SENATOR CLARK: Senator Newell. That won't be necessary. There is no more lights on. The question before the House is to readvance the bill. All those in favor say aye, opposed. The bill is readvanced. The next amendment please.

CLERK: Mr. President, if I may, right before that I have a series of study resolutions. LR 340 by Senators DeCamp and Kilgarin calls for a study on whether banks in the state should be allowed to be engaged in real estate brokerage, real property management, and real estate development. LR 341 by the Judiciary Committee calls for a study to consider the development of standards for the use of cameras in Nebraska courtrooms. LR 342 by the Judiciary calls for a study of the Nebraska Crimes Reparations Board. LR 343 offered by Judiciary calls for a study of the use of wiretapping. LR 344 offered by the Judiciary Committee calls for a study of utilization of the legislative public hearing process to evaluate various proposals for changes in criminal procedure. LR 345 offered by the Judiciary Committee. It calls for a study in regards to problem areas in our law governing civil procedure. LR 346 by Senator Wesely calls for a study of the public involvement in the Legislative process relating to Legislative rules and procedures used by the Legislature. LR 347 by Senator Wesely would examine the need for various tax exemptions and tax expenditures. LR 348 by Senator Wesely would call for a study of the level of unfunded liabilities for various pension plans for municipal employees in Nebraska's cities.

Mr. President, the next amendment I have to 761 is offered by Senator Johnson. Senator Johnson would move to return the bill for a specific amendment. The purpose of the amendment is to provide funding for the development and implementation of the computerized County Information Support System.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Johnson.

SENATOR VARD JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I would move to return LB 761 to Select File for a specific amendment. The amendment is to add approximately \$488,000 to this appropriations bill to enable the Department of Public Welfare to continue with its computerized information support services program. Now I know that each of you are shaking your heads negatively because we don't have the money but I can guarantee you that this is one of those times when penny-wise pound-foolish really obtains. The computerized information support system is an on-line computer system which the Department of Public Welfare has
