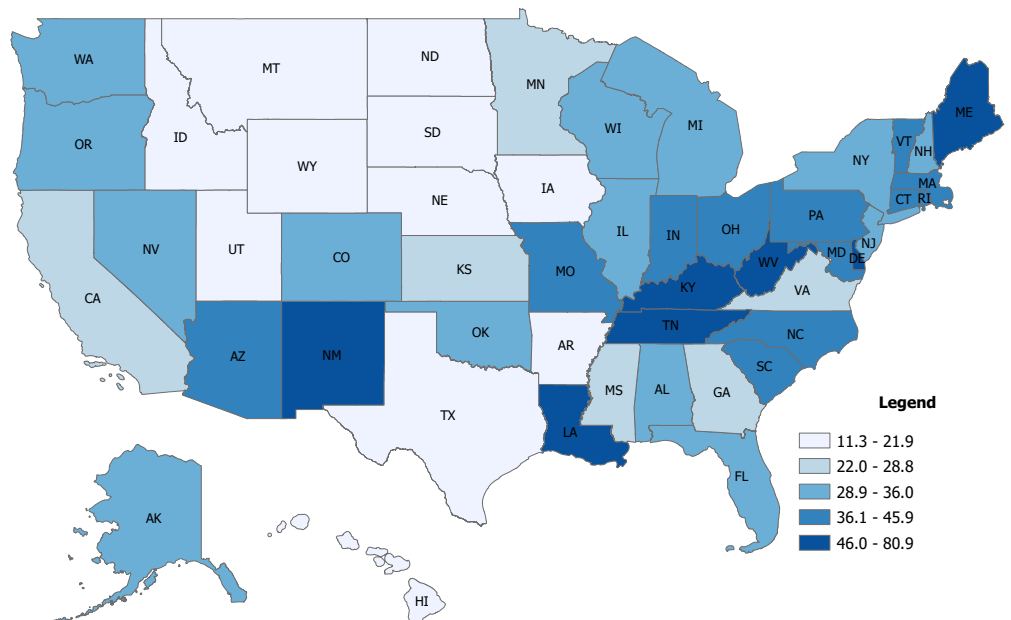

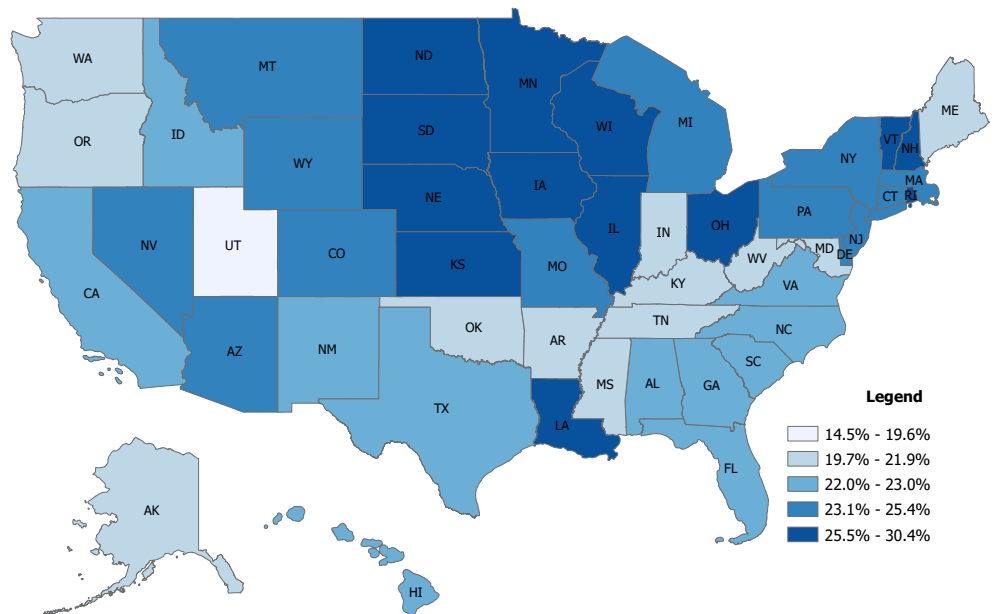

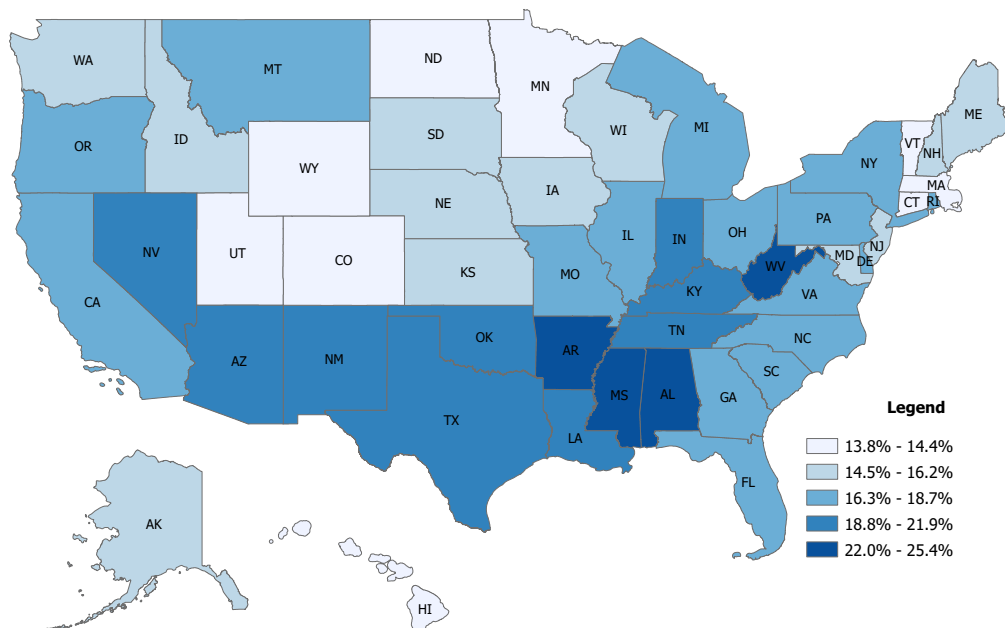

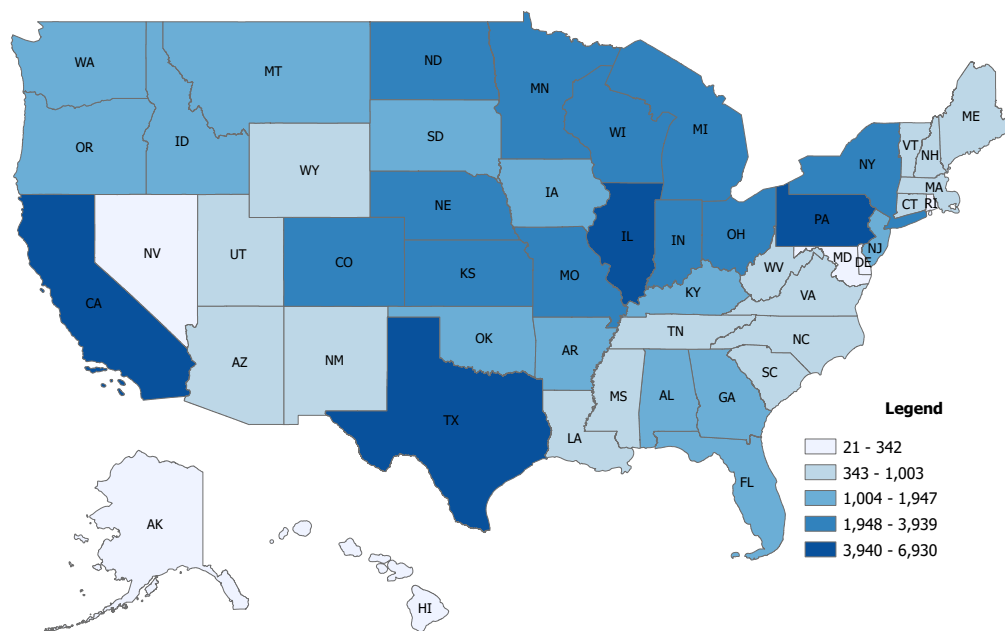

