SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SPEAKER MARVEL: The prayer this morning will be given by Reverend Roe, the United Methodist Minister affiliated with the Trinity Methodist Church in Lincoln, Nebraska. Reverend Roe.

REVEREND ROE: Prayer offered.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Roll call. Item #3. Will you please record your presence if you haven't already. Record your vote.

CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Ready for item #3?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, first of all, corrections to the Journal. (Read corrections to the Journal as found on page 220 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, I have an Attorney General's Opinion addressed to Senator Sieck regarding LB 58. (See pages 220 and 221 of the Legislative Journal.) I have a series of reports, the first from Frank Marsh, the State Treasurer, regarding the detailed statement of the condition of the State Treasury.

Mr. President, a communication from the Metropolitan Technical Community College regarding LB 1004; a communication from the State Department of Correctional Services regarding program evaluation of the therapeutic community at the Lincoln Correctional Center.

Mr. President, a deposit or communication from David O. Coolidge who is the Director-State Engineer of the Department of Roads pursuant to I.B 722. Those will all be on file in my office, Mr. President.

Mr. President, your Committee on Constitutional Revision and Recreation gives notice of public hearing in Room 1019 for January 30, February 5 and February 6. (Signed) Senator Labedz as Chairperson.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, we now go to item #4, introduction of new bills.

CLERK: Mr. President, new bills: Read title to LB 284-309 as found on pages 223 through 228 of the Legislative Journal.

is adopted. Are we now ready for General File, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, if I may read just an item or two in. Your committee on Government, Military and Veterans Affairs reports LB 280 to General and LB 536 to General File. (Signed) Senator Kahle. The Government Committee reports favorably upon certain gubernatorial appointments, and the Government Committee would like to have an Executive Session under the north balcony upon recess this morning. Underneath the north balcony, the Government Committee, Mr. President. (See page 1061 of the Journal for gubernatorial appointment.)

Mr. President, your committee on Education whose Chairman is Senator Koch reports LB 303 to General File with amendments, and 423 to General File with amendments. (Signed) Senator Koch. (See pages 1060 and 1061 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, we are ready for General File, LB 39E.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 39 was offered by Senator Kahle. (Read title.) The bill was first read on January 8 of this year. It was referred to the Public Health and Welfare Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by the Public Health and Welfare Committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely, do you want to take the committee amendments?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes. Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, the Public Health Committee found that there were some technical problems with the bill. The committee amendments would adjust and take care of those technical problems and make it clear that this is not retroactive but it does, in fact, it's a prospective decrease in the percentage figures and I think it is just a technical amendment by the committee. I move the committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 39. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 mays on adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The committee

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 mays on the motion to advance the bill. Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is advanced. The next bill is 303. Is there anyone prepared to take that bill? It is Senator Beutler's bill. Senator Koch, are you prepared to take 303?

SENATOR KOCH: Yes, Senator Beutler has requested that I handle in case we got to it today and I will.

SENATOR CLARK: All right, the Clerk will read.

CLERK: Mr. President, if I may, LB 303 (read title). It was originally read on January 19, referred to the Education Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File with committee amendments attached, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: On the committee amendments, Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Because it is...the whole purpose of the bill is to correct some problems we have when school boards have vacancies and Senator Beutler's bill brings about a uniform procedure and we follow in the school boards primarily what we follow in our own cases here. In case there is an appointment, then the next election you would run and that is the way the procedure goes. It is uniform for all systems except the Class Is. As you know the Class I schools presently have an annual meeting and by caucus select the members of those boards. In this case it says in case of vacancy the board members will appoint the person who will serve until the next annual meeting at which time he would continue that position or someone would replace that person. So that is what LB 303 is about and I ask for adoption of the amendment and the advance of the bill to E & R Initial.

SENATOR CLARK: Is there any discussion on the committee amendments? If not, all those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted on the committee amendments. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the committee amendments.

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SENATOR CLARK: The motion carried. The committee amendments are adopted. On the bill itself, Senator Koch, do you move for the advancement?

