SENATOR CLARK: We will now take up LB 354.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 354. (Title read.) The bill was originally read on January 19 of this year. It was referred to the Urban Affairs Committee for public hearing. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by the Urban Affairs Committee, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Landis, do you want to take the committee amendments to LB 354?

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, LB 354 was introduced by Senator Beyer and it was heard before the Urban Affairs Committee. We did make two amendments, as I recall. I will have to open my book here. first thing we did was to make this applicable actually to metropolitan class areas and the term that we used was city of the metropolitan class. We also indicated, and this was consistent with a request by Senator Beyer, that this act would apply in those areas outside the territorial limits of the zoning jurisdiction, or rather not the territorial limits, that is in the bill, but rather the zoning jurisdiction of a city of the metropolitan class. The zoning area includes that several mile radius around a city of the metropolitan class for which they may plan and zone, and with those two amendments, number one, changing the territorial limits to zoning jurisdiction, and number two, applying this to cities of the metropolitan class and their surrounding areas, the bill was advanced. I would move the adoption of the committee amendments.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion before the House is the adoption of the committee amendments to 354. Is there any discussion? If not, all those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote.

CLERK: 2° ayes, 0 mays on the adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Motion carried. Senator Beyer, on the bill.

SENATOR BEYER: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, the reasons behind this bill being introduced is because of some activity that is going on with the Omaha Airport Authority in the surrounding areas, counties outside of their zoning jurisdiction. The Omaha Airport Authority is appointed by the City of Omaha. It is the only appointed Authority in the state. They are not responsible in any which way to the voters and all we are asking in this bill is that anytime they leave their zoning jurisdiction they go through the appropriate board to exercise their right of eminent domain. In this respect then it does give the people a right to vote because they do vote for the county commissioners in this case that would exercise that authority. In the testimony that was there from the opposition, they had to admit that they thought if they really needed that airport that they could sell that county board on the change in using the eminent domain law. Also it gives the county board and the planning department some input into what the effect would be in that area, i.e., the roads, the relocation of roads, the surfacing of the roads, the utilities and stuff that go in there and that is basically the reason that we ask for this change. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Is there any discussion on the advancement of LB 354. Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Yes, if I could ask Senator Beyer a question or two.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Beyer, would you yield?

SENATOR NEWELL: Emil, this proposal now just deals with airport authorities in the metropolitan area?

SENATOR BEYER: Right.

SENATOR NEWELL: And the opposition you say has basically

faded away. Could you expand upon that just for a moment?

SENATOR BEYER: Okay, those that appeared in opposition from the outstate areas under this bill would not be affected. In some questions that were asked of Mr. Grear by the committee members, he did state, and it is on the record, that he thought that if they could prove the need to the county boards that they could get the county boards' approval.

SENATOR NEWELL: All right, Emil, let me ask you this question. Do you think this is...obviously you don't think it is good public policy to do it statewide and you have authorized it for a special situation in the metropolitan area, isn't that correct?

SENATOR BEYER: I think the reason that the amendment was put on to come back to the metropolitan area was the fact that the other boards are elective and they are responsible to the area from which they are elected, Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: All other Airport Authorities are elected?

SENATOR BEYER: Right.

SENATOR NEWELL: All other?

SENATOR BEYER: All others. We researched it. Omaha is the only appointed authority in the state.

SENATOR NEWELL: I didn't realize that. Now that...that makes a difference in what I was going to suggest I guess. I don't think you have got quite the class legislation that I thought you had originally. Senator Beyer, I will not oppose this bill at this time but I am going to reserve the right to maybe talk to you and analyze it and understand it a little better at a later point and maybe talk about some of the specifics, but if your point is correct, then I think just on the basis of class legislation, then there is a unique and different situation and we can maybe justify that.

SENATOR BEYER: That is what we come up with. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the advancement of 354 to E & R Initial. Any discussion? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 mays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is advanced. We now move to LB 55.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 55. (Title read.) The bill was read on January 9. It was referred to Judiciary. It was advanced to General File. There are no amendments on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is a very simple bill. It simply clarifies or amends the current state statute to allow retired judges as well as judges currently sitting on the bench to perform marriages. The proposal, I was not aware that a retired judge could not perform a marriage but that currently is the interpretation that has been given to the section on the authority of a judge to perform a marriage. The reason for the bill really is to allow these individuals to perform those marriages. Some individuals have informed me that they have difficulty finding judges who have the time to perform some of these marriages so maybe we can just look at this as a retirement bill or something, allow a judge to supplement his income or something, but seriously I do think there is no reason that a retired judge should not be able to perform marriages and it is a very simple proposal and I hope you would adopt it and advance it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Yes, Mr. President, I wonder if Senator Cullan would respond to a question please.

SENATOR CULLAN: Yes, Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Senator Cullan, I was just sitting here wondering if perhaps you had some personal interest in this, that you were getting ready to do something the rest of the body didn't know about?

SENATOR CULLAN: Well, Senator Vickers, at this point in time, I certainly don't have any plans, and if I did, my mother would kill me if I didn't get married in the church, so...

SENATOR VICKERS: Thank you, Sam.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Any further discussion on LB 55? The motion is the advancement of the bill to E & R for review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

them. We have a left a period of area, a crescent of land around the city which would not be covered by the bill, which is why we have to make sure that we use the term "zoning jurisdiction". This LB 354 now would cover those areas outside the zoning jurisdiction of a city of metropolitan class. The second change, and this is the only other change in the amendments, because of the way that we had amended the bill, it would cover all airports outside the jurisdiction of a metropolitan class city, meaning that LB 354 would then apply to every airport other than the Omaha airport throughout the state, which is not our intention. Actually we have to make sure that we are talking about the airport owned by or operated by the metropolitan class city but that airport, that reliever airport outside the city's zoning jurisdiction. So it is for the purpose of clarification. It does not alter in any way the intent of the bill that Senator Beyer and myself explained when we talked about LB 354 on General File, and I would urge the adoption of these clarifying amendments offered to us by the bill drafting staff, but of a little more substantial nature than simple and E & R amendments, and that is why this change is required. I would hope the Clerk would read those amendments into the record.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the amendments to 354.

CLERK: He wants me to read them.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay.