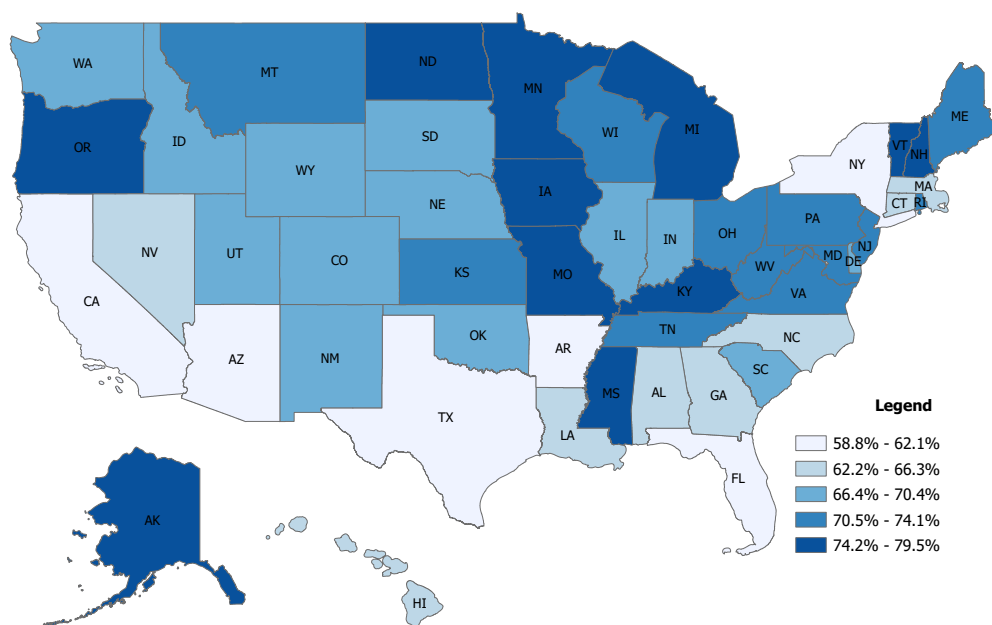

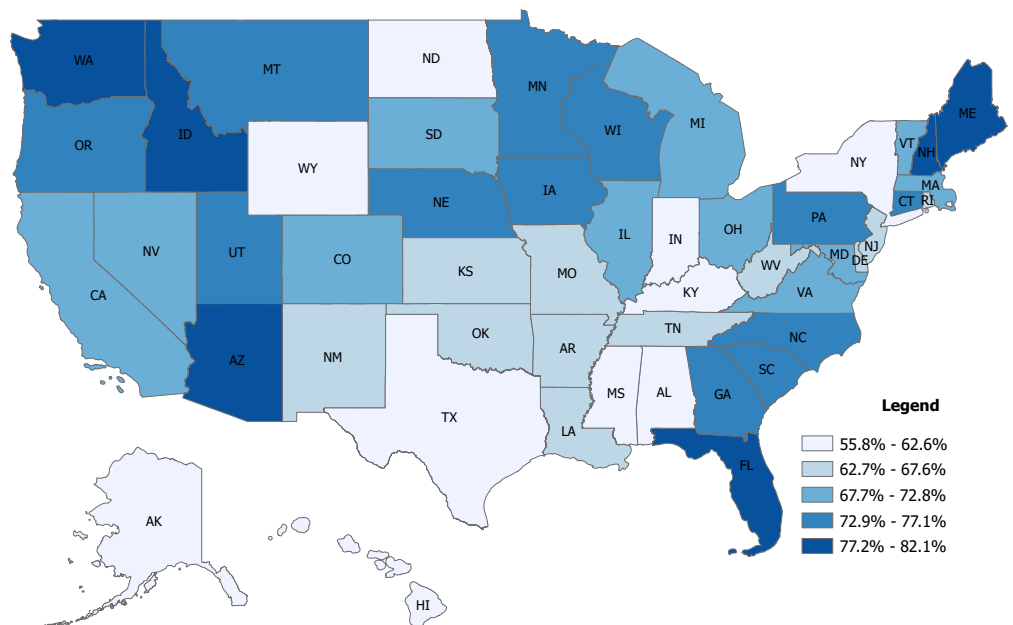

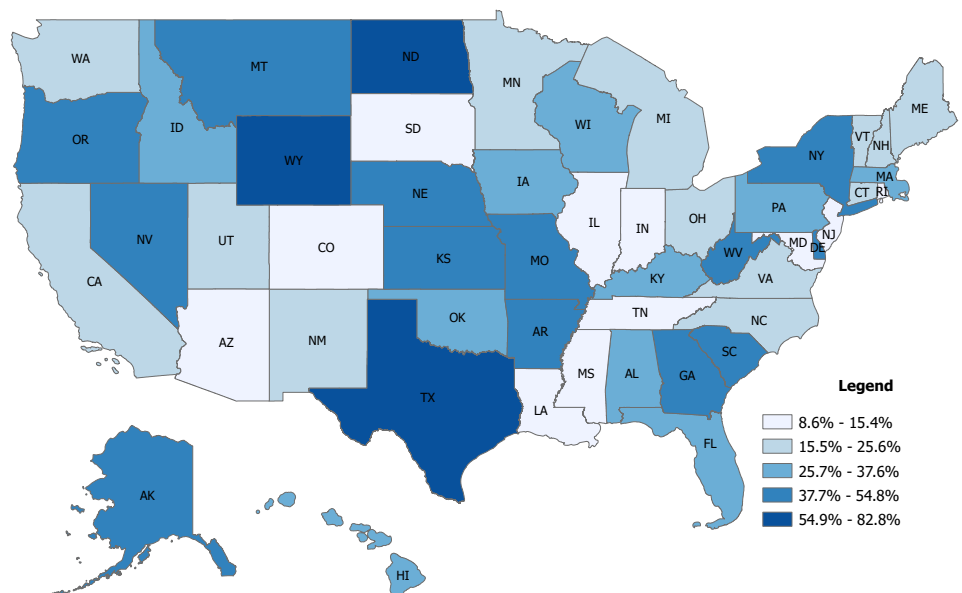

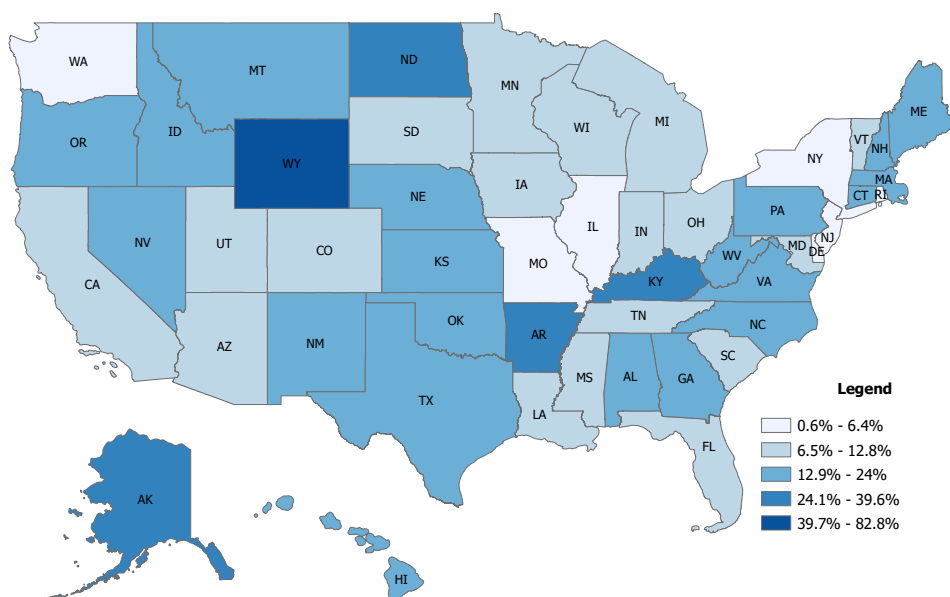

