SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. Chairman, members of the body, I move the advancement of LB 200. I would like to explain the bill a little bit to you now. Currently a county with a population of more than 200,000 is not allowed to create a rural road improvement district and of course, LB 200 would delete that provision. At the present time all counties under 200 have been able to create a rural road improvement district. Also if a resolution is presented to the county board that proposes a rural road improvement district does not meet with their approval, the board may deny passage of the proposed district. Also this bill proposes to codify the interest rate on delinquent assessments for rural road improvement districts and this would amend that and put it in Section 45-101.03 and if you will recall this is in bill LB 167 which is now on Select File. So what it would do is make all these delinquent taxes, the interest on these delinquent taxes equal. I urge you to support me in advancing LB 200.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Rumery.

SENATOR RUMERY: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Hefner a question if he would yield.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Yes, I would be happy to yield.

SENATOR RUMERY: Senator, who asked you to introduce this bill?

SENATOR HEFNER: The county engineers.

SENATOR RUMERY: And does this have the approval of the County Officials Association?

SENATOR HEFNER: It certainly does. It has the approval of the county engineers throughout the state and also the County Officials Association. They were there to testify at the hearing and there was no opposition.

This bill would strike that language. LB 371 also does one other thing and the most important part of the bill probably in that it changes the lease purchase agreements by allowing public schools to enter into so-called arrangements for a total of seven years where-in now the language states five. This would enable school boards to keep some of their payment costs down when they enter into agreements for equipment. A seven year leasing period is more in keeping with standard industry practice. I would move passage of the bill, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? We are voting on the advancement of the bill. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

Mr. President, Senator Warner as Chairman of the Appropriations Committee moves for the introduction of Request #931.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move the bill be introduced. This will be one of six bills that we will be requesting to have introduced. They will cover the general operations of state government, and if they are introduced, I then would ask to have them placed on General File as we normally do so they can be printed immediately. SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, I move that we adjourn until tomorrow morning at nine o'clock.
