Number two, another member of the committee is not returning and we will lose the continuity and the thinking of his on the interim study. Number three, it is a Government issue, not a Public Works issue, and, therefore, I think has been referred to the wrong committee. I think the Military Governmental Affairs Committee should handle the issue. There are a lot of people on the floor, Senator DeCamp, that can take issues like this and study them, read them, discuss them and make a good decision on them, and we will try to make and bend the rules so you can be an ex officio member if you feel real strongly about it. But I would like to ask the body to stop and think for a minute that this is a Government issue, not a Public Works issue, and that you refer it to the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee.