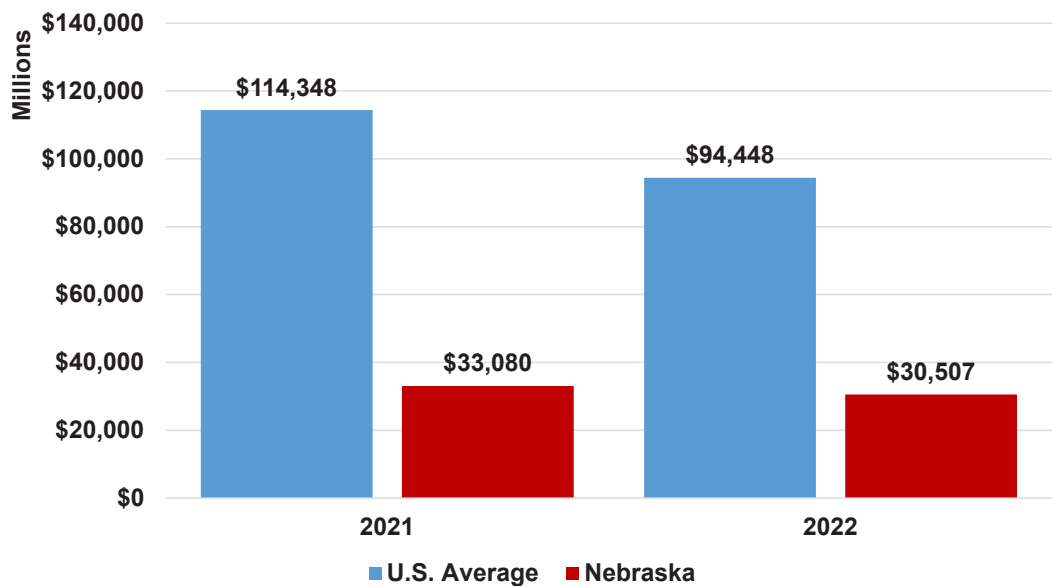

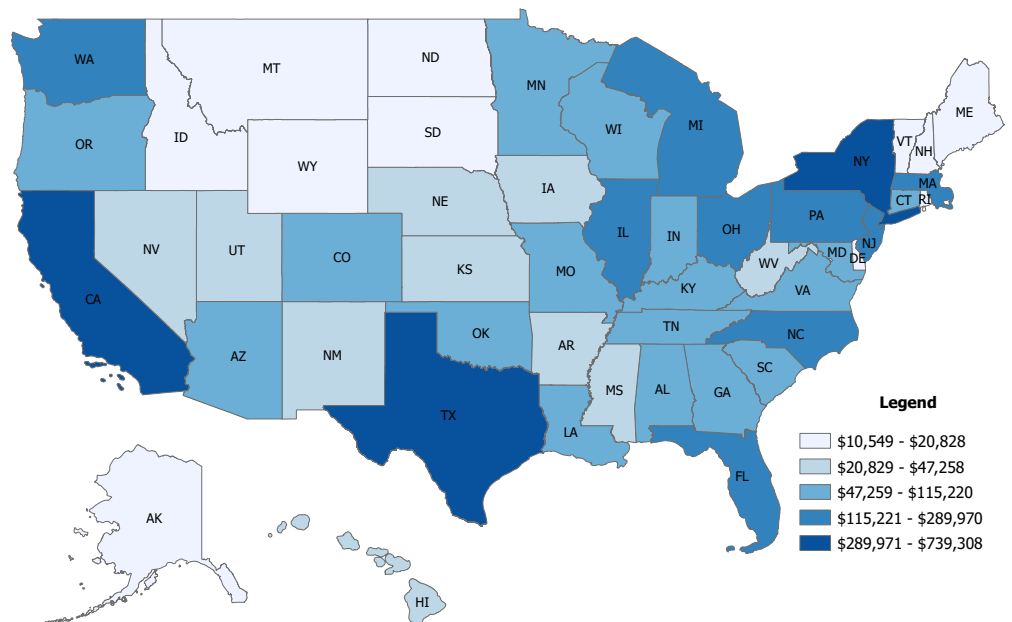

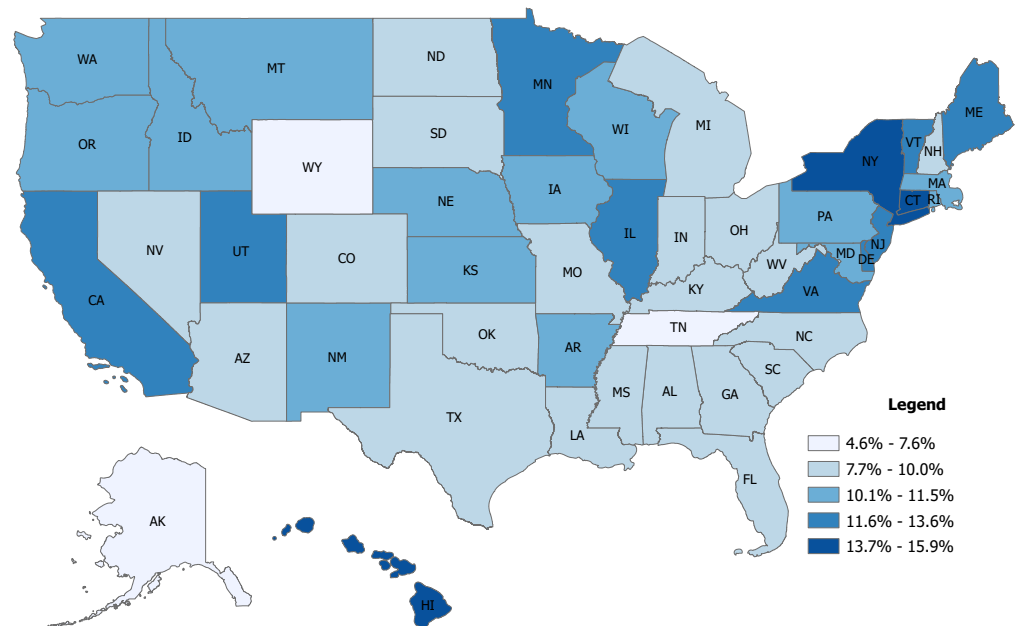

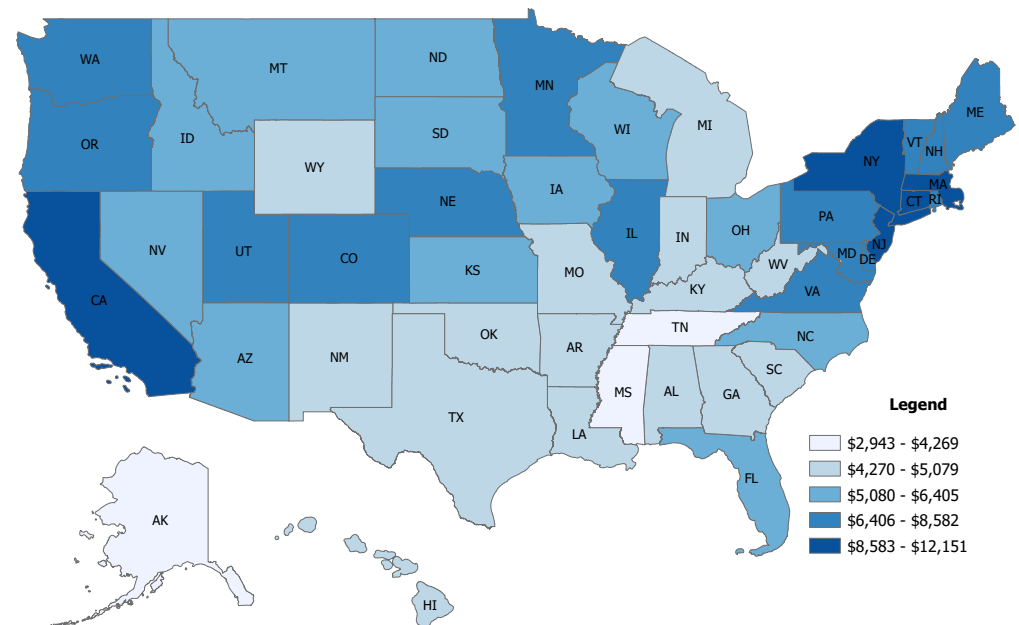

