SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. If there is objection we will revert back to item #2 which is LB 466.

CLERK: Mr. President, if I may, right before that, the committee on Ag and Environment gives notice of cancellation of hearing. (See page 1568 of the Legislative Journal.)

A new A bill, 389A offered by Senator Wesely. (Read. See page 1569 of the Legislative Journal.) 529A by Senator Schmit. (Read.)

Mr. President, your Enrolling Clerk respectfully reports that she has presented to the Governor LB 58, 283, and 491.

to solve this dilemma, we've got bills to read on General File and we've got at least, three, four, five motions. How long is that going to take, Pat, the total of that category?

CLERK: Well, Senator, the A bills will probably take no more than five or ten minutes and the motions, depending on the amount of debate, somewhere between half an hour to an hour.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, I would like to proceed with those General File items under General File, #4, and the three, four five items that you mentioned. Meanwhile I am going to try to see if I can't work out of this dilemma. So I would like to have you proceed and I will come back within an hour with some kind of comments.

PRESIDENT: Since there is no other motion before the House the Speaker has set his agenda and we will proceed then with agenda item #4 on General File, Mr. Clerk. We will take up General File. A bills. commencing with LB 95A.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 95A offered by Senator Cullan, (Read.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Cullan on 95A.

SENATOR CULLAN: Move the advancement of LB 95A.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? Senator Warner, did you wish to discuss any of these? Your light is in. 95A, alright, proceed then. Any further discussion? The question then is the advancement of LB 95A to E & R initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Motion is to advance 95A. This is on General File, going to E & R initial. Record the vote.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 1 may, Mr. President, to advance 95A.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. LB 95A is advanced to E & R initial. The next bill is LB 389A.

CLERK: (Read.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I move the advancement.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Hearing none, the question then is the advance of LB 389A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Motion

is the advance of LB 389A, E & R initial. Senator Wesely, what do you wish to do? Evidently nobody wants to vote so we had better get people in here. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 9 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the A bill.

FRESIDENT: Motion carries. LB 389A is advanced to E & R initial. The next bill is LB 396A.

CLERK: (Read.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Move to advance LB 396A to E & R initial.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to advance LB 396A. Any further discussion? All those in favor of advancing LB 396A to E & R initial vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance LB 396A.

PRESIDENT: The next bill, Mr. Clerk, is LB 477A.

CLERK: (Read.)

SENATOR CLARK PRESIDING

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Mr. President, I move that LB 477A be advanced.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion is to advance LB 477A. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance LB 477A.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is advanced. LB 506A.

CLERK: (Read.)

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move LB 506A be advanced to E & R initial.

SENATOR CLARK: Is there any discussion on the advancement of 506A? If not, all those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports that they have carefully examined and reviewed LB 95A and recommend that same be placed on Select File; 389A Select File; 396A Select File; 477A Select File; 506A Select File; 541A Select File and 257A Select File, all signed by Senator Kilgarin as Chair.

SENATOR CLARK: LB 556.

CLERK: Mr. President, with respect to 556, the bill was introduced by the Speaker at the request of the Governor. (Read.) The bill was read on March 30 of this year. It was referred to the Appropriations Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by the Appropriations Committee, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Warner, on the committee amendments.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, LB 556 is the bill that reflects the increased premiums when the health insurance that is provided for state employees, other than higher education, when those new bids were opened and those dollar amounts will be explained. The committee amendment that is offered merely, well, back up. amendment was offered at the committee hearing requesting that the legislation require that coverage for abortion be made available at the employee's expense and the presentation was based upon the testimony by those who appeared that the prohibition or the requirement for this, for an abortion to be paid for by the individual employee had been suggested when the legislation that prohibited state funds was being considered and enacted and they wanted some assurance that, in fact, that would occur. If you look on page 1877 of the Journal there is a letter which I requested of the Attorney General requiring two things relative to the amendment, first, whether or not whether it would be constitutional and I think you can summarize the response on that, that if the original legislation prohibiting it is constitutional then this is probably constitutional or if LB 125 is not constitutional then neither would this be either. So that seems to be a draw. The other request for an opinion, however, was whether or not we would jeopardize by the adoption of this amendment the coverage that the state might have for its employees under the new bid and it would be my understanding from the Attorney General's letter that if the amendment is adopted, that then it would be expected that the state would find someone who would provide that coverage for those who wanted it and provided they could find some company of some kind that would provide this kind of coverage then the conditions would be met and

in more clarity, with more clarity any detail on the sheet. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Senator Kilgarin, are you ready? There are seven bills that have no amendments pending so we are going to advance the bills. Senator Kilgarin.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 95A to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of 95A to E & R for engrossment. All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Next one is 389A.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 389A to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The next one is 477A.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 477A to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Next one, 506A.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 506A to E & $\mbox{\tt R}$ for engressment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Next bill, 541A.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 541A to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The bill is advanced. 257A.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 257A to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Last bill, 556.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 556A to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: The legislator chaplain today is Senator Rumery.

SENATOR RUMERY: Prayer.

PRESIDENT: Roll call. Has everyone registered your presence so we can begin the days activities. Record the presence Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Quorum being present, are there any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have no corrections. Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Journal stands correct as published. Any messages, reports or announcements?

