SENATOR CLARK: LB 556.

CLERK: Mr. President, with respect to 556, the bill was introduced by the Speaker at the request of the Governor. (Read.) The bill was read on March 30 of this year. It was referred to the Appropriations Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by the Appropriations Committee, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Warner, on the committee amendments.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, LB 556 is the bill that reflects the increased premiums when the health insurance that is provided for state employees, other than higher education, when those new bids were opened and those dollar amounts will be explained. The committee amendment that is offered merely, well, back up. amendment was offered at the committee hearing requesting that the legislation require that coverage for abortion be made available at the employee's expense and the presentation was based upon the testimony by those who appeared that the prohibition or the requirement for this, for an abortion to be paid for by the individual employee had been suggested when the legislation that prohibited state funds was being considered and enacted and they wanted some assurance that, in fact, that would occur. If you look on page 1877 of the Journal there is a letter which I requested of the Attorney General requiring two things relative to the amendment, first, whether or not whether it would be constitutional and I think you can summarize the response on that, that if the original legislation prohibiting it is constitutional then this is probably constitutional or if LB 125 is not constitutional then neither would this be either. So that seems to be a draw. The other request for an opinion, however, was whether or not we would jeopardize by the adoption of this amendment the coverage that the state might have for its employees under the new bid and it would be my understanding from the Attorney General's letter that if the amendment is adopted, that then it would be expected that the state would find someone who would provide that coverage for those who wanted it and provided they could find some company of some kind that would provide this kind of coverage then the conditions would be met and

in more clarity, with more clarity any detail on the sheet. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Senator Kilgarin, are you ready? There are seven bills that have no amendments pending so we are going to advance the bills. Senator Kilgarin.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 95A to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT: We are ready then for agenda item number four. Final Reading. If the Sergeant at Arms will secure the Chamber, all members will get to your desks. As soon as everyone is at their desks we will commence with Final

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 2214, Legislative Journal.) 39 ayes, 6 nays, 3 excused and not voting, Mr. President, 1 present and not voting.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The till is declared passed on Final Reading. The Clerk will now read LB 506A on Final Reading.

CLERK: (Read LB 506A on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass on Final Reading? Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. 506A. Record the vote.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, there is no need for the A bill on this matter in light of the fact that we passed the risk management bill yesterday. I think we should go ahead and pass the general authorization bill, 472, but in view of the fact we passed the risk management bill and the prospects are good that the Governor will sign that bill, there is no need to pass the A bill, so I would move to suspend the rules at this time and then move, simultaneously move to withdraw the A bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is the suspension of the rules in order to withdraw 472A. Senator DeCamp. Senator Hoagland, Senator DeCamp has a question. Okay, we have a motion. What is your pleasure? Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, a question for information from the Chair. To withdraw a bill, you don't need to suspend the rules. Can't you do that by unanimous consent? It has to lay over if you move, right?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Suspending the rules rather than laying the bill over for a day otherwise 472 can't be considered. Okay, the motion before the House is the suspension of the rules. It requires 30 votes. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

This amendment says that the bill, 243, shall not apply to any project where construction bids were let prior to the effective date of this act which is to be funded in whole or in part from contributions by private individuals or organizations. That is all it says, any projects that have been started that are funded in whole or in part from contributions by private individuals or organizations. Now you may wonder why I am offering another amendment similar to the other one when I was beaten. The reason I am doing this is to see if some of those Senators who promised me to vote for the other one and changed their minds and/or didn't vote would like to change their ways and support the amendment. So there is no need arguing or trying to explain it. It pertains to the same thing but it just says where private or individual funds have been contributed. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I was going to ask if this wasn't a reconsideration but Senator Haberman has just conceded that it is the same thing, it is a reconsideration, so I believe the motion is out of order and should be so ruled. He admitted it was a

PRESIDENT: Roll call. Record the presence, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: A quorum being present, are there any corrections to the Journal.

CLERK: One little one, Mr. President, on page 2378, insert the contents of LR 194.

PRESIDENT: All right, the Journal will stand published as corrected. Any messages, reports or announcements?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a series of items. Mr. President, I have several communications from the Governor addressed to the Clerk. (Read. Re.: LB 320, 472, 111, 118, 213, 216, 512, 523, 551, 553, 554, 556, 556A, LB 138, LB 506. See pages 2383-2384.)