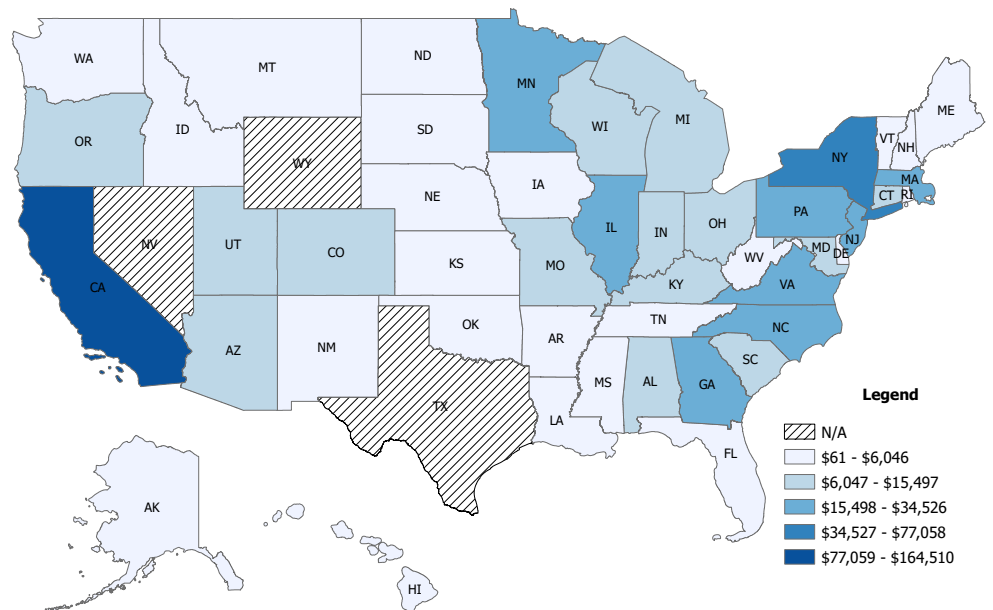

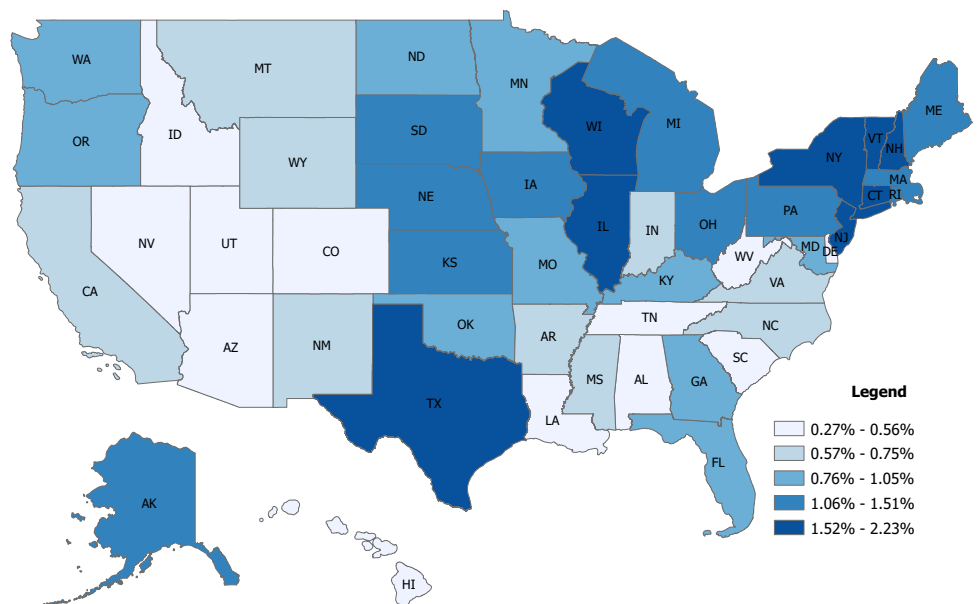

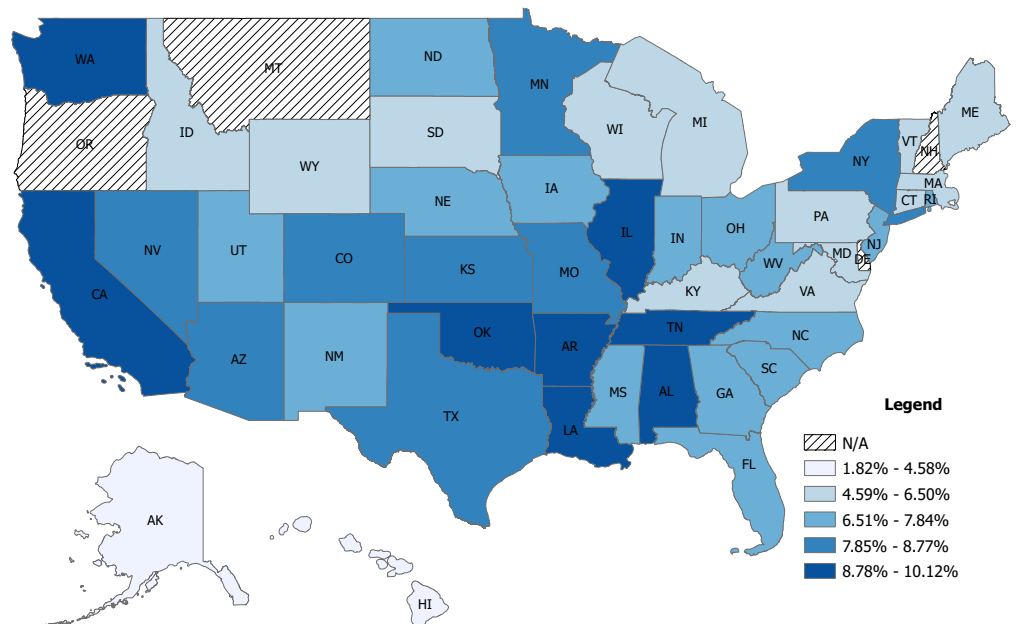

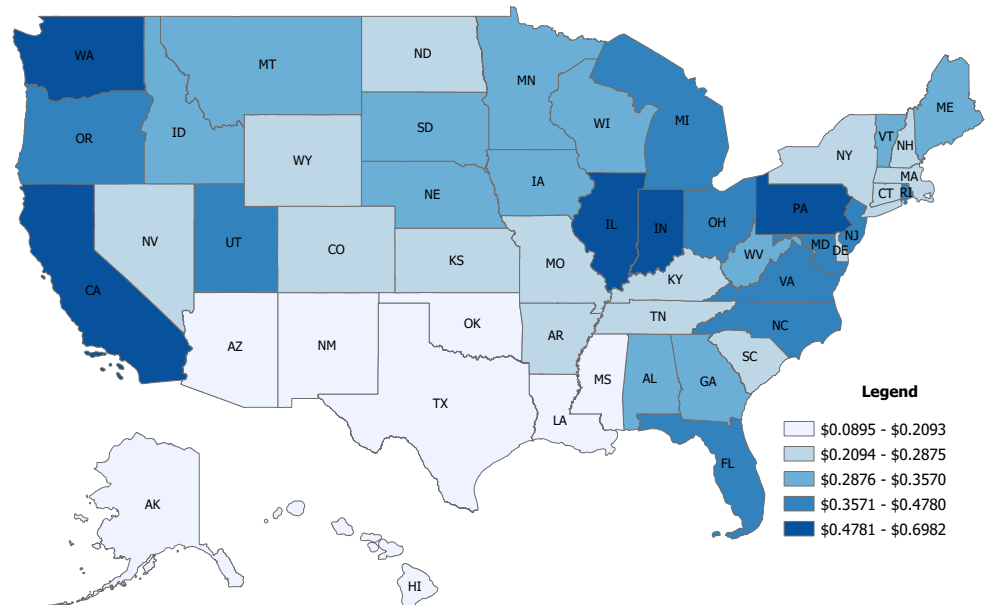