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on E & R respectufully reports they have carefully examined and engrossed LB 95A and find the same correctly engrossed, 257A correctly engrossed, 389A, correctly engrossed, 477A correctly engrossed, 506A correctly engrossed, 541A correctly engrossed, 556 all correctly engrossed (signed), Senator Kilgarin, Chair.

Mr. President an Attorney General's opinion addressed to Senator Carsten regarding section 4 and 10 of 284, be inserted in the Journal (pages 2060-2062).

Mr. President, I have received from the State of Tennessee a joint resolution regarding Vietnam veterans. That will be on file in my office.

Mr. President, a communication from the Governor addressed to the Clerk regarding LB 190. See page 2062 of the Legislative Journal.

Mr. President, I have a report from the Department of Roads pursuant to Section 5(4) of LB 722 of 1980 Legislative Session. That will be on file in my office as well.

PRESIDENT: We are ready then for agenda item number four. Final Reading. If the Sergeant at Arms will secure the Chamber, all members will get to your desks. As soon as everyone is at their desks we will commence with Final

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to suspend and withdraw the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. The Clerk will read on Final Reading LB 472.

CLERK: (Read LB 472 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. 472 on Final Reading. Record the vote.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 2216, Legislative Journal.) 47 ayes, 0 nays, 1 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed on Final Reading. The next item of business on General File, no, I am sorry, item #5 on motions. The Chair recognizes Senator Wesely.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely would move to return LB 389A to Select File for a specific amendment.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, with the amendment we just placed on 389 yesterday which put the delayed date back to July 1 of next year, there is no need for an appropriation to fund the services which are provided under that bill and so we are deleting that part of the A bill and we are also reducing the administrative costs involved from about \$27,000 down to \$15,000 and so the motion is to return and we will cut the A bill from two hundred and fifty-two thousand some dollars to about fifteen thousand dollars. I think you can all support that.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to return to Select File for the specific amendment. (Gavel) Can't hear up here. Senator Wesely, do you wish to speak to your motion?

SENATOR WESELY: I already did.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All right. The motion is the return of the bill as shown on item #5 under motions.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 mays on the motion to return the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is returned. Now the motion is to adopt the specific amendment. Those in favor of the amendment as explained by Senator Wesely vote aye, opposed vote no.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt the Wesely amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The amendment is adopted. The motion is to readvance the bill. All those in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The bill is readvanced.

SENATOR NICHOL PRESIDING

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Cullan has called a brief meeting under the South balcony of the Health and Wefare Committee, please. Before we continue, may I please announce that Senator Kilgarin and Senator Chambers have guests. They have 120 eighth graders from a school in Omaha. Is it Marshad? Marrs, they say, all right. They are in the North balcony. Would you please welcome them to our Legislature? They have eight teachers with them but I didn't have the names of the eight teachers. Also Senator Kilgarin has five eighth grade students from St. Joseph School in Omaha, Mr. Dick Roach and Sister Clementine. So they are in the South balcony. Would you welcome them please? Thank you for visiting the Legislature. We will proceed with LB 406.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 406 was introduced by the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee. (Read title.) The bill was first read on January 20 of this year. At that time it was referred to the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee for public hearing. The bill has been advanced to General File, Mr. President. There are committee amendments pending by the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President, members of the body, I move the committee amendments on LB 406. LB 406 redistricts the 49 Legislative Districts, and if you want to follow along with me, these amendments are the white pages in your bill book right ahead of LB 406, Requisition 2452, and this amendment becomes the bill. This morning it feels to me like it is D Day. The day has arrived. It has taken many hours, many days of preparation and it has finally arrived. We have had many early morning meetings. We have had meetings during the lunch hour and, of course, we had the three hearings several weeks ago on the six reapportionment bills that we have, and before I get into the committee amendments, I want to thank the committee for working these long hours and sometimes under adverse conditions. I also want to thank all of the Senators for their

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay, no problem.

SENATOR CLARK: All those in favor of suspending the rules vote aye, opposed vote nay. It takes 30 votes. Voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting yes.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted on suspending the rules to read those five bills? Record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to suspend the rules and read those five bills.

SENATOR CLARK: The rules are suspended. The Clerk will now read LB 213 with the emergency clause attached.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 213 on Final Reading.)

SENATOR CLARK: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall 213 pass with the emergency clause attached. All those in favor vote aye. All opposed vote nay.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is declared passed without the emergency clause attached. The Clerk will now read LB 389.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 389 on Final Reading.)

SENATOR CLARK: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 389 pass. All those in favor vote age. All those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 2348-2349 of the Legislative Journal.) 34 ayes, 9 nays, 5 excused and not voting and 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is declared passed on Final Reading. The Clerk will now read LB 389A.

CLERK: (Read LB 389A on Final Reading.)

SENATOR CLARK: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 2349 of the Legislative Journal.) 31 ayes, 11 nays, 5 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is declared passed. Do you have anything to read in?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do.

SENATOR CLARK: All right, go right ahead.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports that they have carefully examined and engrossed LB 285 and find the same correctly engrossed; 544 correctly engrossed; 234A correctly engrossed and 531 correctly engrossed. Those are all signed by Senator Kilgarin as Chair.

SENATOR CLARK: How many more do you have to come up yet, Pat? What? We are waiting for seven more bills. Senator Marvel, I imagine we had better stand at ease until they come up. This might be a good time to discuss a lot of
