ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, LB 324 (read title). It was read the first time on January 19. It was referred to Urban Affairs Committee and there are committee amendments from Urban Affairs Committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Landis, do you want to speak to the committee amendments?

SENATOR LANDIS: Yes, sir. The committee amendments strike from the bill a definition of salary. It strikes from the bill a provision changing the method of figuring the appropriate pension benefits for firefighters in the City of Lincoln and, therefore, strikes all of the fiscal impact of the bill. The section which the committee amendments adopt is a payback section allowing the firefighter who has left the pension system, left the employ of the City of Lincoln as a firefighter and then return to work as a firefighter

to buy himself back into the pension system by yielding up the appropriate amount of pension benefits plus interest. That section of language, that concept, is agreed upon by both parties, the City of Lincoln and the firefighters. So with the adoption of the committee amendments, then we strike all of the objectionable language, we leave then the payback provision and that is acceptable language. I would ask for the adoption of the committee amendments, and if they are adopted, I will simply make the motion to have the bill advanced and that will be all as far as the discussion of the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 324. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the committee amendments.

SENATOR DeCAMP: (Prayer offered).

PRESIDENT: Roll call.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Amen.

PRESIDENT: For the record. Record the presence.

CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: A quorum being present, are there any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have no corrections, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Journal stands correct as published. Any messages, reports and announcements?

CLERK: Mr. President, yesterday when 324 was considered Senator Landis at that time made a motion to withdraw the bill. That is now before us.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Landis. Just a minute, Senator Landis, you are not on. Okay, go ahead.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, LB 324 is a pension bill for primary class cities. The essential provisions of that bill have been put into another primary class city, LB 366, and for that reason since there are no provisions of merit at this point, I would move to withdraw the bill rather than to have it be laying around on Select File open for amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Senator Newell, did you wish to speak to the withdrawal motion? You have your light on. I was just wondering what it was on for. Oh, okay, it works. Testing for the day. Any further discussion? I guess, Senator Landis, that is your opening and your closing so the motion is to withdraw LB 324. All those in favor vote

aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to withdraw the bill.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. LB 324 is withdrawn. The next bill is LB 487.

CLERK: Mr. President. I have E & R amendments on LB 487.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Kilgarin.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move the E & R amendments to LB 487.

PRESIDENT: Motion to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 487. Any discussion? All those in favor signify by saying aye, opposed nay. The E & R amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment from Senator Schmit. That is referred to on page 1997 of the Journal. You will find it in your bill books. It is Request #2401.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the amendments we have to offer on 487 are basically the bill that we introduced, that was introduced at the request of the Department of Agriculture, and it does these things. It repeals the laws that regulate the following aspects of the food industry: The Nebraska Hotels and Inns Law; the Nebraska Sanitary Food Law; the Nebraska Food Act; the Nebraska Frozen Food Locker Plant Law; the Nebraska Cold Storage Warehouse Law; the Nebraska Soft Drink Bottling Law; and the Nebraska Flour Law. The Department has for a number of years not exercised that kind of supervisory authority. It is an obsolete function of their department, they are now being supervised by the Department of Health in some instances, and in other instances, by local cities, and the Department felt it was unnecessary to have it in the act and, therefore, have asked to have them repealed. I move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. President, I rise in support of the amendment. This is an important amendment and deals with, again, Senator Schmit mentioned 547's provisions. Essentially what we have in 487 with the Schmit amendments is a reorganization bill of the Ag Department for a number of regulatory activities that they undertake. They overlap 487 and 547 in