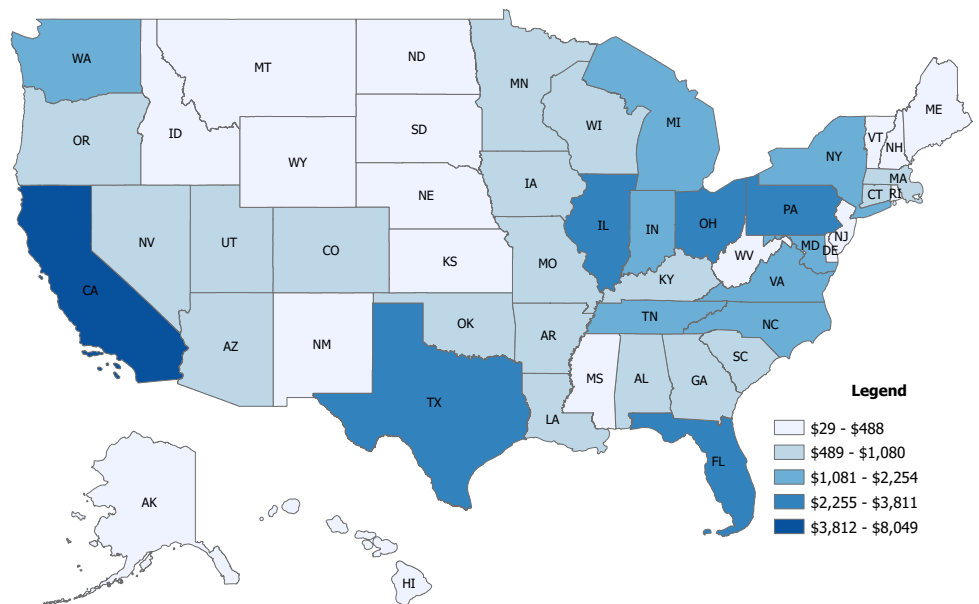

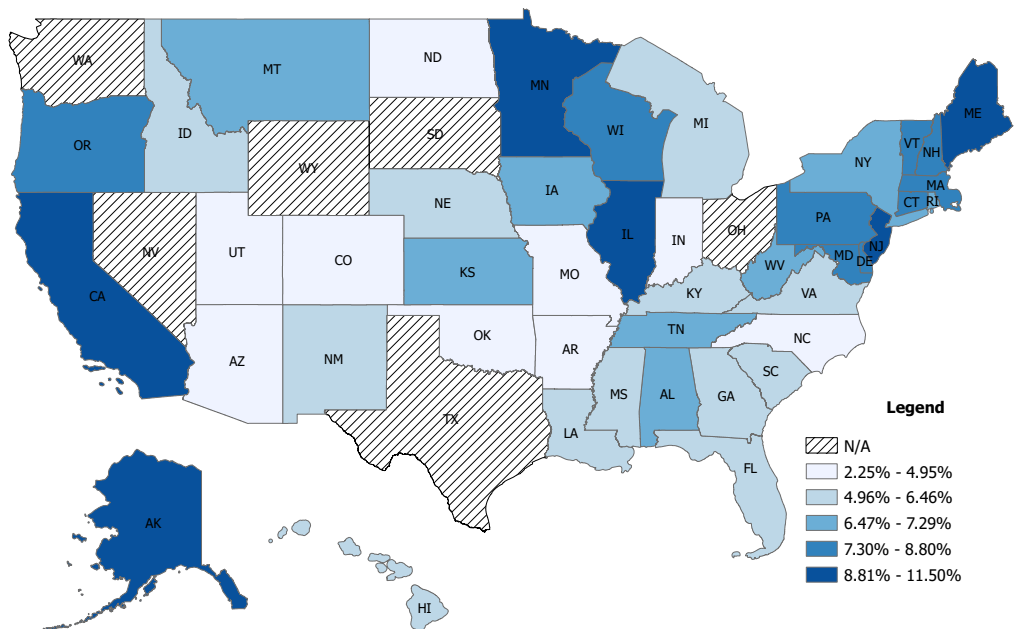

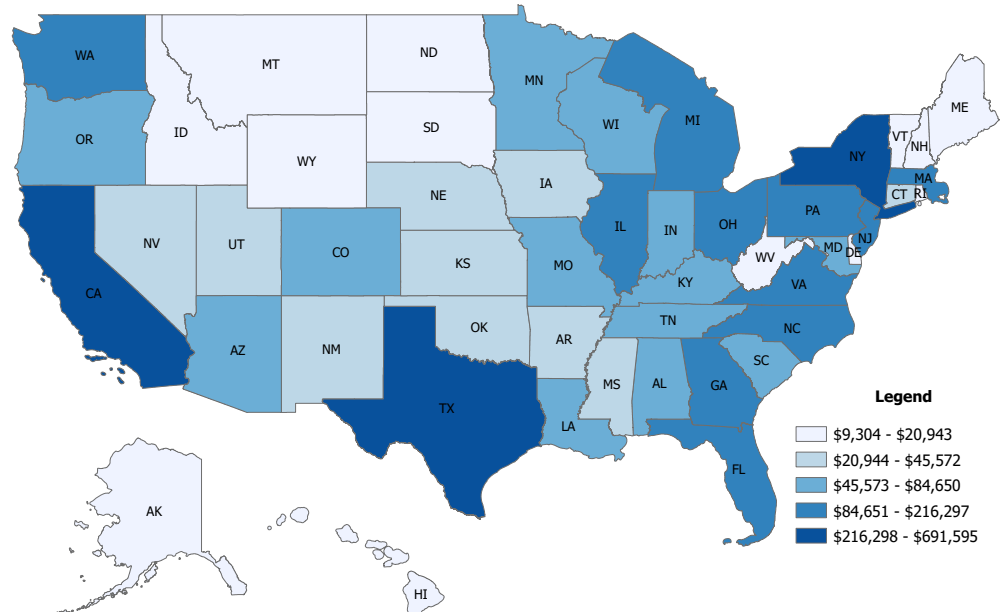

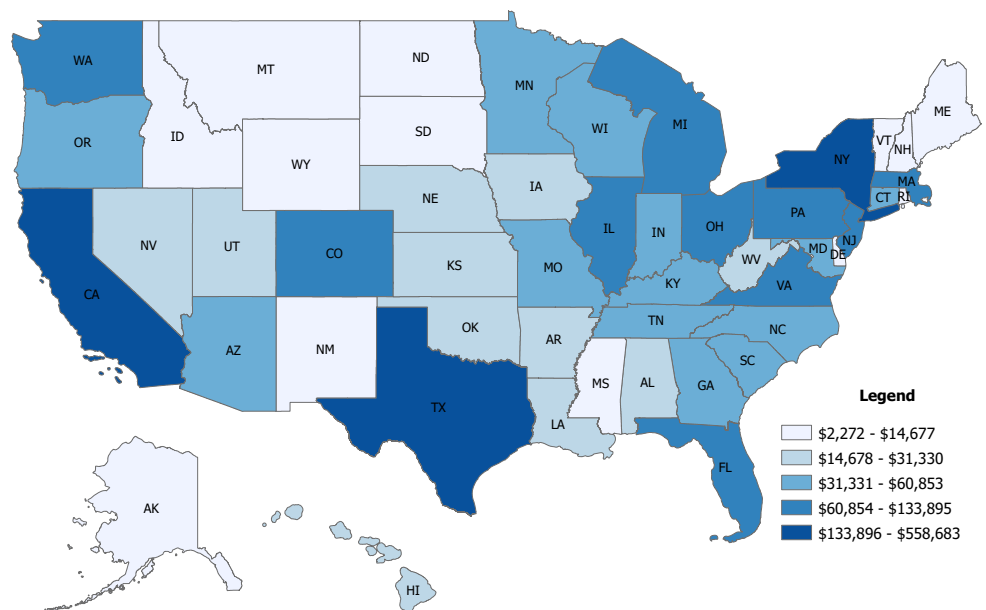

