SENATOR CLARK PRESIDING

SENATOR CLARK: We will check in for a sine die party. John, did you want to make the motion to sine die? It only takes a majority of those present and voting. The Clerk will record the attendance.

CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: We were supposed to have one more bill on Final Reading this morning but the people do not want to take that bill up so we are going to pass over it and we will go to #5 on the agenda which are motions. The Clerk wants to read something in first.

CLERK: Mr. President, two new study resolutions. I am sorry, one regular resolution and a study resolution. LR 331 offered by Senator Beyer. (Read. See page 1693, Legislative Journal.) That will be laid over. Mr. President, LR 332 by Senator Sieck. It calls for a study of the appropriations questions that have arisen regarding the funding of regional community based mental retardation services and of private and nonregional community services offered. That will be referred to the Exec Board.

SENATOR CLARK: I would like to introduce guests of Senator Koch, Ken and Kris Stenberg. Ken is the father and Kris is the daughter. They are from Ralston. They are under the North balcony. Will you stand up and be recognized please? Welcome to the Legislature. All right, we are ready for motions. On LB 761 a motion to return to Select File for specific amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hoagland had a motion printed on page 1616 of the Journal. I understand he wishes to withdraw that one and in lieu offer a corrected copy, is that right, Senator?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Yes, that is right.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I would ask for unanimous consent, Mr. President, to substitute a corrected copy for the motion that is up there right now.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the Resolution. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting yes.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, on adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The resolution is adopted. LR 316.

CLERK: Mr. President, 316 offered by Senators Kilgarin, Wesely, Koch, is found on page 1669.

SENATOR CLARK: Who wants to. . . Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Chairman, this resolution is a resolution that honors the University of Nebraska gymnastic team. I don't think I need to spend any deal of time talking to you about it. Coach Allen and his group of athletes have brought considerable fame to us not only to this nation but internationally. I think it is appropriate that this legislature honors the accomplishments of that team, not only Big 8 champs for several years but three straight years as National Champions and it looks as though they could do it the fourth time. So I move for the adoption of the resolution.
