Mr. President, your committee on Public Health and Welfare whose chairman is Senator Cullan reports LB 379 to General

for an accident. They don't want to be in violation of the law. They want to comply. They don't want to have themselves on the hook for some accident and then find out later that they were breaking a speed limit ordinance that they had no knowledge of and the only way for them to know that is to be given adequate notice and that is what LB 437 does. It provides for adequate notice and it gives the railroads a chance to react to the passing of a speed limitation ordinance. I might close by saying this does not prohibit speed limit ordinances in any way. Cities are absolutely free to make speed limit ordinances as they wish but the bill does require the notification of railroads. I would urge the adoption by the body of LB 437.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the advancement of 437. Is there any discussion? If not, all those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is advanced. The next bill is 379, Public Health.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 379 was introduced by the Public Health and Welfare Committee and signed by its members. (Read.) The bill was read or January 19. It was referred to Public Health and Welfare. It was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would just like to inform the Clerk that he butchered the word "nurse anesthetists" and let him go by but I butchered it for about the first twenty times I uttered the word too so I guess we will let him go. The committee amendments do primarily four things. They prohibit independent practice by nurse anesthetists. I believe that was already in the existing bill but we made it absolutely clear that nurse anesthetists cannot have an independent for fee practice. Secondly, we ensure that the schools of professional nursing or in other words, the diploma nursing schools are included in the definition of educational institutions because we did not want to exclude graduates of those diploma schools from engaging in the Nurse Practices Act and meeting requirements under this act. The third requirement requires consent of an anesthesiologist as well as consultation with an anesthesiologist in determining the care given to patients and the fourth is a ...

changes the term of the anesthesiologist on the board from one year to two years. Those are the committee amendments and after they are adopted I will explain the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 379. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed nay, the committee amendments. Have you all voted on the committee amendments to LB 379? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 mays on the adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The committee amendments are adopted. Senator Cullan, on the bill itself.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, LB 379 is the output, the work product of a task force on the expanded role of nursing which I appointed in July of this year. The task force consisted of a representative of the Department of Health, Bureau of Examining Boards. Rex Higley chaired the task force. It also had representatives of the nurses in the state, the other health practitioners in the state to work out the expanded role of nursing legislation which you see before you. The first twentyfive sections of LB 379 are general, consist of general language which sets out the guidelines and the format, if you will, for the expanded role of nursing. Sections 25 through 36 specifically set up the first of what will probably be a series of expanded roles for nursing in the State of Nebraska. The first and the only major change that we are actually making this year in the nursing practice in the State of Nebraska has to deal with the nurse anesthetist. The nurse anesthetists are those people who work with anesthesiclogists in that area of practice. The bill provides that these individuals can work in consultation and with the consent of physicians to carry out their very important function. This bill is one that is absolutely necessary in my opinion and in the opinion of the representatives of the Department of Health because the current Nurse Practices Act does not provide for the independent practice that, or, excuse me, not independent practice, but the various functions that nurse anesthetists are currently carrying out. And so they can, in fact, in my opinion they are practicing outside of the current statutory authority which they have. That could result in some litigation and those people could be in a good deal of trouble if we do not allow this bill to pass. In the long range future the task force, ten member task force, which I have appointed will continue to work on the various nursing specialties and hopefully we will come in with legislation in the next several years to set up further expanded

role of nursing in these various nursing specialties. The nurse specialties I feel are important to the practice of medicine and particularly in a rural state like Nebraska. Nurses do and are receiving additional training beyond the diploma or the four year program that they currently have now to attain these nurse specialties and so I think that in the long run this will be something that will be of importance to the State of Nebraska. This particular bill does very carefully define the role of the nurse anesthetists and includes, sets up their scope of practice and also their relationship with physician and the many requirements that they must meet before being allowed this expanded role. I guess that is all I would have to say at this point in time. I would urge you to adopt LB 379 and ensure that these individuals will be able to practice within the scope of the legislative authority that we grant. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. Chairman and members, I wonder if Senator Cullan would respond to a question, please.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Yes.

SENATOR VICKERS: Senator Cullan, I apologize, I was called out in the rotunda for a little bit but could you tell me if the nurse practioner created by this act, do they have to operate under the auspices of a medical doctor or are they licensed under the auspices as a physicians assistant is?

SENATOR CULLAN: No, they are considerably different. Well, I don't mean to say no in total. What I mean to say is that they are considerably different than physician's assistant. They cannot have an independent for fee service. They have to work with the consent and consultation of a supervising physician but the physician does not of course have to be there at all times. They can set up the protocol for their actual practice but they are not independent practioners. They must work in consultation with the consent of a physician.

SENATOR VICKERS: So there is a procedure whereby they are under the control a licensed physician then?

SENATOR CULLAN: Absolutely but they are given considerably more responsibility commensurate with their training than are the regular registered nurse.

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SENATOR VICKERS: Okay, thank you very much, Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the advancement of LB 379. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote.