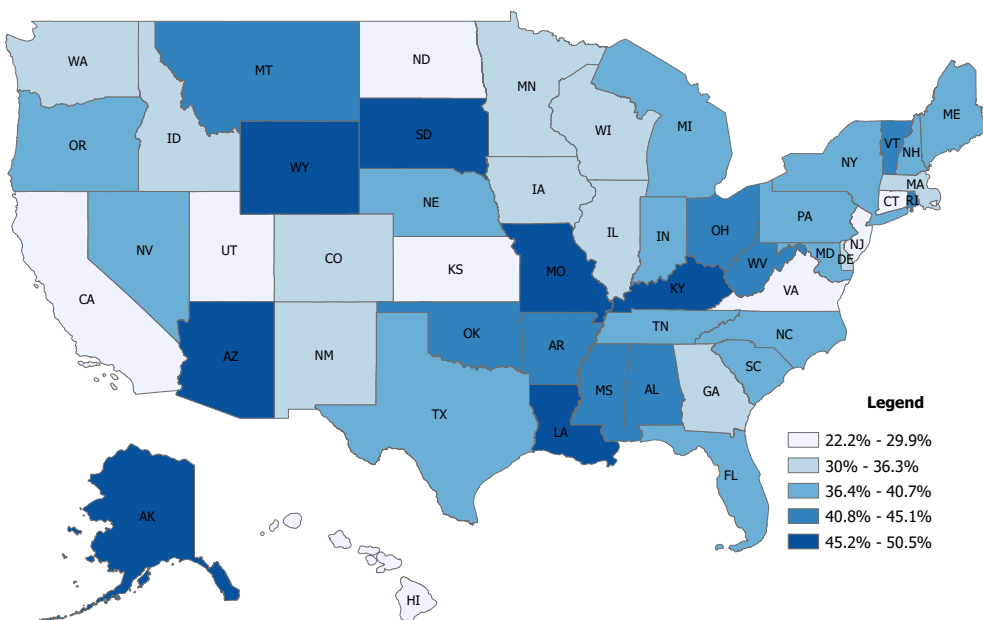

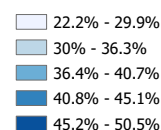
1972-2022 SHARE OF TOTAL REVENUE COMING FROM FEDERAL FUNDS IN NEBRASKA

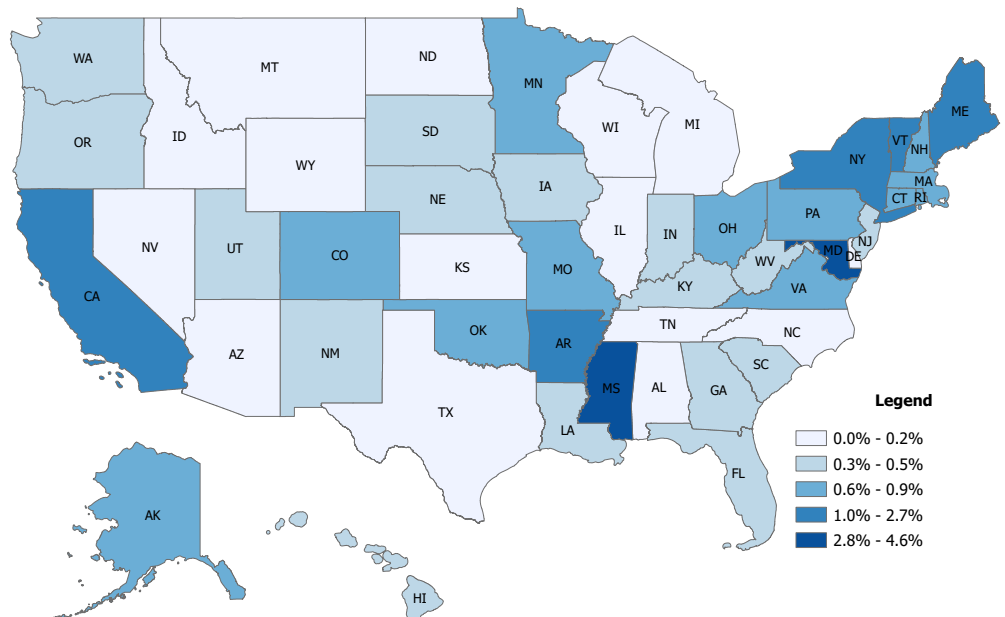

