SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I move the previous question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: There are no lights on, Senator Koch, so with your permission we will call on Senator Burrows to close.

SENATOR BURROWS: I move the advancement of the bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of advancing LB 244 to E & R for review vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is the advancement of LB 244 to E & R for review. Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 7 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

Your committee on Revenue whose chairman is Senator Carsten to whom is referred LB 167 instructs me to report the same back to the Legislature with the recommendation if be advanced to General File with amendments, (signed) Senator Carsten.

Mr. President, I have two Attorney General's opinions, the first to Senator Warner regarding LB 999 from the 1980 legislative session and one to Senator Vard Johnson regarding the constitutionality of proposed legislation concerning real estate practices. (See pages 392-397 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, two new bills, LB 542 by Senator Schmit at the request of the Governor. (Read. See page 397.) LB 165A by Senator Lamb. (Read.)

Banking, Commerce and Insurance Committee reports LB 257 to General File with amendments. (Signed) Senator DeCamp.

Ag and Environment reports LB 542 to General File; LB 11 to General File with amendments; LB 396 General File with amendments; LB 452 and 468 indefinitely postponed. All those signed by Senator Schmit as Chair.

Business and Labor reports LB 495 as indefinitely postponed. (Signed) Senator Maresh.

Banking, Commerce and Insurance reports LB 543 to General File with amendments. (Signed) Senator DeCamp.

Senator Lamb would like to print amendments to LB 179 in the Journal.

Senator Nichol's Judiciary Committee reports LB 346 to General File with amendments.

I have a set of Rules reports from Senator Wesely's Rules Committee. That will be inserted in the Journal. (See pages 977-979.)

Mr. President, I have a communication from Secretary of State and accompanying certificate regarding the Legislature's override of LB 206 and 206A. Both will be inserted in the Journal. (See pages 980-982.)

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Schmit, do you want to advance 245?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I move that LB 245 be advanced.

SENATOR CLARK: We have two more amendments up here.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first amendment I have is offered by Senators Dworak, Goll, Vickers, Sieck, Warner, Lowell Johnson, Carsten, Clark, Haberman and Koch and it is found on page 868 of the Journal. in favor of this change. The State Fire Marshal doesn't care a whole lot about it and this probably is sort of a silly arrangement at this time but I am looking down the road to have a little foresight as to what we really need to do at this area and I think what you will see is a major change in the works that should be incorporated at some time in the near future that will just be harder to incorporate with this change that is proposed in 490.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Goodrich, do you wish to close?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Just to make two, a couple of points here, one of which, to reiterate there is no fiscal impact whatsoever, inspite of what Senator Wesely said. We are not creating a new agency as Senator Wesely said. The Governor has no objection to the bill. I personally talked to him. The State Fire Marshal and the Director of the department itself are both sitting over here side-by-side, if you want to ask either one of them any questions. The objective of this bill is to smooth out the administrative function that the State Electrical Board and the Fire Marshal handles and there is no validity to Senator Wesely's objections so I say nothing further than just to advance the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the advancement of 490. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 2 mays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is declared advanced. LB 444.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a request from Senator Kahle, who is Chairman of the committee, to pass over LB 444.

SENATOR CLARK: LB 444 is passed over. LB 542.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 542 was a bill offered by Senator Schmit. (Title read.) The bill was read on February 2 of last year. It was referred to the Agriculture and Environment Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. I have no amendments to the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Schmit on the bill.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, in view of the ringing endorsement we just had from some other Senators relative to consolidation of government, we now have an opportunity here to abolish an agency of government, and as Senator Wesely pointed out, we need to do that to bring about some efficiency from time to time. Years ago I served as a member of the Weather Modification Board. We never met. I never met the other members of the Board and nothing ever happened. I served out the term that I was supposed to have served for and I didn't know what I was doing and I would say that that was a pretty good prelude to being in the Legislature sometime. But I want to say also that there is no opposition to this bill. The bill, as I said, wipes out the Weather Modification Board and it was one of those ideas that someone established a few years ago and fits the usual criteria that I have talked about many times, an agency that helps no one, hurts no one, costs nothing and does nothing, serves its time and now ought to die a dignified death. I move the bill be advanced.

SENATOR CLARK: Is there any debate? Seeing none, that is your opening and closing on it, the advancement of LB 542. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 mays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is declared advanced. LB 424.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a request from Senator Rumery to pass over LB 424. Is that right, Senator?

SENATOR CLARK: LB 424 is passed over. LB 230, that is a pass over also.
