CLERK: Senator Clark voting yes.

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the resolution.

SENATOR CLARK: The resolution is adopted. 287.

CLERK: Mr. President, 287 is offered by Senator Nichol it is on page 1559. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, a few days ago we honored Mrs. James Moranville, whose first name is Chris, as the young mother of the year. She is the mother of three daughters, member of Beta Sigma Phi, program chairperson for the Longfellow Elementary School PTA, Member of the Western Nebraska General Hospital Auxiliary, Sunday School teacher and a member of the First United Methodist Church in Scottsbluff. I hope that you will all give her a green light on this resolution and hopefully the adoption of it. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Question before the House is the adoption of the resolution. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting yes.

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, on adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The resolution is adopted. LR 292.

CLERK: Mr. President, if I may right before that, the Enrolling Clerk has presented to the Governor the bills that were read on Final Reading this morning.

Mr. President, Senator Warner gives notice of a meeting of the Appropriations Committee for Thursday, 4:15 ... 4:00 p.m. in Room 1003 and Friday if necessary at 8:30 n.m., \sim Mr. President.

Mr. President, I have a new resolution by Senator Kilgarin. Read LR 385. That will be laid over Mr. President. Mr.

President, I have a communication from the Governor addressed to the Clerk. Engrossed LB 753 and 757 were signed by me on April 14th and delivered to the Secretary of State. Singerely, Charles Thone, Governor. (See page 1941 of the Legislative Journal).

Mr. President, LR 292 is offered by Senator Barrett, Remmers and Lamb. It is on page 1585 of the Journal.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Barrett.

SENATOR BARRETT: Mr. President and members, many of you have probably noticed the series of six prints which are on permanent display in the Moses P. Kinkaid hearing room number 1520 Senator Koch. These, this seris of print is entitled "From Sea to Shining Sea", and is made possible by Mr. John Falter the artist the former native of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, born in Plattsmouth in about 1910 now living with his wife in Philadelphia and still actively painting. The gift, this outstanding gift was made possible on the occasion of the 50th Anniversary of the State Capitol Building by Mr. Cliff Hillegass of Lincoln, Nebraska. So this resolution simply is an official thank you to Mr. Hillegass for his most generous contribution to the State of Nebraska, also recognizes Mr. Falter the artist for his talent and the beautiful prints which are now permanently a part of the state property. So I'm pleased to join with Senators Remmers and Lamb in the introduction of this resolution. I move the adoption.

SENATOR CLARK: Question before the House is the adoption of the resolution. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Voting aye. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 mays on adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The resolution is adopted. LR 293, by Senator Higgins, is she here?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Labedz and Higgins move to offer 293, it is on page 1610.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Labedz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. President. LR 293 is a very brief resolution to commend and congratulate the Forensics Team of the University of Nebraska at Lincoln for their outstanding season, especially the teams first place finish last month in the Delta Sigma Rho-Tau Kappa Alpha

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Kremer, do you have any close?

SENATOR KREMER: I've closed twice already. That is all, thank you.

SENATOR LAMB: Motion is to adopt the report. Those in support vote yes, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 40 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the Public Works report.

SENATOR LAMB: The report is adopted. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a series of resolutions. I have a motion regarding the following resolutions, 382, 383, 385, 387, 388 and 389. The motion that pertains to those resolutions is to suspend Rule 4, Section 5 and 6 and adopt those six resolutions.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, these are all nonimportant resolutions, I just ask that. . . You can go ahead and read what they are if you want to. They declare a couple of weeks and they praise the gymnastic team, that garbage that we usually pass. There are two resolutions that we withdrew didn't we, that some questions were raised on two of them? Okay, so these shouldn't be. . .

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Kilgarin.

SENATOR KILGARIN: There was one resolution in there, Mr. President and members, that is not unimportant. It is honoring Jim Hartung and Steve Elliott, Jim Hartung being from South High, for their good work. They are seniors and they are graduating from the University and I would urge you to vote for Senator Wesely's motion and the resolutions.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, to get the thing moving can we just have whose names they are congratulating if they are all congratulating somebody? If that is all that they are we ought to at least know their names. Would that be too much to ask?

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. Clerk, can you just briefly summarize the resolutions?

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 382 basically says that the Plattsmouth Highschool band is dedicated and is excellent in its field. LR 383 by Senator Wesely would declare the week of April 18 through 25 as nuclear awareness week in the State of Nebraska. Mr. President, 385 is offered by Senator's Newell and Kilgarin and it proclaims Mr. Jim Hartung and Mr. Steve Elliott as wonderful people, it also says the University of Nebraska gymnastic team is the best ever. Mr. President, LR 387 is a resolution honoring the members of this year's legislature who are retiring from service. Senator Koch, I don't believe you are retiring.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Koch, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR KOCH: For a point of personal privilege.

SENATOR LAMB: Please state your point.

SENATOR KOCH: In 1975 thirteen of us came into this body as freshmen and I want to acknowledge their service and commend them. It has been a pleasure to serve with them. I'm talking about Senator Stoney, Senator Dworak, Senator Cope, Senator Rummery and Senator Burrows. And, I'll be the last of the Moherans contrary to what your applause was about, hopefully I will return and serve four more years. By the same token I want to honor Senator Kremer, it has been a pleasure serving with him on the Public Works Committee and I valued his judgement on water a great deal. Wish them all well.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 388 offered by Senator's Cullan and Newell offers condolence's to the family of Benjamin Wall who passed away this last week. Mr. President, 389 offered by Senator Wesely would declare the week of September 6th through the 10th as pedestrian awareness week.

SENATOR LAMB: The motion is to suspend the rules so that all these resolutions can be considered at one time. Those in support vote yes, those opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 1 may on suspension of the rules on adoption of those three resolutions, Mr. President.

SENATOR LAMB: The rules were suspended and the motion is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 381 is offered by the Business and Labor Committee. (Read LR 381).