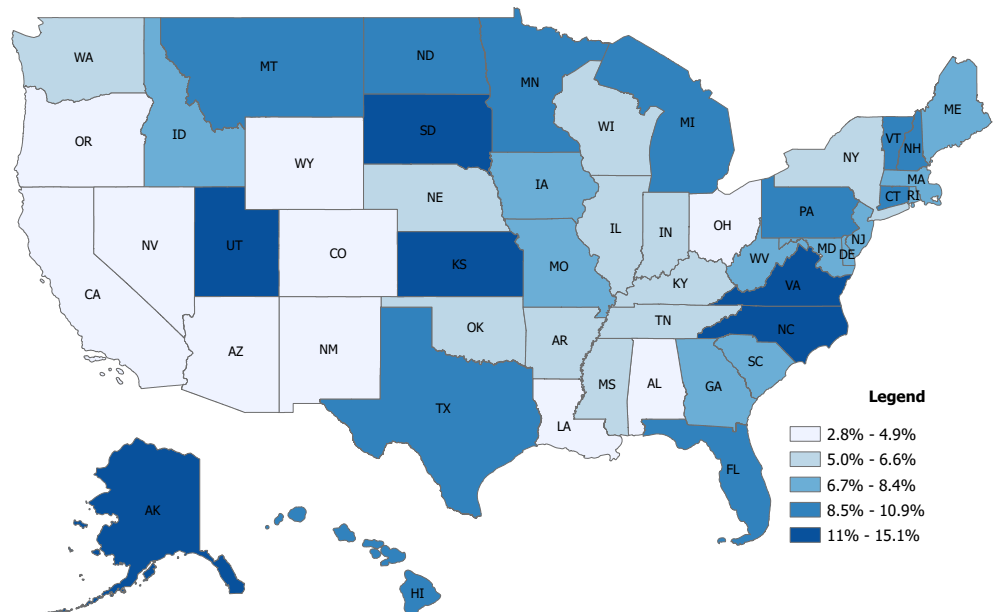

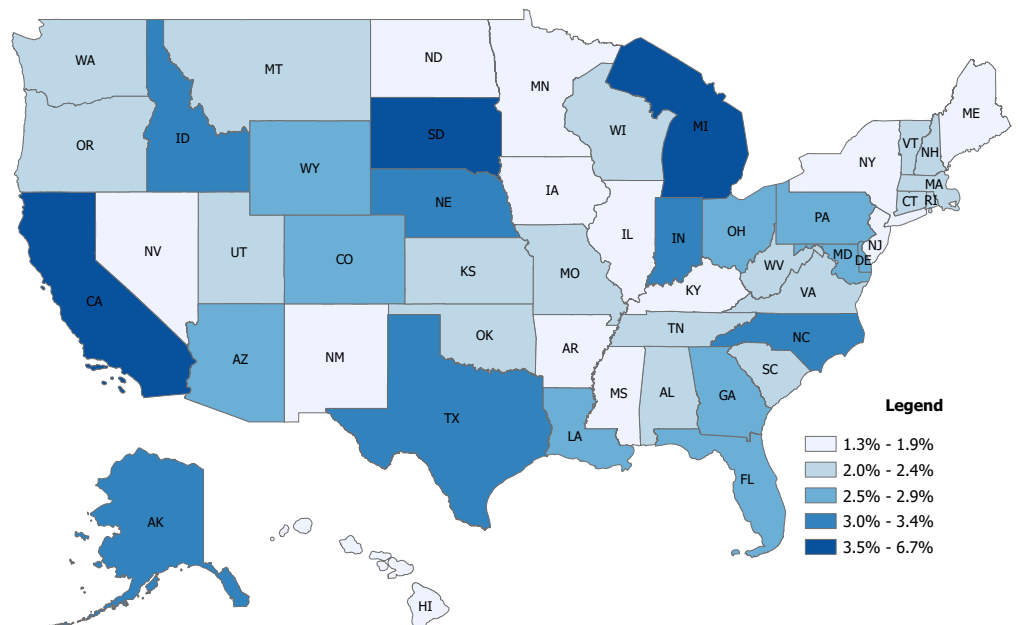

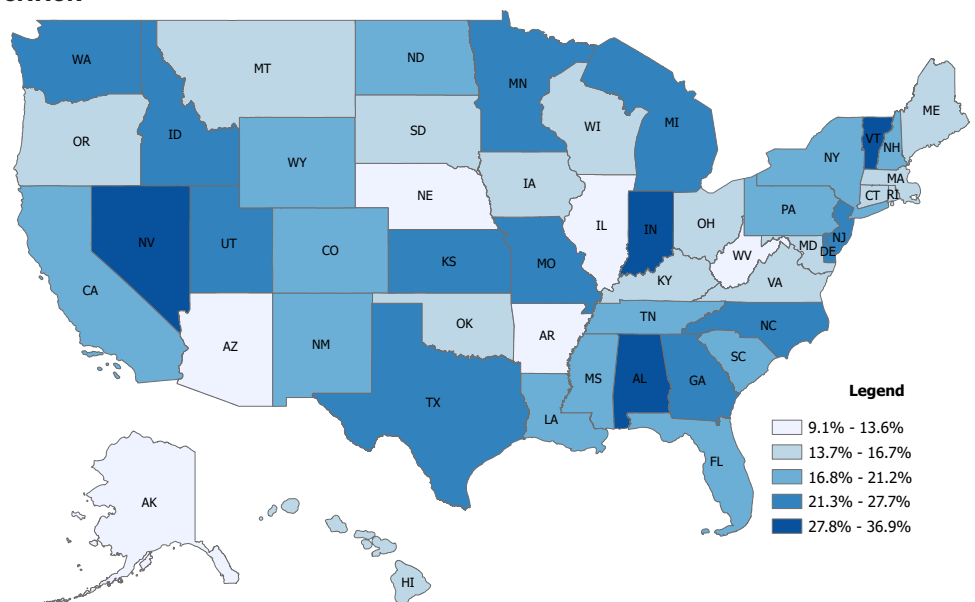

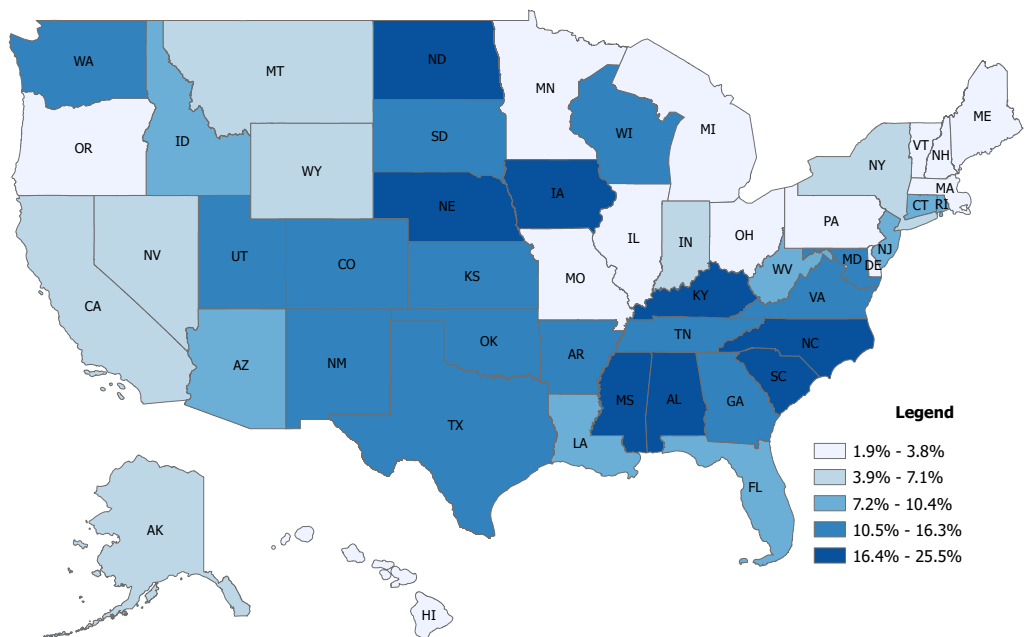

