PRESIDENT LUEDTKI PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: Has everybody recorded your presence?
Record the presence, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President. Mr. President, I have a reference report from the Executive Board referring a gubernatorial appointment. (Page 1971 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, new resolutions. LR 388 offered by Senators Cullan and Newell. (Read LR 388 as found on pages 1973 and 1974 of the Legislative Journal.) Mr. President, 389 offered by Senator Wesely. (Read LR 389 as found on page 1974 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, I have an Attorney General's Opinion addressed to Senator Koch. That will be inserted in the Journal. (See pages 1974 through 1976 of the Legislative Journal regarding LB 602A.) That is on LB....Bingo, that is right, senator.

Mr. President, I have a message from the Governor addressed to the Legislature. (Read message. Pages 1976-77 of the Journal regarding LB 669A.)

Mr. President, two other communications from the Governor addressed to the Clerk. (Read communications regarding LBs 278, 378, 378A, 480, 568, 604, 629, 629A, 688, 693, 708, 760, 835, 909, 967. Page 1977 of the Journal.) A second letter to the Clerk, Mr. President. (Read letter regarding LBs 609, 609A, 669, 714, 714A, 854, 854A. Page 177 of the Journal.)

Mr. President, I have a gubernatorial appointment of Mr. Robert Borgmann to the Motor Vehicle Industry Licensing Board. (See page 1978 of the Journal.)

Mr. President, the bills that we have read on Final Reading this morning are now ready for your signature as well as the resolutions that were passed Wednesday of this week by the Legislature.

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business I propose to sign and I do sign LR 212, LR 266 and LR 268, 269, 272, 274, 277, 278, 287, 292, 293, 295, 298, 304, 313, 316, 331, 359, and 380. And the LBs are engrossed legislative bills 522, 212, 212A, 255, and 255A. Okay, as I understand it we

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Kremer, do you have any close?

SENATOR KREMER: I've closed twice already. That is all, thank you.

SENATOR LAMB: Motion is to adopt the report. Those in support vote yes, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 40 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the Public Works report.

SENATOR LAMB: The report is adopted. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a series of resolutions. I have a motion regarding the following resolutions, 382, 383, 385, 387, 388 and 389. The motion that pertains to those resolutions is to suspend Rule 4, Section 5 and 6 and adopt those six resolutions.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, these are all nonimportant resolutions, I just ask that. . . You can go ahead and read what they are if you want to. They declare a couple of weeks and they praise the gymnastic team, that garbage that we usually pass. There are two resolutions that we withdrew didn't we, that some questions were raised on two of them? Okay, so these shouldn't be. . .

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Kilgarin.

SENATOR KILGARIN: There was one resolution in there, Mr. President and members, that is not unimportant. It is honoring Jim Hartung and Steve Elliott, Jim Hartung being from South High, for their good work. They are seniors and they are graduating from the University and I would urge you to vote for Senator Wesely's motion and the resolutions.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, to get the thing moving can we just have whose names they are congratulating if they are all congratulating somebody? If that is all that they are we ought to at least know their names. Would that be too much to ask?

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. Clerk, can you just briefly summarize the resolutions?

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 382 basically says that the Platts-mouth Highschool band is dedicated and is excellent in its field. LR 383 by Senator Wesely would declare the week of April 18 through 25 as nuclear awareness week in the State of Nebraska. Mr. President, 385 is offered by Senator's Newell and Kilgarin and it proclaims Mr. Jim Hartung and Mr. Steve Elliott as wonderful people, it also says the University of Nebraska gymnastic team is the best ever. Mr. President, LR 387 is a resolution honoring the members of this year's legislature who are retiring from service. Senator Koch, I don't believe you are retiring.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Koch, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR KOCH: For a point of personal privilege.

SENATOR LAMB: Please state your point.

SENATOR KOCH: In 1975 thirteen of us came into this body as freshmen and I want to acknowledge their service and commend them. It has been a pleasure to serve with them. I'm talking about Senator Stoney, Senator Dworak, Senator Cope, Senator Rummery and Senator Burrows. And, I'll be the last of the Mohegans contrary to what your applause was about, hopefully I will return and serve four more years. By the same token I want to honor Senator Kremer, it has been a pleasure serving with him on the Public Works Committee and I valued his judgement on water a great deal. Wish them all well.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 388 offered by Senator's Cullan and Newell offers condolence's to the family of Benjamin Wall who passed away this last week. Mr. President, 389 offered by Senator Wesely would declare the week of September 6th through the 10th as pedestrian awareness week.

SENATOR LAMB: The motion is to suspend the rules so that all these resolutions can be considered at one time. Those in support vote yes, those opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 1 nay on suspension of the rules on adoption of those three resolutions, Mr. President.

SENATOR LAMB: The rules were suspended and the motion is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 381 is offered by the Business and Labor Committee. (Read LR 381).
