## LB 418

Recreation whose Chairman is Senator Labedz reports LB 416 indefinitely postponed; and LB 474 indefinitely postponed, both signed by Senator Labedz as Chairman.

SENATOR CLARK: No objections, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman makes a motion to withdraw LB 570. Pursuant to our rules that will be laid over.

SENATOR CLARK: We will now take up LB 261.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a request I believe from Senator Cullan to pass over LB 261.

SENATOR CLARK: All right, we will take that up during passover. LB 418.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 418 (read title.) The bill was first read on January 20 of last year. It was referred to the Government Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this bill was brought to me by the City of Gordon to address what they believe was a ambiguity in the statutes concerning the recording of the duties of the County Register of Deeds. Some sections of state law, current state law, require that plats and subdivisions are not authorized to be recorded if they are contrary to several sections of statutes which are specifically listed. The specific statutes refer to the authority of cities and counties to approve plats and subdivisions. The new language makes it clear that the County Register of Deeds, that he or she is not to record plats or subdivisions unless they have been approved by the appropriate governing body. As I understand it from the City Manager of Gordon, there were some developers who used this quirk, I guess, in state law to avoid coming before the City Council to obtain approval for their plat or subdivision and that that caused a good deal of problems as far as implementation of the zoning ordinances and comprehensive plan and so forth, and as you can see, there was no opposition to the legislation and it was supported by the Nebraska League of Municipalities. I would urge you to adopt this bill.

SENATOR CLARK: Is there any discussion on LB 261 (sic)? Senator Vard Johnson.

SENATOR VARD JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, Senator Kahle just called to my attention the fact that he and I both voted against this bill in committee and I had to quick like refresh my memory as to why I voted against it in committee. And now that I have done that, I can speak to what I think the significant issue is. I believe this bill would place the Register of Deeds in a judgmental capacity as to what items should be recorded and what items should not be recorded and I think that is a bad practice. I think very simply that if someone presents to our Register of Deeds a document for recordation, the Register of Deeds should be obligated to take the document irrespective of whether the document has been approved by the city council, by the village board of trustees or what have you. I think we establish a bad policy when we say to our public record keeper, you, public record keeper, have some judgmental capacity in terms of accepting a document for recordation and this bill does this. Because what this bill says very simply is that a Register of Deeds is not to accept a plat unless the plat has been approved by the appropriate governing board. Now as a lawyer, I guess one of the things that I learned many years ago, and it basically still is true, is that the primary function of a register of deeds is to accept whatever documents come down the pike and they record them to be permanently memoralized for posterity. Now later on other lawyers, other real estate personnel and the like will be looking at those documents. They will read abstracts, and they will buy title insurance and what have you and it will be they who will make the decision as to whether or not the plat was a valid plat because it was or was not approved by the local governing board but the plat will be there. It will be something that will have been recorded and the decision whether or not to record the plat will never have been given to the register of deeds. So I do think this bill does represent ... I understand why Senator Cullan has brought it in because I can appreciate some of the problems that have arisen but I think it is not good public policy to, in effect, give any judgmental powers to a register of deeds with respect to whether or not to accept a document for recordation. If we bring a document in, that register of deeds should record it and that is all there is to it so I do oppose the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Cullan, do you wish to close? SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature,

quite frankly. I have never been presented with the argument that Senator Johnson has just raised and I would like to visit with him about it a little bit more before I decide whether or not to support this bill at a later stage of consideration. My initial reaction to Senator Johnson's concern would be that one of the requirements of having a valid plat or subdivision is that it be approved by the city council or the appropriate governing body and I think it is more of an administerial task to look and see that this document actually has been approved before we allow it to be recorded than it is a legislative or an administrative task and I guess that I think it is just like making sure that all the checks are filled in on the form before you allow it to be filed. I guess that I don't see the same problem. Perhaps that is because Senator Johnson understands it better than I do. But at this point in time I would ask you to advance the bill and then I will sit down with Senator Johnson and review this problem. Perhaps we can rectify it before Select File.

SENATOR CLARK: The question is the advancement of 261 (sic). All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Once more, have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 3 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: 418 is advanced. We will now take up LB 267.
