four days unlimited bill requests would be accepted by the bill drafter and then between the fourth and the eighth day one more request per senator and per committee. This is a little change from before because since we have unlimited bill introductions now we were afraid we might get into the situation where the bill drafter just would not be able to handle the volume of requests. So I call that to your attention and hope that you can get your requests in today and if you have an emergency then you have the prerogative of another request between the fourth legislative day and the eighth legislative day. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Any questions of Senator Lamb? Or any other comments? Okay, at this time the Chair takes pleasure to introduce some visitors from Senator Marsh's district up here in the north balcony, some 25 seniors from Southeast High School, their instructor Mr. Douglas. They're up in the north balcony. Would you welcome the Southeast seniors up here in the balcony. Welcome to your Legislature. All right we'll... The Clerk will just read some bills in until...it's getting close enough to the time of the Governor's arrival. We will proceed with the reading of some bills, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read by title for the first time, LBs 746-748 as found on page 190 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Does anyone else have any bills to introduce before the Governor's arrival? We just as well get in the bills if you have any there. The Clerk would like to read them in.

CLERK: (Read by title for the first time, LBs 749-752 as found on page 191 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Speaker Marvel for purpose of a motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion that I make is that a committee of five be appointed to escort the Governor to the Chamber to deliver the State of the State and the Budget Message. I so move.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to appoint a committee of five to escort the Governor. All those in favor signify by saying aye, opposed nay. The committee the Chair will appoint will be as follows to escort the Governor: Senator Carsten, Senator Newell, Senator Barrett, Senator Lowell Johnson and Senator Remmers. That committee of five will proceed to escort the Governor into the Chamber for the delivery of his State of the State address and the Legislature will be at ease until the Governor arrives.
