Because we have an alternate procedure that is hopefully going to be more effective, we would rather utilize that other procedure, the claims procedure, than utilize the bill at this time, and we can process that near the end of the session.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to withdraw.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on LR 17? Seeing none, then, Senator Hoagland, I guess that is your opening and closing. So the question is the adoption of LR 17. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of LR 17.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries and LR 17 is adopted. The next legislative resolution, #18.
