

four days unlimited bill requests would be accepted by the bill drafter and then between the fourth and the eighth day one more request per senator and per committee. This is a little change from before because since we have unlimited bill introductions now we were afraid we might get into the situation where the bill drafter just would not be able to handle the volume of requests. So I call that to your attention and hope that you can get your requests in today and if you have an emergency then you have the prerogative of another request between the fourth legislative day and the eighth legislative day. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Any questions of Senator Lamb? Or any other comments? Okay, at this time the Chair takes pleasure to introduce some visitors from Senator Marsh's district up here in the north balcony, some 25 seniors from Southeast High School, their instructor Mr. Douglas. They're up in the north balcony. Would you welcome the Southeast seniors up here in the balcony. Welcome to your Legislature. All right we'll... The Clerk will just read some bills in until...it's getting close enough to the time of the Governor's arrival. We will proceed with the reading of some bills, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read by title for the first time, LBs 746-748 as found on page 190 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Does anyone else have any bills to introduce before the Governor's arrival? We just as well get in the bills if you have any there. The Clerk would like to read them in.

CLERK: (Read by title for the first time, LBs 749-752 as found on page 191 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Speaker Marvel for purpose of a motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion that I make is that a committee of five be appointed to escort the Governor to the Chamber to deliver the State of the State and the Budget Message. I so move.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to appoint a committee of five to escort the Governor. All those in favor signify by saying aye, opposed nay. The committee the Chair will appoint will be as follows to escort the Governor: Senator Carsten, Senator Newell, Senator Barrett, Senator Lowell Johnson and Senator Remmers. That committee of five will proceed to escort the Governor into the Chamber for the delivery of his State of the State address and the Legislature will be at ease until the Governor arrives.

What is being done here today and what are the principles? I thought the rule of the Legislature declares that if there has not been sufficient debate on an issue, the question being called would be out of order but if the rules are to be thrown by the boards, at least I've put my comment into the record. I think it is a shabby move. I think it is indicative of a lot of things that happened when being done by people who call themselves Christians. They talk all of the highfalutin, high sounding things until they get tired and it is no longer in their interests to talk those kinds of things. So I am expressing as strongly as I can without raising my voice, an objection to this tactic if the Chair does not rule the motion out of order.

SENATOR NICHOL: Because the debate has been orderly, you've been extremely good today, I think what we will do, we will adjourn and carry this on after lunch and, Senator Hoagland, did you rise for a purpose?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I was going to suggest, Mr. President, that if the body wants to vote on advancement before lunch, I will, if that is the general sentiment and I think maybe it is, I will withdraw the motion to kill and we can take a vote on whether to advance the bill before lunch.

SENATOR NICHOL: Is there an objection to Senator Hoagland withdrawing his amendment? Senator Chambers. Okay, there is an objection. We are in the middle of a motion to cease debate so, Mr. Clerk, if you would record then we will go on from there.

CLERK: 15 ayes and 7 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR NICHOL: The Clerk has something to read into the record and then Senator Wesely will adjourn us until after lunch, recess.

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Business and Labor whose chairman is Senator Barrett reports LB 749 advanced to General File with committee amendments attached and LB 637 General File with committee amendments attached, signed by Senator Barrett.
