LB 488A, 573, 668, 714A, 751, 817, 835A, 869, 875, 953A

SENATOR CLARK: The motion is to advance LB 488A. All those in favor say aye...all right, a machine vote has been requested...vote aye, those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting yes.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Cullan requests a record vote. (Read record vote as found on page 1633 of the Legislative Journal.) 18 ayes, 24 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill does not advance. We will now take up LB 417A, LB 714A. The Clerk wants to read some things in.

CLERK: Mr. President, a communication from the Governor addressed to the Clerk. (Read re: LB 573, 668, 751, 817, 869 and 875.)

Your committee on Enrollment and Review reports LB 835A advanced to Select File and LB 953A advanced to Select File.

Mr. President, new resolutions, LR 304 offered by Senator Wagner. It commends the Ord Quiz on the occasion of its centennial for its past 100 years of service in the business of Journalism and that will be laid over. LR 305 by Senator Fowler calls for an interim study regarding adequacy and constitutional provisions of the current Dental Practice Act. LR 306 by Senator Fowler calls for a study of LB 567 as passed by the 1975 Legislature relating to parole. LR 307 by Senator Fowler calls for a study concerning the issue of nuclear waste transportation. LR 308 by Senator Fowler calls for a study and the procedure for estimating general fund revenues for the state. LR 309 offered by Senator Fowler. (Read. See pages 1634-1638 of the Legislative Journal.)

Finally, Mr. President, Senator Wagner asks unanimous consent to withdraw LR 262 which is a study resolution. (See page 1638 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CLARK: No objections, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, J have nothing on LB 714A.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Kilgarin.

SENATOR KILGARIN: I move we advance LB 714A.

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.

SENATOR CLARK: Resolution is adopted. LR 298.

CLERK: 298, Mr. President, is offered by Senator Kremer. It is on page 1624.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman and members, this resolution I have introduced for the purpose of encouraging Senator Marvel to read the resolution and I think it is fitting and proper that we do so. He is not back with us this session so I think this resolution will be an encouragement to him. I invite anyone who wishes to sign the resolution with me to do so, unless there are objections, I would ask for unanimous consent for all of us to sign our name to the resolution.

SENATOR CLARK: I think that we will let anyone sign the resolution that would like to.

SENATOR KREMER: That might be best. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: I would ask unanimous consent to put mine on there and I'll accept no votes. We will put everyone on if there is no objection. Fine. All right, that is the way it will stand. The question before the House is the adoption of the resolution. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting yes.

SENATOR CLARK: I'll give everyone a chance to. . . Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The resolution is adopted. LR 304.

CLERK: Mr. President, 304 is offered by Senator Wagner, it is on page 1634.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Wagner.

SENATOR WAGNER: Mr. Speaker and members, LR 304 pretty well speaks for itself but it relates to a newspaper in the area, it is unique in the respect that it is the only

name of a newspaper in the United States with the name of "Quiz". The Quiz was started over a hundred years ago and it is their centennial year. It was started by Mr. Haskell and he started it with a twenty dollar gold piece. Like I say it is a unique paper, three generations have owned that paper and I urge your adoption of the resolution.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the Resolution. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? We only have five more after this one, if we can get a vote on this one. Probably have to have a Call of the House to get that many people here, I don't know. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the resolution.

SENATOR CLARK: The resolution is adopted. LR 313, Senator Marsh, is she excused?

CLERK: No.

SENATOR CLARK: LR 313.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first item I have on 313 is a request from Senator Vickers to add his name as co-introducer.

SENATOR CLARK: No objection, so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, 313 offered by Senators Marsh and Vickers, it is on page 1644 of the Journal.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Marsh. Senator Vickers, do you want to take the resolution?

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, the resolution that Senator Marsh and I have before you is one to honor the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Lady Track Team for being the national champions in indoor track this year. I think that is quite an honor when you consider the ladies program at the University of Nebraska has not been in existence that many years, but yet they have got some world class sprinters. They have got a young lady that holds the world's record and continually keeps breaking her own record in the 300 meter dash and they have obviously performed very well to take the national championships and this resolution is designed to honor them for those efforts. I urge the body's adoption of it.
