CLERK: (Read LB 313 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 313 pass? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 1209, Legislative Journal.) 48 ayes, 0 nays, 1 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 313 passes and that will conclude Final Reading today. Mr. Clerk, do you have some things to read in?

CLERK: Yes, very quickly, Mr. President, a new resolution, LR 49 offered by Senator Sieck. (Read. See page 1209, Legislative Journal.) That will be laid over, Mr. President.

Senator Koch would like to print amendments to LB 17 in the Journal, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you have any other items? We have two Resolutions to consider this morning. The first one is LR 48.

CLERK: (Read LR 48.) It is offered by Senator Koch, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker and members, first of all I want to correct the Journal. Barbara Shields is really from LaVista not from Omaha. Sometimes we think that Omaha is everything and I would like to have that correction in the Journal. Most of all I think it is important that this body does recognize this young lady. She is the first student to ever receive a Fulbright scholarship to Switzerland. Not only that you might notice that she is concentrating in the area of genetic engineering. I think we should reconider our action on this and bring this back and strike the Haberman amendment which we will be going only to one license plate on all of our vehicles. I move that this amendment be adopted....the bill be returned first.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Morning prayer is to be given by the Reverend T. M. Rollerson, the Pastor of God's Missionary Baptist Church.

CLERK: Mr. President, the Public Health and Welfare Committee reports on the appointments of M. L. Chaloupka, John Estabrook, Ramona Freeman, Dwaine Peetz, Robert Quick and Tod Voss. That report is found on page 1299 of the Journal, Mr. President. Signed by Senator Cullan as Chair of the Public Health and Welfare Committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Cullan. Item #4 on the agenda.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I believe this is the Committee on Committee reports from the Public Health and Welfare Committee.
