LB 426, 309, 281

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. Speaker, we took care of the provisions of 426 in another bill last session so I would like to ask unanimous consent to withdraw the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Alright, you need 25 votes and lay over a day. Is that alright with you?

SENATOR DWORAK: I want to withdraw the bill. We don't need the bill. The provisions of 426 and I can't remember the number, was put into the 355 last session and there is no need for LB 426. We passed it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Dworak, the easiest way to do it, you posed the question to withdraw it. We ask those who are in favor of you withdrawing the bill vote aye and then we're through with it.

SENATOR DWORAK: That's fine.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion before the House is the withdrawal of LB 426. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to withdraw, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried, the bill is withdrawn. The next item is LB 281.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 281 introduced by Senator Chambers. (Read title.) The bill was first read on January 16 of last year, referred to the Government and Military and Veterans Affairs Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I have no amendments pending, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, this is one of those bills...(mike not working)...pass over. We're doing some work which has not been completed and the bill is not ready to be dealt with at this time.

SPEAKER MARVEL: That's LB 281?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there any objection? If not, it is passed over. The next bill is LB 309.