Mr. President, I have a veto message from the Governor. (Read. Re:. LB 506A. See page 2385 of the Journal.)

Mr. President, I have an Attorney General's opinion addressed to Senator Beutler regarding LB 321; an opinion addressed to Senator Hoagland on LB 213. See pages 2385-2387 of the Journal.)

Mr. President, new resolutions, LR 195 by Senator Koch. (Read. See page 2387-2388.) And Mr. President, LR 196 offered by Senators Wesely, Hoagland, Fowler and Beutler. (Read. See pages 2388-2389.) Mr. President, finally LRs 146, 180, 188, 189, 191 and 194 are all ready for your signature.

PRESIDENT: While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and I do sign LR 146, LR 180, LR 188, LR 189, LR 191, LR 194. Anything further, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have nothing further, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We will proceed then with agenda item #4, Final Reading on this final day of the 87th Legislature, first session. The Sergeant at Arms will secure the Chamber.

in favor vote aye. If you want to overrule the Chair vote aye. If you want to uphold the Chair vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 6 ayes, 28 nays to overrule the Chair, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Chair is sustained. Now any further motions?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is offered by Senator Vard Johnson. Senator Johnson would move to override the Governor's line item veto of LB 506A.

PRESIDENT: 506A, Senator Johnson?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes. Mr. Speaker and members of the body, earlier this week we passed LB 506 and LB 506A, the accompanying appropriation bill. As you may recall, this increases the tax on a package of cigarettes by one cent. Under 506 the purpose of the tax increase is to be used for cancer research. The fiscal note indicated that the tax itself would generate revenues of about \$1.7 million. The Governor has decided to line item veto the appropriations bill so that only \$400,000 will go into contract cancer research, with \$800,000 of the penny a pack tax increase just going into the General Fund. Now, when I voted for 506 and 506A, I voted very simply to put a penny a pack tax on cigarettes and to specifically earmark it for cancer research. did not vote for 506 and 506A to increase the tax a penny a pack so that half of the tax could then be used to go to the General Fund with the remaining half of the tax going into Eppley Institute and to a limited amount of cancer research. If the Governor's line item veto of the \$800,000...that's what it amounts to, is overridden, it doesn't mean any increase in taxes. Why? Because we already increased the tax. We increased the tax on a pack of cigarettes by a penny a pack. Very simply, it just means that our allocation of that tax increase to cancer research will continue to be upheld. I think it is important that we fully fund the cancer research operations that we have established by LB 506 and not fund in part with that penny tax increase cancer research and also the General Fund. It is for that reason I would ask that this body do override the veto of the Governor.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner. The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I would rise to oppose

this particular override for two or three reasons, one, the enabling legislation itself did not designate that all of the additional funds were to be used for the research that was authorized but rather that up to that amount could be approved by the Legislature. Secondly, by leaving the \$800,000 available in the General Fund certainly will lessen the pressure to that extent, at least, for any adjustment in tax rates by virtue of other legislation that we have approved to this point. And then finally it would seem to me that there is some logic and merit of having some gradual increase rather than the full million two all at one time in this research area research. I certainly would support that concept, but by the same token I don't think that you can crank up a research program just like that, that it does take some time and some consideration needs to be given to that reality. So all things considered, I would hope that the body would not override the veto on LB 506A.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I think we have exactly the same thing as we had just a minute ago, and that was putting an increase on the taxation of cigarettes, and then rat-holing part of the money for something else. I don't that is a moral thing to do, and I think if we are going to charge cigarettes, then let's put the money where this Legislature intended it to go. Now if you wanted to reduce the amount of money taken in, that would be different. But when we take the entire amount of money and say, no, we are not going to spend it for what the Legislature says, I think that is wrong. If we are going to charge the money, then let's spend it where we ought to. I go for the override.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR Decamp: Mr. President, the hour is late and people are leaving and I know there are a couple more motions and I probably shouldn't say anything. However, I have voted to uphold almost every single veto, because I did not want this Legislature blamed for a tax increase, when, in fact, it is not us but other circumstances that could cause it or will cause it. However, this particular proposal does not take any General Fund money. It takes revenue raised from cigarette tax and I think it should be used for the cancer research purposes for which we directed the money. In this instance the Governor is trying to take this money and feed his General Fund.

