SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker and members, the committee amendments involve a couple of words really. LB 250 makes several changes relating to the Commission for the Hearing Impaired. Most of the bill involves technical changes but the committee did make three changes to the bill. First on page 3, we reinserted that the Commission was for "advocating" public policies and programs rather than "facilitating" them. We felt that "advocating" better defined their mission. Secondly, on page 4 we again reinstated language, this time "promote" the training of interpreters rather than the Commission would "provide" for their training. Providing for the training of interpreters could have a major fiscal impact on the Commission and the Commission does not want to get into this area. Finally on page 4, we reinserted the word "voluntary" to say that the Commission will conduct a voluntary census of the hearing impaired people of the state rather than just a census. The committee felt this could create a situation of forced registration by people that they are hearing impaired and no one wants to force this. These are the committee amendments. I move for their adoption.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The committee amendment is adopted. Senator Labedz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The Nebraska Commission for the Hearing Impaired has been providing services to the hearing impaired people in Nebraska for almost a year now and their track record is very encouraging but in the year of meetings they did come up with some changes and the committee amendments, of course, were added which they approve of. A couple of other changes, it reduces the number of meetings for a year from six to four and it changes the election for chairperson from every year to every two years. Also changes the wording where the Commission shall appoint the Executive Director to serve with the advice and consent of the Commission and it changes the language authorizing the Commission to maintain a list or statewide list of interpreters. Section 6 also removes the provision requiring the Commission on the Hearing Impaired to cooperate with the State Department of Education and changes it to any state agency having authority relating to the problems of the hearing impaired. These changes would allow the Commission on the Hearing Impaired to more adequately carry out its legislative mandate. I urge the advancement of LB 250 as amended.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is to advance the bill, LB 250, to E & R for review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote. No, I am sorry. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.
