CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Mr. President, I have an explanation of vote from Senator Warner.

Mr. President, you committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports they have carefully examined and engrossed LB 252 and recommend the same be....and find the same correctly engrossed. LB 451 correctly engrossed, 499, 529 and 529A all correctly engrossed. Those are signed by Senator Kilgarrin as Chair.

Mr. President, new resolution LR 181 offered by Senators Clark and Beutler. Read LR 181. That, Mr. President, will be laid over pursuant to our rules.

SENATOR CLARK PRESIDING

SENATOR CLARK: LB 412.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 412 introduced by Senator Newell. Read title of LB 412. The bill was first read on January 20th it was referred to the Revenue Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments attached, Mr. President. The membership considered the bill April 6th of this year. At that time the committee amendments were adopted. There was a motion by Senator Warner that was adopted at that time. I now have, Mr. President, an amendment by Senator DeCamp to the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator DeCamp. Senator Newell, would you like to briefly explain the bill again. A short explanation and then we will let Senator DeCamp take over.

SENATOR NEWELL: Yes. Mr. President, members of the body this is the green belt law, basically there has been agreement on the language of the bill in terms of clarifying just when and how it is to be used. The only issue outstanding at this time is what the interest rate should be in terms of those taxes not paid. Basically the present law says the interest rates will be 6%. The original proposal was to raise that to 14% to be in line with what we have done on all other interest rates, delinquent interest rates. The amendment that I have, I know that Senator DeCamp has an amendment, the amendment that I will be offering I will explain later.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator DeCamp. Oh, are you going to withdraw them?

CLERK: I believe that he is, yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SPEAKER MARVEL: Prayer by Reverend Daniel Ondov, pastor of the Trinity Lutheran Church, 12th and G, Lincoln, Nebraska.

REVEREND ONDOV: Prayer offered.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Record your presence, please. Have you all registered your presence? We have got a big day today and if we lose too much time we are going to have to work tonight so you can keep that in mind as we go through the day if you will. Appoint yourselves as a committee of one to see that we pretty well clear Select File off the sheet. That is the only way we are going to survive. Record the vote.

CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you have some items for #3?

CLERK: Mr. President, simply, we have one correction for the Journal. On page 2118, line 44, strike...strike through the word "Burt" instead of underscoring Burt.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Item #4, resolutions. We will start with 181, okay.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 181 offered by Senators Clark and Beutler, found on page 2003. (Read.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: Mr. President and members, this resolution came to me from the five state conference. It would like to have the Interior Secretary Watts at their conference. It is going to be the latter part of September. He has the answers to a lot of questions that the five states have on oil, on the exploration of oil, on the exploration of coal and the mining of coal and they would like to have him and they thought that if every state would put a resolution in and give it to him he might come out for that conference. He is from Colorado originally and certainly he has our interests at heart and I would hope you would pass this resolution unanimously so we can send it to him. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Any other discussion? Okay, the motion is the adoption of LR 181 as explained by Senator Clark. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We have five resolutions and we have just completed one. We are in the process of completing one. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is LR 182. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adopt the resolution.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The resolution is adopted. Next, LR 185.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 185 offered by the Speaker. (Read.) Mr. President, the Resolution is found on page 2073 of the Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Those of you who were freshmen this last term will recall that we had a member of the Eagleton Foundation at the Center and that was Al Rosenthal and the Eagleton Foundation has been active in the political arena for a number of years and this simply calls it to the attention of people in this state and surrounding states. So the motion is the adoption of the resolution, 185. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of LR 185.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The resolution is adopted. Now we move to LR 186.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first item I have with respect to LR 186 is a unanimous consent request to add names of Senators Vickers and Wagner as coinroducers.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Hearing no objection, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 186 offered by Senators Haberman, Kremer and Rumery. (Read.) Mr. President, the resolution is found on page 2092 of the Journal.
