SENATOR LAMB: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I move advancement of the bill and there is an item in there, I guess, what? \$15,000 is one of the items for Department of Roads. Possibly if we'd have had a little more advertising on some of these bids we'd a had 15 million or 150 million more in the coffers now.

SENATOR LAMB: The motion is to advance the bill. Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Senator DeCamp, would you redirect that fiscal note?

SENATOR LAMB: Senator DeCamp, would you respond.

SENATOR KOCH: I have been living in (inaudible), it's catching almost. I want to know what's going on here.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Its there for anybody to read, whatever the note is. There is no use of me....(inaudible.)

SENATOR KOCH: The Department of Roads is the only one affected?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Pardon?

SENATOR KOCH: The Department of Roads is the only one affected in the state?

SENATOR DeCAMP: No, the entire state is affected. That is why I mentioned one item in there if you'd look at.

SENATOR KOCH: I'm talking about state government.

SENATOR Decamp: All of state government is affected, Senator Koch, even the schools.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senators DeCamp and Schmit would move to place LB 731 on General File pursuant to Rule 3, Section 18(b).

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, about 27 or 28 Senators indicated they would support bringing this proposal to the floor. However, I note on the calendar it is the 13th day and I know the Governor is very concerned about items that take up time, and so rather than add one major item that can reasonably be dealt with in another year, I think in light of the circumstances I am going to not ask to bring the bill to the floor and just pass over this motion. I think that is...in fairness to the body, it would be one more pressure issue.

PRESIDENT: You are asking unanimous consent....

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes.

PRESIDENT: ....to pass over at this time? Is there any objection?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President and members of the body, I object and may I ask....

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman, you object? All right, then you want to move...

SENATOR HABERMAN: I would like to ask a question of Senator DeCamp if I could.

PRESIDENT: All right. Otherwise....well, in order to get something before us then, Senator DeCamp, do you want to move to pass over so we have something to discuss?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well, no. No there isn't time this year to deal with something this heavy.

PRESIDENT: Okay. Senator Beutler, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Perhaps in order to avoid a long debate on this, Mr. Speaker, we should just ask Senator Lamb if he wishes to withdraw this from the agenda. As acting Speaker that is his prerogative and that might be the simplest way to solve this.

PRESIDENT: Well, the acting Speaker is in charge of the agenda. Senator Lamb, do you wish to....?

SENATOR LAMB: Reluctantly we will withdraw this from the agenda.

PRESIDENT: Would you indicate whether there is going to be any time that it would come back on the agenda or what you want to do with it on the agenda, Senator Lamb?

SENATOR LAMB: No.

PRESIDENT: There is no....you just...you want to take it off?

SENATOR LAMB: Right.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Beings that it is just going to be taken off and there is no guarantee that it is not going to be brought up....

PRESIDENT: That's what he....

SENATOR HABERMAN: .... I would object.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lamb, is that what I heard you say?

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, and members of the Legislature, we are proposing to take it off the agenda and not put it back on this session.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I remove my objection.

PRESIDENT: All right, thank you. Thank you, everybody. We will now proceed with General File, agenda item #7, LB 36A.

CLERK: Mr. Fresident, 36A was introduced by Senator Schmit. I have a motion from Senator Schmit to indefinitely postpone the bill.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, LB 36 received only 24 votes to advance last week on Select File. As Senator DeCamp has pointed out, the time is late. There is no point in attempting to bring that bill to life again and I think that we better spend our time on other issues. I would ask that you arcommodate me and I am sure you will do so enthusiastically and kill LB 36A. Thank you very much.
