SPEAKER MARVEL: Item #5 is the next order of business.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Barrett as Chairman of the Business and Labor Committee moves for the introduction of a new bill, Request #1659.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Barrett.

SENATOR BARRETT: Mr. Speaker and members, with reference to request #1659 and #1660 I would move for the suspension fRule 5, Section 5, paragraph (a) in order to introduce the state claims bills. As you know this is an annual exercise which we must go through each year because the claims bills are not ready prior to the deadline date for the introduction of new bills in the body. We have two bills again this year, one for claims which have been approved by the Claims Board, one which is disallowing claims. The bills will be heard before the Business and Labor Committee. I would, therefore, renew my request that we suspend the rules in order that these two bills might be heard. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the introduction of a new bill, Req. #1659 and the motion is to suspend the rules so that 1659 can be introduced. All those in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed vote no. It takes 30 votes. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to introduce the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is in-troduced.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Barrett would move for the introduction of a new bill by the Business and Labor Committee, Req. #1660.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Barrett.

SENATOR BARRETT: Mr. Speaker, Req. #1660 is to allow miscellaneous claims made against the state which have been denied by the State Claims Board and referred to the Legislature.

SPEAKER MARVEL: You've heard the motion. Is there any further discussion? Senator Burrows, your light was on. Okay, the motion is to introduce the new bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record.

Mr. President, your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports we have carefully examined and reviewed LB 652 and recommend that same be placed on Select File with E & R amendments attached; 522 E & R amendments attached; 568 E & R amendments attached. Those are signed by Senator Kilgarin as Chair. (See pages 1150-1151 of the Legislative Journal.)

Your committee on Public Works whose chairman is Senator Kremer reports LB 785 advance to General File and LR 212 advance to General File. Those are signed by Senator Kremer. (See page 1152 of the Legislative Journal.)