SENATOR KOCH: I move for the advancement of LB 303, as amended, to E & R Initial.

SENATOR CLARK: Is there any discussion on the advancement of 303 to Initial? If not, all those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 mays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion carried. The bill is advanced. The next bill is 216.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 216 introduced by the Ag and Environment Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 15, referred to Ag and Environment for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File with the committee amendments attached, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Schmit on the committee amendments.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, basically all the committee amendments do is to exempt radioactive waste from the provisions of the bill and the reason for that is that those wastes are already regulated by the Lepartment of Health. And I move the adoption of the committee amendments.

SENATOR CLARK: Is there any discussion on the committee amendments? If not, all those in favor vote aye. All those opposed v je nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.

SENATOR CLARK: The committee amendments are adopted. On the bill itself, Senator Schmit.

(See pages 1815 through 1817 of the Legislative Journal.) Mr. President, new resolution, LR 116, offered by Senator Rumery. (Read LR 116 as found on page 1815 of the Legislative Journal.) Mr. President, that will be laid over pursuant to our rules. That's all that I have, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We will proceed then, Mr. Clerk, with LB 160.

CLERK: (Read LB 160 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 160 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read the record vote as found on page 1814 of the Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 1 nay, 5 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 160 passes with the emergency clause attached. The next bill on Final Reading is LB 161.

CLERK: (Read LB 161 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure

SENATOR KILGARIN: Mr. Speaker, the introducer wishes to pass over LB 487 at this time.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Then the next bill is 316.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move the E & R amendments to LB 316.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The E & R amendments is adopted.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 316 to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The bill is advanced. The next bill is 441.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move the E & R amendments to LB 485.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The E & R amendment is adopted.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 485 to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Then we go next to LB 303, Senator Kilgarin.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move the E & R amendments to LB 305.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. The motion is carried. The E & R amendment is adopted.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 303 to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. LB 216? Okay. 322. Senator.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move the E & R amendments to LB 322.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The E & R amendment is adopted.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 322 to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The bill is advanced. LB 411.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move the E & R amendment to LB 411.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. The motion is carried. The E & R amendment is adopted.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 411 to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The bill is advanced. 529.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move the E & R amendments to LB 529.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. The E & R amendments are adopted.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 529 to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The bill is advanced. LB 329A.

SEMATOR KILGARIN: 529A, sir?

SPEAKER MARVEL: I am sorry, 529A, right.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 529A to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Thank you, Senator Kilgarin. Now the Clerk has some items to read

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is advanced. The Clerk wants to read some things in.

CLERK: Mr. President, new A bill, 129A offered by Senator Nichol. (Read LB 129A for the first time.)

Mr. President, Miscellaneous Subjects gives notice of hearing for Tuesday, May 19 on LB 551, 552, 553 and 554. And that is signed by Senator Hefner as Chair.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. Clerk will read on Final Reading LB 303.

CLERK: Read LB 303 on Final Readin .

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass. Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. LB 303 on Final Reading. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 43 ayes, 0 mays, 6 excused and not voting. Vote appears on page 2099 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed on Final Reading. The next bill, 326E, if there are no objections the two principal's are working out an agreement and they would like to have the bills passed over for one time. Is that right Senator Hoagland? Okay, if there is no objection we will go then to LB 336 on Final Reading.

CLFRK: Read LB 336.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass, LB 336. Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Senator Stoney.

SENATOR STONEY: I have a question of the Clerk. It was my understanding when I offered an amendment to this bill that we were changing the date of December 31, 1983, to correspond with the fiscal year of June 30, 1984. Now I think that should be consistent in LB 336 as it is in 336A, and I would like a ruling on that please.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Record the vote.

CLERK: 42 ayes, 0 mays, 1 present and not voting, 6 excused and not voting. Yote appears on page 2100 of the Lerislative Journal.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 488 was a bill introduced by Senator Goodrich. (Read.) The bill was first real on January 20. It was referred to the Government, Military and Government Affairs Committee. The offices are for the knor, the Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Actorie General, Auditor of Public Accounts and State Treasury.