LB 506A

And that is as improper as expending additional money. So I am voting to override this veto and would encourage you to do the same.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lowell Johnson.

SENATOR L. JOHNSON: Mr. President, I call for the question. please.

PRESIDENT: Question. Do I see... I see five hands. All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed nay. There was no further discussion. No one wants to discuss it any further, so I think... Senator Johnson, why don't you just close. Forget the vote. He can't be heard....

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I realize the hour is very late and turning mikes sometimes it takes a long time.

PRESIDENT: There you are, Senator Johnson, we hear you well. You are coming through loud and clear.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes, yes. Howard says to make it short. Rex says to make it short. So it's going to be very short. I have had more questions from constituents about where the nickel a pack to the Devaney Sport Complex is going than of virtually any other question I have had. Of course, I never know the answer to that, incidentally. But they say, that's all right. But when we increase the cigarette tax by a penny a pack for cancer research. I just think that we are obligated to make certain the money goes to cancer research, and not that half the money goes to the General Fund and the other half goes to Eppley Institute and a little bit for cancer research. So I, very simply, want us to put the money where we initially said we were going to put the money into cancer research, and I would ask that we do take this action to overrule the Governor's line item veto of \$800,000 from the cancer research appropriation. I will also ask, inasmuch as the members are leaving in bus loads and car loads and anything else, that we have a Call of the House before we begin. Maybe a roll call as well. I will check it out.

PRESIDENT: Ready? All right, now he wants to...yes, let's....actually, as I say, we are under Call. Let's get everybody in here to register their presence. We are Just kind of holding them under Call, but we do want everyone to register your presence. Would everyone please register your presence to make sure the House is still under Call. Would everyone please register your presence? The sooner we do this...we have about one more motion.

We have one more override and then some resolutions, and then we are ready to close up the festivities for this session for the sine die. Would Senator Cope and Senator Kilgarin show us your green lights? Senator Wagner, Senator Landis, Senator Haberman. Thank you. Senator Pirsch, Senator Chambers...no, he...Senator Chambers is.... Senator Clark was excused. Senator Maresh. Senator Landis, Senator Hoagland. Senator Maresh, Senator Landis is here. Senator Maresh is here. Okay, we are just looking for Hoagland it looks like. I see him, so we are all ready. Okay, ready, Senator Johnson. Do you want a roll call now? Roll call vote on, shall LB 506A become law notwithstanding the action of the Governor? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay, and here comes ... board vote. Okay, board vote. All those in favor vote, opposed nay. Have you all voted? I see the...okay, record the vote. Thank you, Senator Johnson.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 22 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I just want to rise once again this afternoon for this session and ask this body to override the Governor's veto of approximately \$750,000 of funds for Mental Retardation. This afternoon earlier I asked you to indulge me and I will not take a great deal of time at the present time. I know that many of you share my concern relative to providing funds for Mental Retardation. I've said this also on the floor that those of us who have children who are not in any way handicapped recognize the burden of those parents who have handicapped members of the family. I recognize that all of us are concerned about the budget. It has been expressed here several times this afternoon. I suggest to you and I am not going to.... I hope there will be others who will address the issue also. I know that some of the people who had expressed interest in this matter have left, but I think

Okay, Mr. Clerk, we are ready then for the....Senator Beutler, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, I was just wondering if there would be time to discuss three or four rule changes.

PRESIDENT: Would somebody like to borrow this? (Microphone not on)....to say that about the 28th legislative District, Senator Beutler.

CLERK: Mr. President...

PRESIDENT: Go ahead, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a series of unanimous consent requests to add names to resolutions. The first is by Senator Goodrich to add his name to LR 171.

PRESIDENT: All right. No objection, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, then I have one from Senators Labedz and Marsh, Pirsch, Kilgarin, DeCamp, to add their name to 106.

PRESIDENT: All right, are there any objections? If not, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have one from Senators Goll and Wesely to add their names to LB 119.

PRESIDENT: 119. Any objections? If not, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, a unanimous consent request from Senator Lowell Johnson to add his name to 126, 137....

PRESIDENT: If not any objection, so ordered.

CLERK: Just a second. Mr. President, finally I have letters that will be forwarded on to the Secretary of State regarding the Legislature's failure to override vetoes of LB 322 and 506A. (See page 2432 of the Legislative Journal.)
