SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker....

SPEAKER MARVEL: 198.

SENATOR KAHLE: Senator Warner had Indicated the other day that he had an amendment for 198, and his office called this morning, he is not here, of course, today, and he wants to rewrite that amendment, so I ask that we pass over 198 for the present time.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Any objections? This goes to the passover file. Ckay, next, LB 274.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 606 (read title). The bill was read on January 6 of this year, referred to the Public Health and Welfare Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. I have no amendments on the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, LB 606 is quite a simple bill. Several years ago we passed legislation to allow the sale of funeral arrangements and services prior to the death of a person and those monies derived thereby were to be put into a trust fund and it was quite uncertain if or not these trust funds could be audited by the Department of Health so it is simply saying all this bill does is it provides for an audit to clear up the question whether or not they have the right to audit these trust funds, and they should be. If the word in there is "may", that they "shall", it does give the right if there is a challenge of any kind or there is a question, it will allow the Department of Health to audit these trust funds. I move that the bill be advanced to E & R Initial.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Rumery.

SENATOR RUMERY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Kremer a question or two.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Kremer, will you yield?

SENATOR KREMER: Yes, sir.

SENATOR RUMERY: Why is it that you have suggested that the Department of Health do this auditing? I would assume the State Auditor ought to do that, is this correct?

SENATOR KREMER: The bill was brought to me by the funeral directors, and since the jurisdiction of these trust funds is under the Department of Health, it is thought it is just feasible that they be given that authority rather than the Auditor.

SENATOR RUMERY: Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Is there any further debate? Any further closing?

SENATOR KREMER: No closing.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the advancement of 606. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting yes.

SENATOR CLARK: Pecord the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is advanced. The next bill is 579.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 579 (read title). The bill was read on January 6 of this year, referred to Public Works Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President. There are committee amendments by the Public Works Committee.