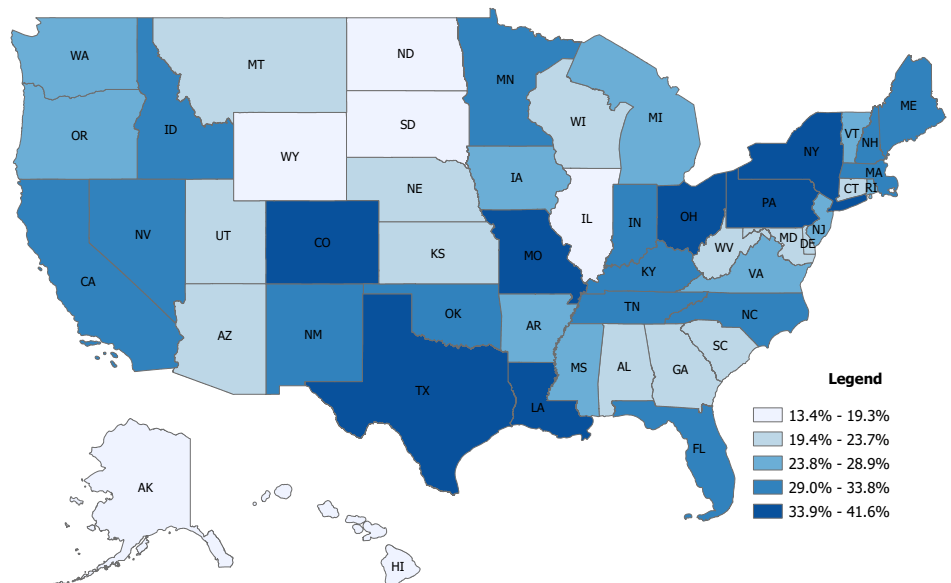

FISCAL YEAR 2023 PERCENTAGE OF STATE EXPENDITURES FOR ALL OTHER SPENDING

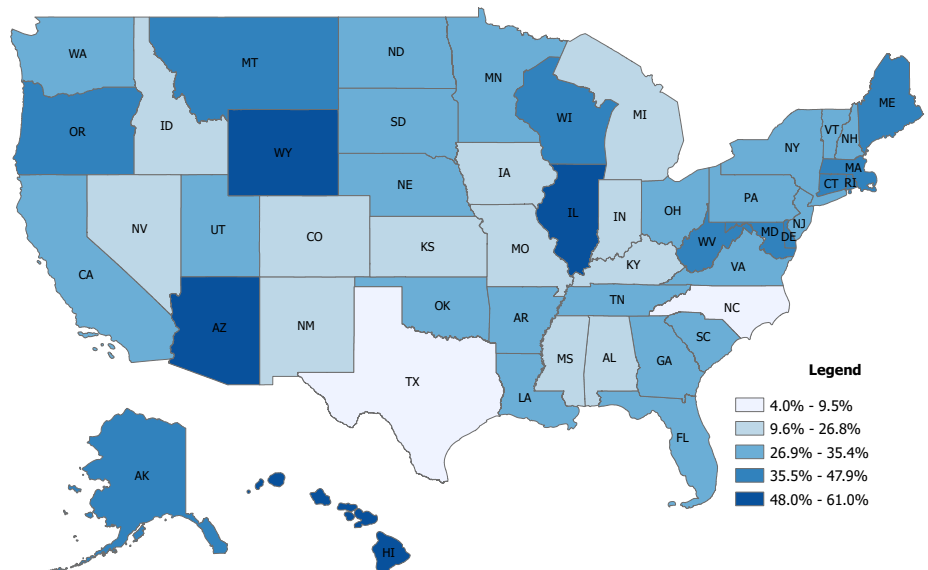
