SPEAKER MARVEL: We are ready for item #4, resolutions. The first one is LR 13.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 13 is offered by several Senators. (Read LR 13.) Mr. President, that Resolution is found on page 403.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, the Resolution is self-evident. I think most members of the Legislature signed it and I would urge you to adopt it. It just congratulates Coach Devaney on getting into the Football Hall of Fame.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of the adoption of the Resolution as read vote aye, opposed vote no. LR 13. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of LR 13, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the Resolution is adopted. The next one, LR 14.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 14 is found on page 409 of the Journal, offered by Senator Fenger and Senator Newell. (Read LR 14.) Again, Mr. President, that is found on page 409 of the Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Fenger.

SENATOR FENGER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I rise this morning to ask you to recognize and acknowledge with me the accomplishments of another of Nebraska's favorite sons. I think it is real interesting to note that many of our young men have gone on to fame and glory in many areas and in their lifestyle have become ex-Nebraskans. This has never happened to Bob Gibson. Bob Gibson honored the greater Omaha area by being a member of that community for years. He honored Creighton University by being a member of students in that school, and in all of his accomplishments he has never forgotten that he is a Nebraskan, and I seek the affirmative vote of the fellow members of this body in the adoption of this Resolution. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President and members of the body, I rise to briefly explain a few things which caused me,

or encouraged me to sign and present this Resolution along with Senator Fenger, and I am out of breath so I will make this short. I should get here earlier and that way I wouldn't have to run so far, and fast. Bob Gibson, it seems appropriate that we honor Bob Gibson in this way because of the great contributions that he has provided not only as a business man but as a sports hero, as a solid citizen and as an example, and maybe most importantly as a positive example for our children. The kind of determination, strength and leadership that he has provided Nebraska, the kind of pride that Nebraskans have in his great accomplishments are representative of the finest tradition in athletics and in the business community. With that, I encourage this body to designate Bob Gibson Day on his birthday and to give him the acknowledgement that he so well deserves.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of the adoption of the Resolution vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the Resolution, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. The Resolution is adopted. The next order of business is #5 which is Final Reading, and the rules indicate that all legislators will be in their seats on Final Reading and that no unauthorized personnel will be on the floor. We cannot start Final Reading until those requirements are fulfilled. We have 30 minutes of Final Reading. We cannot do anything until everybody gets to their seats, and those who are attempting to hide, I suggest that you stand up and follow the rules. Once more. SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass? Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Senator Chambers, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Point of information, Mr. Chairman. The bill lists Senator Frank Lewis as an introducer and since he is not a member of the 87th Legislature, I am wondering if that makes any difference. It is just for a point of information.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a reference report referring LB 543 and LR 12; rereferring LB 526 as well as a number of gubernatorial appointments. (See pages 441-442 of the Journal.)

Finally, Mr. President, I have a report from the Thurston County Sheriff's Department pursuant to statutory section 23-362.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner is excused today so we are going to pass over #4, item #4 and move to item #5 which is General File and the first order of business is LB 165A.

CLERK: Read LB 165A.
